BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1584), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named bereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

Wednesday, the 7th day of February instant, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Ararat;

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, at Terang;

Wednesday, the 14th day of February instant, from the hour of Twelve J'clock noon, at Daylesford.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.
