By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

**VITAL STATISTICS.****RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1900.**

THE births of 72 boys and 63 girls, or in all of 135 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of January. Of these 56 occurred in Ballarat East, 69 in Ballarat West, and 10 in Sebastopol; included were 10 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 105, viz., 59 of boys and 46 of girls.

The deaths registered in January numbered 120, viz., 70 of males and 50 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 15. In December the recorded deaths numbered 84; in January, 1899, they numbered 92; in January, 1898, they numbered 111; in January, 1897, they numbered 86; in January, 1896, they numbered 90; in January, 1895, they numbered 107; in January, 1894, they numbered 101; in January, 1893, they numbered 69; in January, 1892, they numbered 69; in January, 1891, they numbered 71; and in January, 1890, they numbered 104.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

## Marine Act 1890.

## AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF ANIMALS BY SHIP.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the carriage of animals on ships leaving Victorian ports, and also for affixing penalties to any breach of any regulations made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: And whereas the said Board did, on the 17th day of September, 1897, make such Regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulation No. 7 of "The Regulations for the Carriage of Animals by Ship," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st October, 1897, and also to substitute an Amended Regulation therefor: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the aforesaid Regulation, and in lieu thereof doth make and substitute therefor the following Amended Regulation, namely:—

## AMENDED REGULATION No. 7.

- (a) Not more than six dogs, and no male goats, shall be carried.
- (b) Pigs, not exceeding six in number, may be carried, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

Prior to taking any pigs on board, the owner, agent, or master of any ship desiring to carry pigs within this Regulation shall make application to the Marine Board for permission to do so. Every pig carried shall be placed in a separate stall or pen having a clear space of not less than three (3) inches between the bottom thereof and the deck of the vessel. Provided that no such carriage will be permitted without the approval of the Inspector of Shipping or other officer appointed by the Board, as required by section 164 of the *Marine Act 1890*.

This Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Carriage of Animals by Ship," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1900, on which date Regulation No. 7, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. ROCKE, TOMPSITT, AND CO., MANUFACTURING CHEMISTS, BRIDGE-ROAD, RICHMOND, for a period of one week from the 5th February, 1900, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-one females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-one females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Articles for Bushmen's Corps, for Defence Department.

The supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Controller of Naval and Military Stores. Delivery to be made of the minimum quantity of each line at the Ordnance Stores, Barracks, St. Kilda-road, within seven days from the date of the acceptance of the tender, except for saddlery and saddlery appurtenances, for which 21 days will be allowed in which to make delivery.

All articles must be strictly in accordance with samples at the Ordnance Stores.

The quantities shown are the minimum that will be ordered, but the Contractor may be required to supply, at contract rates, any further quantity up to the maximum shown of each line that may be ordered, a *pro rata* period being allowed for delivery.

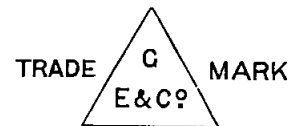

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

## REGULATION No. 7.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price made, will be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings (10s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork or plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
13. For water supplied to market gardeners for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate and charges.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. No person, whether licensed as hereinafter mentioned or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such



pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter;

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. diameter;

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

6. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any) and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which—after notice that service pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve, for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affixing the dial of the meter.

9. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or permits to be done, any thing in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these Regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

11. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed under, and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

12. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes, and to fix meters, or to relay or to refix the same must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

14. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and being capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship and of approved pattern to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

15. If any person throw or convey or permit to be thrown or conveyed any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or any thing, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct, which by notice in the *Government Gazette* has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks or reservoir belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

18. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without having given to the Trust two days' notice in writing of his intention so to do, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

19. The officers of the Trust shall have power, between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, pipes, instruments, and apparatus, for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may, between the hours of Nine in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, enter any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling-house or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 9in., the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

22. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or in any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

23. The Trust may enter into a Special Agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

24. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons, One shilling.

25. The Trust reserves the right to sell water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for other than domestic purposes without the written authority of the Trust will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.

26. In the construction of these Regulations the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word officer shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word Trust shall be deemed to mean The Alexandra Waterworks Trust.

# NIHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Eleven pounds or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

5. For water supplied to syphon-pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

6. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable institutions, and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1900, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the 1st day of July, 1900.

