WAR BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE SOUTH AFRICAN REPUBLIC AND THE ORANGE FREE STATE.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor directs the publication of the subjoined despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and of the following Proclamation of Her Majesty the Queen, dated the 27th day of December, 1899, for general information.

SIR,

I have the honour to acquaint you that, in consequence of the state of war now existing between this country and the South African Republic, and also between this country and the Orange Free State, a Proclamation was issued by the Queen on the 27th ultimo, warning persons against aiding either of these Republics in hostilities, and against trading with them or with any persons resident therein.

As this Proclamation is of general application to British subjects all the world over, and to foreigners residing or commercially domiciled within any part of the Queen's dominions, Her Majesty's Government consider it desirable that it should be published in each of the British Colonies and Protectorates.

I request, therefore, that you will cause it to be published in the Colony under your Government in the form of the accompanying draft notice.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS a state of war exists between Us and the South African Republic, and also between Us and the Orange Free State:

And whereas it is therefore expedient and necessary to warn all Our subjects of their duties and obligations towards Us, Our Crown, and Government:

Now therefore We do hereby warn all Our subjects not to enlist or engage themselves in the military service of the Government of either of the said Republics, or in any way to aid, abet, or assist either of the said Republics in the prosecution of hostilities, and not to carry on any trade with, or supply any goods, wares, or merchandise to either of the said Republics, or to any person resident therein, or to supply any goods, wares, or merchandise to any person for transmission to either of the said Republics, or to any person resident therein, and not to carry any goods, wares, or merchandise destined for either of the said Republics, or for any person resident therein.

And We do hereby further warn all persons that whoever, in contravention of the law, shall commit any of the aforesaid acts, will be liable to such penalty as the law provides.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty-seventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and in the sixty-third year of Our reign.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF ANIMALS BY SHIP.*

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the carriage of animals on ships leaving Victorian ports, and also for affixing penalties to any breach of any regulations made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: And whereas the said Board did, on the 17th day of September, 1897, make such Regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulation No. 7 of "The Regulations for the Carriage of Animals by Ship," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st October, 1897, and also to substitute an Amended Regulation therefor: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the aforesaid Regulation, and in lieu thereof doth make and substitute therefor the following Amended Regulation, namely:—

AMENDED REGULATION No. 7.

- (a) Not more than six dogs, and no male goats, shall be carried.
- (b) Pigs, not exceeding six in number, may be carried, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

Prior to taking any pigs on board, the owner, agent, or master of any ship desiring to carry pigs within this Regulation shall make application to the Marine Board for permission to do so. Every pig carried shall be placed in a separate stall or pen having a clear space of not less than three (3) inches between the bottom thereof and the deck of the vessel. Provided that no such carriage will be permitted without the approval of the Inspector of Shipping or other officer appointed by the Board, as required by section 161 of the *Marine Act 1890*.

This Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Carriage of Animals by Ship," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1900, on which date Regulation No. 7, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing Amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred.

- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The births of 1,012 children, viz., 506 boys and 506 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. The number was, it will be observed, 69 more than in January, 1899, 57 more than in January, 1898, and 30 more than in January, 1897, but were fewer than in any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 138 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 161 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in January numbered 725, viz., 407 of males and 318 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 287, or by 40 per cent., as against 57 per cent. in January, 1899, and 55 per cent. according to the average. The number of deaths was, it will be noticed, 125 more than in January, 1899, and larger than that recorded for the month during any year since 1892, except 1896 and 1898; but it was 17 below the average of January during the last ten years, or 32 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.36 and of deaths registered to 18.17 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 24.21 and 15.40 respectively, and during the last ten years of 29.14 and 18.86 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 106.9° on the 28th, and the lowest was 47.0° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (68.3°) was nearly two degrees above the average, but not so high as in January, 1898, when 69.2° were recorded. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (52.9°) took place on the

28th, and the least range (8.4°) on the 29th. The mean daily range was 23.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.201 inches on the 5th, and the lowest was 29.446 inches on the 3rd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.852 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 3.30 inches, which was higher than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except 1897 (when 5½ inches fell), and 1.48 inches above the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was 61.9.

Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 39 per cent. to that mortality, which was the same proportion as prevailed in the corresponding month of the two previous years, as against 30 per cent. in January, 1897; 43 per cent. in January, 1896; 43 per cent. in January, 1895; and 42 per cent. in January, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 235, as compared with 173 in January, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was 232 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 183 in January, 1899; 248 in January, 1898; 143 in January, 1897; 224 in January, 1896; 178 in January, 1895; 224 in January, 1894; 222 in January, 1893; 225 in January, 1892; 274 in January, 1891; and 285 per 1,000 in January 1890.

