MISCELLANEOUS.

*Special Allowances.*

1. The actual expense incurred by officers when travelling on specially important duties in the hire of a private apartment may be allowed in such cases as the Minister, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, shall determine.

2. When an officer temporarily stationed at any place and receiving a travelling allowance has to visit any other place, and thereby necessarily incurs extra personal expenses, he may be permitted by the Permanent Head of his Department to draw an additional allowance for such visit, as fixed by these Regulations.

3. An officer acting for another officer shall whilst so acting be entitled to receive allowances on the same scale as the officer for whom he is acting.

4. In districts where horses cannot be easily hired, the Minister, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, may authorize a commuted allowance for the keep of horses.

5. Officers in receipt of commuted allowances when absent from duty, either on leave or through illness, for any period over a fortnight, shall be paid such portion only of their commuted allowances as the Minister may direct.

6. When the distance travelled or the state of the roads necessitates the use of two horses, a special report shall accompany the account.

7. When officers travel by steamer or other vessel in which the fare paid includes maintenance, such smaller allowance may be granted as the Head of the Department shall deem reasonable, provided, however, that such allowance shall not exceed one-quarter of the ordinary rates to which such officers would otherwise be entitled.

*Mode of Travelling.*

8. Officers shall travel by railway whenever practicable.

9. Whenever travelling by railway is not practicable, officers shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for such payments.

*Transfers and Exchanges.*

10. Travelling expenses of officers, their wives and children, and reasonable cost of removing furniture, shall be allowed when such officers are transferred from one station to another not by way of punishment. Furniture shall, when practicable, be removed by railway.

11. Travelling expenses in connexion with exchanges of officers at their own request shall be borne by the officers themselves.

AS TO QUARTERS.

Where any officer who has free quarters with or without other allowances connected therewith (*e.g.*, fuel, light, water, &c.), is transferred to an office where he has not such quarters or allowances, or where such officer is about to retire on a pension or retiring allowance, the Public Service Board shall, after due inquiry, fix the value of such quarters and allowances, and the value so fixed shall be added to the officer's salary for the purpose of computing the amount of his salary in his new office or of his pension or retiring allowance, as the case may be.

AS TO ALLOWANCES IN REMOTE LOCALITIES.

Allowances may be made to officers stationed in localities where the necessaries of life are exceptionally dear, according to the proportions and not exceeding the rates following:—

*Power of Disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange all or any part of such land, subject to the approval of the Bishop of Melbourne for the time being, or, during the absence of the Bishop from the Diocese, or the vacancy of the See, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs thereof. The land until otherwise disposed of to be used for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

*Purposes to which proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.*—To such purposes of the Church of England as may be agreed upon by (1) the Bishop, or, during his absence from his See, or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the Diocese; (2) the trustees; and (3) the minister entitled to officiate in or occupy any building upon the land.

\* The further reduction for unrecorded departures was made so as to accord with the general basis adopted, which was framed on the actual experience of the intercensal period 1881-91. It is, however, believed that the proportion of unrecorded departures has not been so great since as it was before 1891, and that the next Census will prove the population, as above shown, to be understated by fully 15,000.

During the year 1899, the registered births numbered 31,068, and the registered deaths 10,578, which resulted in a natural increase of 14,430, as shown in the table. This was higher than the natural increase in 1898—when the mortality was exceptionally high—by 2,953, but lower than that in 1897 by 1,754. The births, although 836 more than in 1898, have fallen off slightly as compared with 1897, but considerably since 1893; whereas the deaths, although 2,117 fewer than in 1898, were more numerous than in any other of the preceding seven years.

The recorded arrivals (gross) by sea numbered 85,384, and the recorded departures 86,947, and thus the apparent net loss by emigration was 1,563—consisting of 81 males and 1,482

females—which was considerably less than in any of the preceding seven years, when it varied from 3,890 in 1893 to about 7,700 in 1895, with the exception of one year (1896), when it rose to over 14,500. Adding to the apparent loss by emigration, the usual allowance for unrecorded departures, the actual net loss would appear to have been 9,015, viz., 5,669 males and 3,346 females, as shown in the table.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) to the end of 1899, the usual allowance made for unrecorded departures has been 61,944, viz., 50,214 for males and 14,730 for females; but, in addition to this, the Conference of Statisticians held in Sydney further increased the unrecorded departures by 17,478—to accord with the experience of the last intercensal period, 1881-91. As stated in the note *supra*, however, it is believed that such further allowance for defective returns of emigration will prove unnecessary, although for the sake of uniformity the reduction had to be made.