Where water-meters are affixed, payments shall be made on the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

## SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and twopence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Seventeen pounds two shillings and sixpence (£17 2s. 6d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1900.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Seventeen pounds two shillings and sixpence (£17 2s. 6d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings (2s.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises,

shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in earthen or other drains or pipes for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, take or carry away, or wilfully permit to be taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

15. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all reasonable times between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

16. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the said year 1900. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

18. The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the evening of the 1st of December, 1899.

RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

REGULATION No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1899*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks District (that is to say):—

1. The rates and charges specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

2. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under the sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, the sum of Twenty shillings.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.

5. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1900.

6. In the construction of this Regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION No. 3.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1899* (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal annual valuation.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.

(d) The rate to be charged non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.

(e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) In buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement; wooden houses shall be charged half rate. Payments to be made before the supply is given.

(g) Supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(h) In the case of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July.

(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 3 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust, on the 23rd day of November, 1899, and the seal of the Trust was hereby affixed in our presence—

REGULATION No. 4.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1899* (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the regulation following:—

1. Any person plying for hire with horse and dray shall be supplied with water by measure only, provided that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be in each case 6,000 gallons per year.

2. The valuation of lands and tenements for the purpose of water rates shall be the same as the valuation for such lands and tenements during the same or the previous year by the council of the municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or (if there be no such valuation) the valuation of such lands or tenements by a police magistrate; and that no such rate shall exceed the amount of Ten pounds per centum on such valuation. Provided that the charge for the supply of water aforesaid shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

3. The rate or charge for water sold by meter shall be Fourpence per 100 gallons.

4. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary. Such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering One million gallons. Except in case of special agreement with the Trust, or in cases not otherwise specially provided for, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be a quantity equal to that quantity which the amount of the assessed water rates of the lands or tenements so supplied would purchase at Fourpence per (100) hundred gallons, had such rate been levied.

5. If any meter shall cease to, or be reported by any officer of the Trust as being out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period the meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or they may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

6. Overflow pipes to any vessel will not be permitted.

7. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away from his premises such water, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away from any tap, trough, public or private service-pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or shall any person not supplied with water by measure at any time use water by hose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also to have his supply of water cut off for a period not exceeding one month.

11. Water is supplied by the Trust for domestic purposes only, unless by measure.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or effecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or any fitting connected with the pipe of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have power of cancelling such licence at any time.

15. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe, or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. If any person shall neglect to keep in proper repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipe inside the building line of street being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the

occupier, if any, and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaking, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

17. In the construction of these by-laws the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Charlton Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation No. 4 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust on the 23rd day of November, 1899, and the Seal of the Trust was hereby affixed in our presence—

#### EXPLOSIVES MAGAZINE RESERVE AT TRUGANINA.—BY-LAWS.

At the Law Courts, Melbourne, the eighth day of February, 1900.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by the *Powder Magazines Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1456) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make by-laws for fixing the rents which may be charged for the use of sites of magazines for the storage of explosives (within the meaning of the *Explosives Act 1890* and any Act amending the same), and for determining the terms and conditions on which such sites will be let or leased for such purpose, and also for all or any of the subjects or matters mentioned in section 105 of the *Railways Act 1890*, for which purpose the word "railway" in such section shall be read as "tramway": Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following By-laws for fixing the rents to be charged for sites at the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina, and for determining the terms and conditions on which such sites will be let or leased viz:—

#### BY-LAWS

For fixing the rents to be charged for sites at the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina, and for determining the terms and conditions on which such sites will be let or leased.

1. In the following by-laws the term "lessee" shall include person, corporation, firm, or company, and the successors, executors, administrators, or assigns of the same.

2. Sites for private magazines may be let or leased from time to time by the Board of Land and Works, hereinafter called the Board, for such term as the Board may think fit.

3. The rent to be charged for each site shall be calculated at the rate of Ninepence for every twenty five pounds or fractional part of twenty-five pounds weight of explosives entered with the Customs or received into any magazine on such site.

Such rent shall be payable on the first day of each month in respect of all explosives entered or received during the preceding month, except in the case of the last rent payable upon the expiration or other sooner determination of the lease, which rent shall be payable on the date when the lease expires or is determined, and be in respect of all explosives entered or received during the preceding portion of the same month up to the date of such expiry or determination.