Sixty-six persons—as against 44 in January, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Fifty-two of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 27 in January, 1899—were from external causes, of which 46 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 5, was passed over by a tramcar; a female, aged 38, by a buggy; a printer, aged 46, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a tramcar; a groom, aged 32, of fracture of the spine, caused by a fall from a horse; a carrier, aged 63, of fracture of the spine, consequent on being thrown from a lorry; a boy, aged 8, of injuries, the result of a fall from a coal truck; a labourer, aged 16, of injury to the head, caused by a fall from a tree; a driver, aged 23, of injuries, consequent on a fall from a ladder; a tinsmith, aged 42, of hæmorrhage, the result of a fall from a window; a female, aged 78, of injuries, caused by falling in a room; a ship's apprentice, aged 19, of fracture of the skull, the result of a lump of coal falling on him; a labourer, aged 17, of injury to the spine; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; six male children, aged 5, 8, 10, 11, 12, and 14 months respectively, six female children, aged 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, and 10 months respectively, a boy, aged 6, two labourers, aged 32 and 33 respectively, a news agent, aged 33, a groom, aged 36, a driver, aged 37, a ship's carpenter, aged 59, a bricklayer, aged 66, a pensioner, aged 75, and three females, aged 58, 68, and 82 respectively, of heart apoplexy; a female, aged 57, of alcoholic poisoning, through drinking a bottle of rum; a boy, aged 11, was drowned in the River Yarra, whilst bathing; a marble mason, aged 30, in Hobson's Bay; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, drowned in the River Yarra, aged 43, a labourer, aged 69, and a female, aged 68, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female infant, aged 2 weeks, was suffocated by vomited matter getting into air passages; and a new-born female infant died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, aged 19 days, who was drowned, a verdict of wilful murder being returned against the mother. The suicidal deaths were those of a gentleman, aged 56, who shot himself; a clerk, aged 64, who cut his throat; a dyer, aged 36, and an accountant, aged 44, who poisoned themselves, the former with prussic acid, and the latter with cyanide of potassium; and a printer, aged 46, who drowned himself.

One hundred and fifty-six deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne, 22 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 5 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 10 in the Homeopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 10 in the Metropolitan and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 4 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylums; 7 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 5 in the Protestant Refuge; and 5 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 281, of which 154, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 127, or 45 per cent., were females. Of those who died, 235 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five. In the corresponding month of 1899, the deaths under five years were 47 fewer, and those under one year 62 fewer than in the month under notice.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 441. Of these 253, or 57 per cent., were males, and 188, or 43 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 14 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 46 were between sixty and sixty-five, 46 were between sixty-five and seventy, 43 were between seventy and seventy-five, 26 were between seventy-five and eighty, 27 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 5 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-five. As compared with January, 1899, the deaths of persons between 5 and 20 were fewer by 9, but those between 30 and 40 were more numerous by 11, and those of persons aged 55 or upwards more numerous by 77.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

Owing to the exceptionally hot and sultry weather which prevailed in the month under notice, a largely increased mortality occurred, as compared with the results in the corresponding month of the previous year, viz., an increase of 111 under local diseases, 25 under violence, and 27 under indefinite causes (chiefly debility, &c.), although a decrease took place under most of the other heads, notably one of 36 under zymotic diseases. Under the last-named class a falling-off of 28 deaths was due to the disappearance of an epidemic of whooping-cough, and one of 13 to the lower fatality of diarrhoeal diseases; but, as a set-off, the deaths from influenza rose from 3 to 15. Under the local class, a general increase occurred under all the principal sub-classes, viz., an increase of 21 under diseases of the nervous system, of 29 under those of the circulatory system, of 22 under those of the respiratory system, of 25 under diseases of the digestive, and of 18 under those of the urinary system. The high temperature of the month appears to have had a marked effect in increasing the mortality of infants under one year and of old people, for an increase of 62 occurred in the deaths of infants, and of 77 in those of persons aged 55 or upwards, as compared with January, 1899, or a total of 139, although the total increase at all ages was only 125. The intense heat also caused a very large number of deaths from sunstroke (or heat apoplexy), viz., 24, of which 12 were of infants between three and fifteen months old, 1 was of a boy aged six, 5 were of persons between thirty and forty, and 6 of persons aged fifty-eight or upwards. The following were the number of deaths from sunstroke, together with the maximum and mean temperature in the shade, recorded in January during each of the last eleven years:—

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first month of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

