ASSISTANT MEDICAL INSPECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Saturday, the 5th January proximo, from persons who are qualified and are desirous of applying for appointment to the position of Assistant Medical Inspector, Department of Public Health.

Salary—£450 a year.

The officer appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters and such others as the Board of Public Health or the Minister of Health may from time to time direct:—

- (1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
- (2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the community.
- (3) Perusing, minutng, and advising on the reports of local officers of health and inspectors, and on the reports of the Board's sanitary inspectors.
- (4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed or when special action by the Board is required.
- (5) Investigating the causes of and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.
- (6) Making periodical inspections of and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony.
- (7) Advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any disease introduced into Victoria.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water, and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of any Act relating thereto and administered by the Board.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for noxious trade establishments.

The person appointed must be prepared at any moment to clear incoming and outgoing vessels; to take the duties of Medical Superintendent of the Quarantine Station, or to take the general medical management of any isolation hospital under the control of the Board.

Applicants should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be in vigorous and sound health, have all the necessary qualifications for registration as a medical practitioner of Victoria, and engage to become at once, on appointment, registered as such, and show that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable disease.

PORT PHILLIP HEADS.—STEAM PILOTAGE SYSTEM.

MARINERS are hereby notified that on and after the 1st January, 1901, vessels arriving off Port Phillip Heads and requiring the services of Pilots will be boarded by means of a steam pilot vessel, which will be substituted for the sailing vessels at present employed in such service as set forth in the Admiralty Sailing Directions 1897.

Such steam pilot vessel will cruise within the limits of the present cruising station as defined on page 430 of the said Sailing Directions, and in clause 16 of the Victorian Pilot Regulations.

Such steam vessel will be distinguished by the same characteristics as apply to the fore-and-aft rigged schooners at present engaged in the service at Port Phillip Heads.

During daylight such steam vessel while on her station will keep constantly flying at the main masthead (as a signal that a pilot's services are offered to vessels) a red and white flag, the upper horizontal half of which shall be white and the lower half red.

From sunset to sunrise such vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty and not at anchor, will, in addition to the lights required for all pilot boats, carry, at a distance of 8 feet below her white masthead light, a red light, visible all round the horizon, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least 2 miles, and also the coloured side-lights required to be carried by vessels when under way.

When engaged on her station on pilotage duty and at anchor she will carry, in addition to the light required for all pilot boats, the red light above mentioned, but not the coloured side-lights.

When not engaged on her station on pilotage duty she will carry the same lights as other steam vessels.

When the steam vessel for purposes of coaling or provisioning, &c., leaves the cruising station for short periods only, such station will be temporarily maintained by a fore-and-aft rigged schooner, as set forth on page 430 of the Admiralty Sailing Directions 1897; but, in the event of any disablement of the steam vessel for a longer period than forty-eight hours, then a suitable steamship will be substituted.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 5th day of December, 1900, made the following alterations in the Regulations relating to the granting of Certificates of Competency to Mining Engine-drivers, made in pursuance of the provisions of section 138 of the *Mines Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1514), and dated the 1st day of August, 1898, viz.:-

Schedule A.

For the word "ten (10)" in clause No. 1, line 4, substitute word "fourteen (14)."

For sub-clause *b*, clause No. 4, substitute the following :-

"That he has been the holder of a third-class certificate under these Regulations, or a second-class certificate under the Factories and Shops Acts, for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and that he has had at least six (6) months' experience during that period in driving a third-class mining engine or engines, such driving experience to have been for not less than twelve (12) hours per week; or that he has within a period of three (3) years prior to the date of examination assisted to drive a steam-engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve (12) inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder steam-engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to that of a single cylinder of more than twelve (12) inches in diameter for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and for at least twelve hours per week. The examination to be equivalent to that undergone by a candidate for a first-class factory certificate."

For the schedule following clause seventeen (17) substitute the following schedule :-

- "To be paid by an applicant for a Certificate of Competency, £1;
- To be paid by the holder of a first-class certificate under these Regulations for any change of such certificate, 5s.;
- To be paid for a copy of a certificate, 2s. 6d."

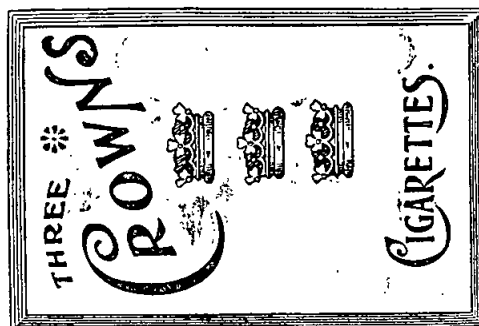

No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1901 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be raised, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses one, two, and three of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses one, two, and three of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement a charge of One shilling and fourpence for every one thousand gallons shall be made. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to agree for a special charge, from time to time, with any ratepayer for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and fourpence per one thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of One shilling and fourpence per one thousand gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say—

(1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One Shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty Shillings.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) One Shilling and Sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

(4) Any person who shall obtain water or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes or any or either of them in the said district shall pay the sum of Ten Shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1901, commencing from the first January, 1901, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable 1st July, 1901.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st January, 1901, and the 1st of July, 1901.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1894, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation, viz:—

REGULATION No. 21.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1901 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Nine pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Ten pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than One pound sterling.

5. For every water-trough Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands, where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Fourpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 300,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1899, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1901 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings shall be paid.

5. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

6. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

7. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

8. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

9. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1901.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 22.

REGULATION providing for the sale of water for the year 1901.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The forms of measure shall be and are hereunder determined by the Trust.