The rent under any lease shall be payable to the Collector of Customs for the time being at Melbourne, or to such other officer as the Board may from time to time appoint in that behalf.

Conditional on the due payment of his rent, the lessee shall be exonerated from the payment of any charges (duties of Customs or wharfage rates levied under the authority of any Act of Parliament excepted) otherwise payable to Her Majesty or the

Board in relation to the landing of the explosives upon which rent is calculated on the storage of the same at the magazine reserve.

Provided that nothing in this by-law contained shall be deemed to relieve the lessee from his obligation to bear the cost of handling, transporting, marking, or otherwise dealing with such explosive.

4. The right of any person to become the lessee of a site of a magazine for the storage of explosives shall be conditional on his satisfying the Board that he is a fit and proper person to become such, and that the annual rent will average not less than Twelve pounds per annum.

5. It shall be a further condition on which sites hereunder are to be let that the intending lessee shall execute a lease containing, in addition to any other conditions and covenants not inconsistent with these by-laws that the Board may in any particular case direct, covenants and conditions binding on the lessee to the following effect:—

- (a) To pay the rent reserved in the manner and at the times appointed.
- (b) Not to assign or sub-let the whole or any part of the site without the previous consent of the Board first obtained.
- (c) The lease to become void at the option of the Board upon an assignment, whether by operation of law or otherwise.
- (d) To repair and keep in repair any buildings or erections now or at any time during the currency of the lease on the land.
- (e) Not to place on the land any buildings or erections except such as have been first approved of by the Board in writing, and for that purpose to submit all necessary plans, elevations, and particulars.
- (f) Not to receive or store, or continue to store, any explosives on the land until and unless the lessee be at the time the holder of a licence issued under the provisions of the law for the time being in force regulating the receipt and storage of explosives applicable to the lessee's case.
- (g) Not to remove, or permit to be removed, from off the land any explosives, the subject-matter of any calculation for assessing the amount of any rent accruing, due, or due and unpaid unless and until all rent, duty, and wharfage rates in respect thereof have either been paid or the payment thereof secured to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs for the time being.
- (h) To obey and observe in connexion with the handling, carriage, receipt, and storage of all explosives brought or intended to be brought upon the land, or taken or intended to be taken therefrom, or stored or being thereon, the requirements and provisions of all Acts, requisitions, directions, laws, rules, by-laws, regulations, and licences for the time being required, given, issued, or in force with regard to the handling, carriage, receipt, and storage of explosives, and applicable to the lessee's case.
- (i) To obey and observe all the provisions of the Customs Acts and of the *Marine Act 1890*, and any regulations for the time being in force under such Acts, as to the landing of explosives intended to be stored on such land, and the payment of duty and wharfage in respect thereof, and the bonding and delivering of the same.
- (j) To permit the Board and all persons deputed by it, either generally or in connexion with the land the subject of the demise, to enter at any time the land and view every part thereof to ascertain if the covenants and conditions of the lease are being observed.
- (k) A condition permitting the lessee within 28 days from the date of the expiration, or other sooner determination of the lease if he has then paid and discharged all claims for rent, duties, rates, charges, or other claims in any way payable under the terms of the lease, to remove from off the land all buildings and erections other than boundary fences erected or placed thereon by him.
- (l) A condition giving the Board a right to determine the lease at any time in the event of the rent payable by the lessee within a period of three consecutive calendar months previous to the date of the exercise of such right being less than the sum of Four pounds for such period, and in the event of an exercise of such right giving the right to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs to withdraw any licence held by the lessee in respect of his premises as a bonded store under the Customs Acts.
- (m) A condition giving the Board a right to determine the lease at any time upon giving the lessee six calendar months' notice, in writing, of intention so to do.
- (n) A condition upon the lessee paying and discharging all claims for rent, duties, rates, charges, or other claims in any way payable under the terms of the lease, and having then removed from off the land and stored in a licensed magazine, or otherwise lawfully disposed of, all explosives theretofore on the land, conferring on him the right to at any time determine the lease by giving to the Board notice, in writing, of such his desire.
- (o) A proviso in the event of the rent being in arrear for 28 days, or in case of the non-observance or non-performance of the covenants and conditions of the lease, that the Board may forthwith determine the lease and re-enter the land.