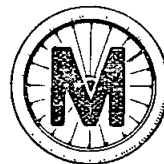

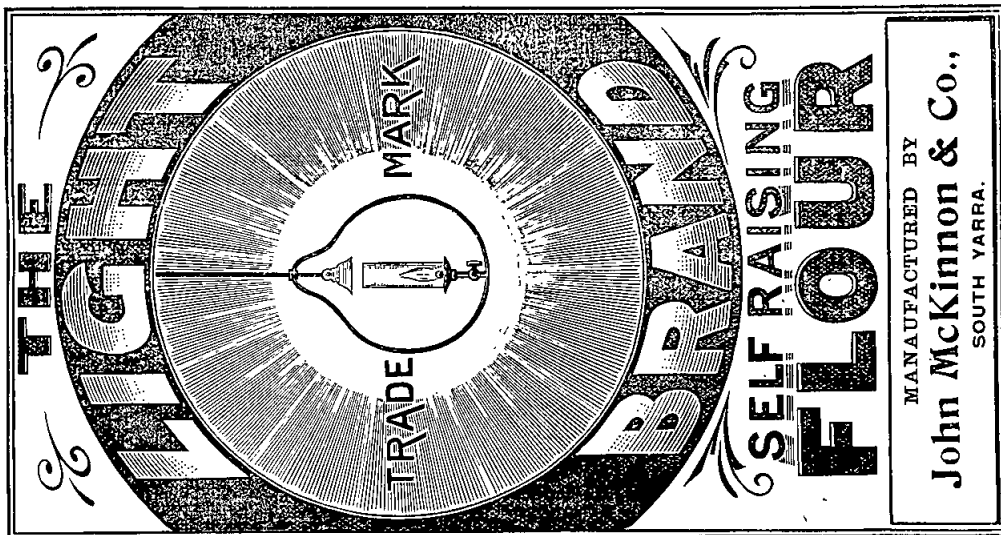

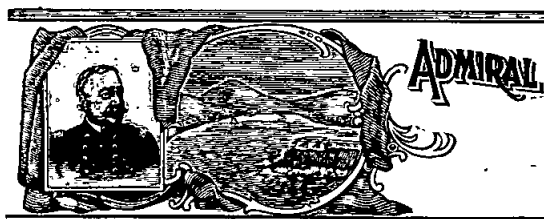

SHIRE OF ECHUCA.

BY-LAW NO. 3 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Echuca, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 1098, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet pans, house and back yard rubbish, and for maintaining and preserving the cleanliness of public and private drains and channels, and other matters named therein.

THE Council of the Shire of Echuca, in the Colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, by virtue of the provisions contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, doth hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 3 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Rochester, and within a certain area adjoining the said township, and described in the plan of the parish of Rochester West as allotments 66, 67, 68, and 85 within the said shire (hereinafter called the said township).

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said township shall cause the yard belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the Council may cause same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any premises in the said township on which there shall be erected any stable, cow yard, cattle shed, or pig sty shall cause the same to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or

accumulated shall amount to 2 cubic yards, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.

6. Every occupier and person shall provide and maintain on their premises a proper closet or privy building constructed with openings or flues to supply ventilation, and every earth-closet shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth, ashes, or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleaning the same.

7. The occupiers of every house, building, or tenement within the said township shall cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth-closet, privy, or place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises. Provided that the contents of any such earth-closet, privy, or place in the nature of an earth-closet shall not be removed or discharged therefrom, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m.

8. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week and as much oftener as may be necessary, and as the Council may from time to time direct, cause to be emptied and cleansed by the nightman employed by the Council every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

9. No occupier or person shall employ any person for the removal of night-soil save those authorized by the Council for the purpose, and no other person shall remove any night-soil except in case where exemption granted.

10. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or things shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

11. The nightman authorized by the said Council shall give an intimation in writing to the occupier, or leave on the premises a notice of the day in each week on which he shall visit the premises for the purpose of emptying and cleansing the closet-pan, and the said occupier will grant free access to the said nightman, and leave his gates unbolted and unlocked for that purpose.

12. Every occupier or person shall furnish and provide for their respective closets a suitable galvanized iron pan, properly

riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles there-to; and such pan may be of the following dimensions:—15 inches wide and 14½ inches deep, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

14. The Council may exempt any premises within the said township from the operation of this By-law on the recommendation of the health officer and inspector of nuisances.

15. Nothing contained in this By-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier or person having the management or control of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being so used so that the same be not removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the said Council, or to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

16. No such occupier shall deposit any rubbish, yard sweepings, or filth of any kind upon any land, street, lane, drain, water channel, or other place other than the depôts provided for the deposit of such by the Council.

17. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not being less than Five shillings) to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing By-law was adopted by the Council of the Shire of Echuca on the 26th September, 1899, and confirmed 31st October, 1899.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person, whether licensed as hereinafter mentioned or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, ½-in. diameter;

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, ¾-in. diameter;

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

6. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any) and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which—after notice that service-pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve, for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affixing the dial of the meter.

9. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or permits to be done, any thing in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these Regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

11. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed under, and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

12. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes, and to fix meters, or to relay or to refix the same must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

14. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and being capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship and of approved pattern to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

15. If any person throw or convey or permit to be thrown or conveyed any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or any thing, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct, which by notice in the *Government Gazette* has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks or reservoir belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

18. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without having given to the Trust two days' notice in writing of his intention so to do, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

19. The officers of the Trust shall have power, between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, pipes, instruments, and apparatus, for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder

such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may, between the hours of Nine in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, enter any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling-house or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 9in., the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

22. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or in any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

23. The Trust may enter into a Special Agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

24. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons, One shilling.

25. The Trust reserves the right to sell water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for other than domestic purposes without the written authority of the Trust will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.

26. In the construction of these Regulations the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word officer shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word Trust shall be deemed to mean The Alexandra Waterworks Trust.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Nhll Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhll Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Eleven pounds or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

5. For water supplied to syphon-pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

6. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable institutions, and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1900, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the 1st day of July, 1900.

Where water-meters are affixed, payments shall be made on the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and twopence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Seventeen pounds two shillings and sixpence (£17 2s. 6d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1900.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Seventeen pounds two shillings and sixpence (£17 2s. 6d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings (2s.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in earthen or other drains or pipes for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, take or carry away, or wilfully permit to be taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

15. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all reasonable times between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

16. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the said year 1900. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

18. The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the evening of the 1st of December, 1899.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION No. 3.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal annual valuation.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.

(d) The rate to be charged non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.

(e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) In buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement; wooden houses shall be charged half rate. Payments to be made before the supply is given.

(g) Supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(h) In the case of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other

than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July.

(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 3 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust, on the 23rd day of November, 1899, and the seal of the Trust was hereby affixed in our presence—

REGULATION No. 4.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the regulation following:—

1. Any person plying for hire with horse and dray shall be supplied with water by measure only, provided that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be in each case 6,000 gallons per year.

2. The valuation of lands and tenements for the purpose of water rates shall be the same as the valuation for such lands and tenements during the same or the previous year by the council of the municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or (if there be no such valuation) the valuation of such lands or tenements by a police magistrate; and that no such rate shall exceed the amount of Ten pounds per centum on such valuation. Provided that the charge for the supply of water aforesaid shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

3. The rate or charge for water sold by meter shall be Fourpence per 100 gallons.

4. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary. Such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering One million gallons. Except in case of special agreement with the Trust, or in cases not otherwise specially provided for, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be a quantity equal to that quantity which the amount of the assessed water rates of the lands or tenements so supplied would purchase at Fourpence per (100) hundred gallons, had such rate been levied.

5. If any meter shall cease to, or be reported by any officer of the Trust as being out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period the meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or they may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

6. Overflow pipes to any vessel will not be permitted.

7. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away from his premises such water, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away from any tap, trough, public or private service-pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or shall any person not supplied with water by measure at any time use water by hose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also to have his supply of water cut off for a period not exceeding one month.

11. Water is supplied by the Trust for domestic purposes only, unless by measure.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or effecting the dial of the meter under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or any fitting connected with the pipe of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the

Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have power of cancelling such licence at any time.

15. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe, or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. If any person shall neglect to keep in proper repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipe inside the building line of street being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier, if any, and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaking, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

17. In the construction of these by-laws the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Charlton Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation No. 4 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust on the 23rd day of November, 1899, and the Seal of the Trust was hereby affixed in our presence—

A By-law of the Shire of Ballarat, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and numbered XV., for enforcing portions of Part I of the *Police Offences Act 1890* throughout the Shire of Ballarat.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ballarat order as follows, viz.:—That section 5 of Part I of the *Police Offences Act 1890*, excepting sub-sections 9, 15, 18, 21, and 22, shall be and continue in force throughout the Shire of Ballarat.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

1. Throwing any glass, filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any road, footway, or public place.

2. Riding, driving, or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath.

3. Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.

4. Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.

5. Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the local authority.

6. Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road.

7. Emptying any privy or cess-pool, or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter without a licence from, and without having given such security as is required by the local authority.

8. Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.

9. Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.

10. Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.

11. Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.

12. Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking-in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.

13. Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.

14. Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority.

15. Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.

16. Permitting any horse to serve a mare for breeding purposes, or permitting a mare to be brought to a horse, or a horse to be brought to a mare, in order to ascertain if she is in season for taking the horse for breeding purposes, in or within sight of any road, street, or thoroughfare.

17. Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority.

18. Plying for hire with any boat, not being a steam-boat, at any ferry or on any river without a licence from the local authority, or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority.

19. Discharging any firearms, or setting off any fireworks, or carrying any firearms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or public place without permission from the local authority.