2. *Gravitation Water.*—The price or rate to be paid for water delivered from the River Murray, Gumbower Creek, or the Barr Creek through the Trust channels or otherwise shall be for indigenous grasses or pasturage Fourpence (1d.) per inch per acre; minimum charge to be Five shillings (5s.)

3. For irrigation of lucerne or fodder crops the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per inch per acre. Minimum charge shall be Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.)

4. For the irrigation of cereals—wheat, oats, barley, &c., the charge shall be One shilling and Sixpence (1s. 6d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering. For each of such waterings a minimum of Ten shillings (10s.) to be charged.

5. *Filling Tanks.*—Filling tanks outside of Trust area, a charge of Two pounds (£2) for each tank shall be made; but when the parties are irrigating land in the immediate neighbourhood of such tanks a demand of One pound (£1) only for each tank shall be made.

6. *Fallow Land.*—For fallow land a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made.

7. *Self-sown Crop.*—For the watering of land for self-sown crop, in cases where such crop is intended to be used for pasturage, the charge shall be Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre, with a minimum charge of Five shillings (5s.); but in the event of such crop being harvested, then the charge shall be One shilling per inch per acre, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings (10s.).

8. *Irrigation by Pumping.*—For all kinds of crops or land all the year round the charge shall be Tenpence (10d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering. Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) to be the minimum charge for each acre.

9. *Filling Tanks.*—Filling tanks inside of Trust area, a charge of One pound (£1) for each tank shall be made. Filling tanks outside of Trust area, a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made.

10. *Garden Rights.*—The rate or price for the right to irrigate gardens or orchards shall be at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per acre or part of an acre, for the year round, but in all cases, either for gardens or other crops or grasses, the minimum charge shall be One pound (£1).

11. A garden shall be taken to mean an area not exceeding twenty acres.

12. Such person or persons as the aforesaid Trust shall appoint from time to time for the purpose of collecting water rates shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates and charges.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.

5. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1901.

6. In the construction of this regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890* been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1901 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal annual valuation.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement by the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.
- (d) The rate to be charged non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) In buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half-rate payment, to be made before the supply is given.
- (g) For supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine and the preliminary payment must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In the case of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or lands so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July.
- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application he may think desirable. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council shall approve of a Waterworks Trust being constituted, he may make an order accordingly, and every such order shall—

- State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan to such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest to be charged thereon;
- Specify the limits of the lands within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- State what are the principal works;
- Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- Contain such provisions as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is wholly within one municipal district, appoint the council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, to be the commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district.

And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Kerang has made application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, and for a loan of One thousand two hundred pounds sterling (£1,200) for the purpose of taking over from the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust the waterworks constructed by it within the said shire, irrespective of those for the supply of the Township of Kerang.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, hereby approves of the aforesaid application of the Council of the Shire of Kerang, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The councillors for the Shire of Kerang for the time being, and one other person, to be the commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(2) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be One thousand two hundred pounds sterling (£1,200) to enable the Waterworks Trust hereby constituted to purchase and take over from the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust the works constructed by that body within the Shire of Kerang, irrespective of those for the water supply of the Township of Kerang; and that the rate of interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(3) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

thence southerly and south easterly by the western boundary of that lake to the inlet of the Lalbert Creek; thence in a general direction southerly by the said creek to the road to Ninyeunook, at the north-east angle of allotment 17, section 4, parish of Towaninny; thence south-westerly by the western boundary of said road to a point west from the north-west angle of allotment 25A, section 1, of the last-named parish; thence east by a line to the said north-west angle of the last-named allotment; That the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust shall be diminished by the extinction thereof of the portions described hereunder, viz:—

WHEREAS by the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* (No. 1451) it is among other things provided that the sum of Thirty-five thousand pounds to be raised by the issue of Treasury Bonds under the authority of the said Act may be applied for the giving of bonuses for dairy produce, fruits, and honey of best quality, and in best order exported to markets other than Australasian; for the construction of wineries in vine-growing districts and agricultural education generally; for the sowing, and planting, and cultivation of seeds or plants to be used for the manufacture of the same; and for the manufacture of raisins, currants, and figs, to be expended under Regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council; And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 6th and 16th of November, 1896, Regulations were made for payment of bonuses for the purposes aforesaid; Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Regulations made for the purposes aforesaid in the manner following, that is to say:—

Bonuses on the Export of Honey.

In clause 1 of the aforesaid Regulations of 6th November, 1896, the sum of £225 shall read £60 15s.

Bonuses for Raisin, Currant, and Fig Factories, £2,205.

In clause 1 of the aforesaid Regulations of the 6th November, 1896, the sum of £2,205 shall read £2,133 14s. 11d.

General Vegetable Products, £10,000.

In clause 1 of the aforesaid Regulations of the 6th November, 1896, the sum of £10,000 shall read £7,000.

Bonuses for Export of Fruit Pulp.

In clause 1 of the aforesaid Regulations of the 16th November, 1896, the sum of £570 shall read £2,805 10s. 1d.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Water Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust or of any other body or persons authorized by the said Acts to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has or have by Order in Council been duly appointed or authorized to make additional Orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Acts, and may in such additional Orders increase or diminish or otherwise alter in accordance with and not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Acts the extent of the district of such Trust, body, or persons.

And whereas the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted by Order in Council, dated the 31st day of May, 1886.

And whereas the said Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has made application to have its district increased.

And whereas it is deemed expedient to increase the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the said Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and to amend the boundaries of the district of the said Trust, as set out in Orders in Council bearing dates the 18th day of July, 1887, the 31st day of October, 1892, and the 13th day of December, 1897.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

3. 4. 10. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

11. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.