And the Honorable Charles Carty Salmon, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**WHEREAS** by the Railway and Public Works Loan Application Acts it is among other things provided that the sum of One hundred thousand pounds, to be raised by the sale of Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock under the authority of the said Act, may be applied for the purpose of District Co-operative Wineries and Viticulture Industry, Dairy Schools, Experimental Stations, Purchase of Live Stock, Machinery, Implements, and other Appliances, and Technical Agricultural Education, Development of the Export Trade, Bonuses for the Encouragement of the Cultivation, Manufacture, and Export of Fruit, Tobacco, Flax, Hemp, Silk, and other Rural Industries, to be expended under Regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council; Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

**VITICULTURE INDUSTRY.**

Out of the sum of One hundred thousand pounds applicable under the Railway and Public Works Loan Application Acts for Viticulture Industry, &c., payment may be applied by the Minister for the purpose of Viticultural Education generally, and more especially for paying the salaries or fees of persons appointed, engaged, or employed as teachers of subjects appertaining to Viticulture, and for defraying the cost of erecting buildings in connexion with Viticultural Education, for fencing land for Vineyard purposes, and the expenses generally connected with the maintenance of Viticultural Schools, and the furnishing and equipment of such schools.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACTS.**

**WHEREAS** by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

**PART IV.—SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.**

In the Regulation made on 16th November, 1899, the words and figures "Chapter XIII.—Wombat State Forest" are hereby rescinded, and the words and figures "Chapter XII.—Wombat State Forest" are substituted therefor.

**Chapter XII.—Wombat State Forest.**

The price payable for green and dry wood cut from old and decayed standing trees (to be marked for felling by the forest officer) shall be One penny (1d.) per ton measurement.

The Regulation made on 16th November, 1899, is hereby rescinded so far as relates to the price payable for mining props, split, for which the following prices are hereby substituted, namely:—

For mining props, split (to be cut out of mature and over-mature timber), 3ft. 6in., 4ft., 4ft. 6in., 5ft., and 5ft. 6in. x 6in., per 100 running feet, Sixpence (6d.)

For similar props, 5ft., 5ft. 6in., and 6ft. x 8in. x 6in., per 100 running feet, Ninepence (9d.)—(Corr. No. F.23754.)

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF KOONOOMOO.

WE, Thomas Loughnan, Thomas Breen, Walter Dixon, Evan Jones, and William Adams, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of public recreation in the township of Koonoomoo, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick hills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or cricket, or football matches, shall be as follows:—

10. No person shall after the sixth day of January, 1900, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for the purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

1. That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the reserve, on payment of such a fee as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two pounds (£2).
2. That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied to him by the Committee of Management of the reserve, which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### SHIRE OF CHILTERN.—REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILTERN PUBLIC PARK.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Chiltern Public Park, having framed the following additional regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, birds, fish, or any property in the park, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.
2. No person shall climb on or jump over any fence or seat in or around the park, or stick bills on the fences, buildings, or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, buildings, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.
3. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the park any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the park, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.
4. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the council, shall bring into the park any horse or vehicle.
5. No person shall bring into the park any dog for coursing or other purposes of sport, and all dogs so brought in, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found within the park shall be liable to be destroyed.
6. No person shall hawk, or offer for sale in the park any goods or articles of any descriptions without having previously obtained written permission from the council.
7. No person shall light any fire, or camp, or erect any dwelling in the park without the written permission of the council.
8. No person shall be allowed to carry any firearms, or shoot, or otherwise destroy any game in the park without the sanction, in writing, of the council.

9. No person shall enter the park on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, or bring therein any horse, or carriage, or other vehicle except on the production of a ticket issued by the council, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, or enclosure, or cultivated spot within the park, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gate-keepers and other persons authorized by the council.

10. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports shall not be played or take place in the park, except in such portions thereof as may be set apart for the purpose, and under such conditions as the council may direct.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing regulations were adopted by the Shire Council of Chiltern (subject to the confirmation by the Board of Land and Works) at a meeting of the council held on the 7th day of December, 1899.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class C) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may

increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1108) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin Districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by

all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District shall be Five shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District shall be One shilling and nine-pence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District shall be Three shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District shall be One shilling and three-pence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Two shillings and six-pence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Four shillings and six-pence per square mile.

1. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. 3. 5. 7. 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. Every person offending against the provisions of this By-law, on conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day during which he so offends.
