

# CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

#### REGULATION No. 7.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound stolling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the opound according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual immicipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annuan upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annual municipal value of such recoverty.

sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the property so supplied it supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings (10s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork or plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardeners for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the second payment on the 1st day of January, 1900.

  1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.
- 3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the Schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

  4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

  9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that ease he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail.
- 11.   - (v.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority;

Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by sllowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise:

  (XIV.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person:

  (XV.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being saven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway:

  (XVI.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority; and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority:

  (XVII.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place:

  (XVIII.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show, hire, or sale:

  (XXI.) Permitting any horse to serve a mare for breeding

Any carter plying for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority, or demanding higher rates than authorized by such local authority, or demanding higher form the local authority, or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority;

(xxiv.) Discharging any fire-arms, or setting off any fire-works, or carrying any fire-arms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or public place without permission from the local authority:

Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice, or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps, or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

6. Route to be observed in carriage and foot ways.—Any local authority may from time to time make regulations for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and foot ways and public places of any city, town, or borough, and for preventing any obstruction thereof, whether by the assemblage of persons or otherwise; and every wilful breach of any such regulation shall be deemed to be a separate offence against this Part of this Act, and every person committing any such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Lucal authority to make rules for boatmen and carters.—Any local authority may make such rules and regulations with

Carriage and foot ways to be set out.—Upon the extension of any of the provisions of this Part of this Act to any city, town, or borough in Victoria, the council of such city, town, or borough, or if there he no such council the Surveyor-General, shall cause to be set out the breadth of the carriage and foot ways in the streets and public places of every such city, town, or borough, and shall cause the said footways to be marked by posts at the corners and intersections of the streets; and the carriage and foot ways when so set out shall be deemed to be the carriage and foot ways respectively of such city, town, or borough.