The records of migration by sea for the year—taking them for what they are worth—show a balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales of 451, from Western Australia of 104, from Tasmania of 402, from other British Dominions of 153, and from Foreign Ports of 1,021; but a balance in favour of emigration to Queensland of 1,483, to South Australia of 213, to New Zealand of 1,138, to South Seas of 384, to United Kingdom of 278, and to South Africa of 198. So long as it is the practice to include persons merely passing through Victorian ports *en route* both as immigrants and emigrants, no correct indication can be obtained of the migration as between Victoria and other countries individually. Queensland and New South Wales, on the other hand, adopt the more correct principle of omitting from the returns all persons who do not embark or disembark in the colony.

The recorded net emigration to Western Australia—not only from Victoria, but practically from the whole of Eastern Australasia—during the last ten years was as follows:—786 in 1890, 1,900 in 1891, 1,714 in 1892, 2,235 in 1893, 10,145 in 1894, 11,127 in 1895, 24,497 in 1896, 11,163 in 1897, 817 in 1898, and 101 in 1899; and that to South Africa in the last five years was as follows:—1,483 in 1895, 2,831 in 1896, 746 in 1897, 130 in 1898, and 198 in 1899. In 1899, however, there would have been a net influx of about 480 persons from South Africa only for the circumstance that 625 members of the Australian Military Contingents, bound for the Transvaal, were included in the departures during the last quarter of the year, viz., 250 from Victoria, 250 from New South Wales, and 125 from Tasmania.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

**VITAL STATISTICS.**

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1900.

THE births of 57 boys and 47 girls, or in all of 104 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of February. Of these 43 occurred in Ballarat East, 57 in Ballarat West, and 4 in Sebastopol; included were 7 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 135, viz., 72 of boys and 63 of girls.

The deaths registered in February numbered 83, viz., 40 of males and 43 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 21. In January, the recorded deaths numbered 120; in February, 1899, they numbered 74; in February, 1898, they numbered 96; in February, 1897, they numbered 109; in February, 1896, they numbered 81; in February, 1895, they numbered 95; in February, 1894, they numbered 86; in February, 1893, they numbered 92; in February, 1892, they numbered 80; in February, 1891, they numbered 91; and in February, 1890, they numbered 71.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Eighteen deaths, or 22 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 10; Benevolent Asylum, 5; Gaol, 1; Lunatic Asylum, 2.

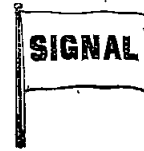

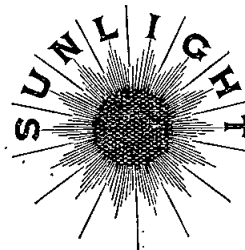

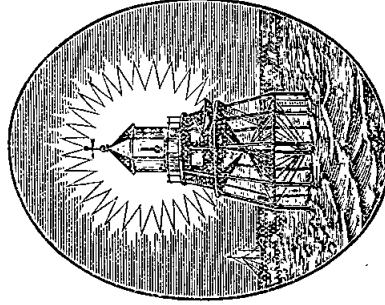

**WARNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATION No. 9.**

**T**HE Warnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water district has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided. Payment in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—
  - 1st. The stand enclosure.
  - 2nd. The remainder of the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, gates, seats, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in this reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the 1st and 2nd divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for racing shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult to the 1st division such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence: for admission of every adult to the 2nd division, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of lands comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

**CITY OF HAWTHORN.**

By-Law No. 46.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 46, for regulating and governing the drivers or riders of vehicles called bicycles, tricycles, velocipedes, or motor cars.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Council of the City of Hawthorn hereby orders as follows, that is to say:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "Machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, or motor car.
2. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, during the hours between sunset and sunrise, shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to such machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted, and kept lighted, as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
3. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers, provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.
4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the left-hand side of the carriage way, and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, machine, or other vehicle (except a tram car), or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such machine to the right of such vehicle, or horse, or other beast of burden, and any person overtaking with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse, or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage way, such person shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, machine, or other vehicle, or such horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.
5. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine along or across any street, or any public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven, ridden, or impelled.
6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
