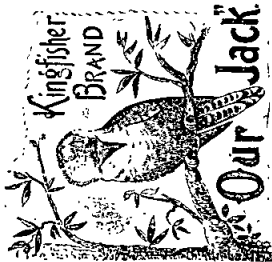

The Board has power to grant, subject to such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, authority to the owner or occupier of any allotment to cut a drain through any adjoining allotment without making compensation to the owner or occupier thereof, such drain to run parallel with and within 10 links (approximately 6½ feet), where practicable, of a boundary line of such allotment.

On payment of deposit or rent, together with fees, a permit to occupy will forthwith issue.

Care should be taken by the applicant that he secures the correct form, and that it is properly filled up.

The births of 943 children, viz., 505 boys and 438 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. The number was, with one exception, February, 1899, the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years; and was as much as 339 below the average of the higher level prevailing in the first four, but only 26 below that of the lower level prevailing in the last six, years of that period. The number was, moreover, 171 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 204 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in February numbered 495, viz., 275 of males and 220 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 448, or by 91 per cent., as against 52 per cent. in February, 1899, and 68 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 111 smaller than in February, 1899, and the lowest recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1897; it was 249 below the average of the first four, but 112 lower than the average of the last six years of the decade, whilst it was 167 below the average of the whole period, or 187 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.72 and of deaths registered to 13.51 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 25.59 and 16.82 respectively, and during the last ten years of 31.08 and 18.52 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 104.0° on the 4th, and the lowest was 47.0° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (65.9°) was 1.7° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.9°) took place on the 6th, and the least range (3.1°) on the 11th. The mean daily range was 22.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.219 inches on the 8th, and the lowest was 29.427 inches on the 15th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.929 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on three days, the amount being .46 of an inch, which was lower than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except 1891, 1893, and 1894, and only two-fifths of the average during that period. The mean humidity of the month was .618.

Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 37 per cent. in February, 1899; 44 per cent. in February, 1898; 34 per cent. in February, 1897; 42 per cent. in February, 1896; 40 per cent. in February, 1895; and 40 per cent. in February, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 120, as compared with 162 in February, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality per 1,000 births registered was as low as 127 in the month under review, as compared with 176 in February, 1899; 238 in February, 1898; 134 in February, 1897; 203 in February, 1896; 171 in February, 1895; 156 in February, 1894; 220 in February, 1893; 184 in February, 1892; 227 in February, 1891; and 210 in February, 1890.

Forty persons—as against 52 in February, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a baker, aged 75, died of cancer; a male, of no occupation, aged 75, of anæmia; four females, each aged 75, of apoplexy, heart disease, hernia, and abscess of kidney respectively; a town clerk, aged 76, of bronchitis; an engineer, aged 76, of enteritis; a herbalist, aged 76, of hæmorrhage on the brain, caused by a fall down stairs; a hat manufacturer, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a stonemason, aged 78, of dysentery; a labourer, aged 78, of apoplexy; a female, aged 78, of dyspepsia; a gentleman, aged 79, of effusion on the brain; a male, of no occupation, aged 79, of enteritis; a female, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 81, of appendicitis; two females, aged 82 and 83 respectively, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a farmer, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a labourer, aged 85, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 86, of cystitis; a female, aged 86, of renal disease; a female, aged 87, of cancer; another, aged 89, of syncope; another, aged 90, of bronchitis; a clerk, aged 75, two females, each aged 76, a millwright, aged 78, a cabinet-maker, a painter, and two females, each aged 80, a female, aged 81, and a carter and a male of no occupation, each aged 87, of old age.

Thirty of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 21 in February, 1899—were from external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A tinsmith, aged 25, a shunter, aged 33, and a plumber, aged 34, were passed over by railway trains; a boy, aged 10, by a waggon; a grocer, aged 30, by a mutton truck; and a labourer, aged 50, by a cart; a female, aged 28, died of Potts' fracture, the result of a fall from a bicycle; a herbalist, aged 76, of hæmorrhage on the brain, caused by a fall downstairs; a quarryman, aged 44, of injuries to the skull, consequent on a fall down a quarryhole; a painter, aged 31, of injuries caused by falling from a ladder; a seaman, aged 37, of injuries, the result of a fall between a ship and the pier; a labourer, aged 37, of injuries received whilst removing bags of sugar; a boy, aged 5, of fracture of the skull, and a seaman, aged 34, of fracture of the spine, the result of falls; two male children, aged 1 year and 5 years respectively, of scalds; a male child, aged 12 months, and a female, aged 63, of heat apoplexy; a boy, aged 8, was drowned in a clayhole at Brunswick, whilst fishing for crayfish; three persons were drowned whilst bathing, viz.—A messenger, aged 12, in the River Yarra, a boy, aged 16, in the Saltwater River, and a police constable, aged 44, in Hobson's Bay; a gardener, aged 71, was "found drowned" in the River Yarra, and a draper, aged 59, in Hobson's Bay; and a male infant, aged 1 month, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 23, who died of septic peritonitis following abortion, a verdict of wilful murder being returned; also a new-born male infant, who was found dead from suffocation (probably murdered). The suicidal deaths were those of a painter, aged 68, who shot himself; a gold miner, aged 34, who cut his throat; and a publican, aged 56, who poisoned himself with carbolic acid.

One hundred and eight deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne, 13 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 5 in the Women's, 10 in the Children's, 5 in the Homœopathic, and 8 in the Austin Hospitals; 5 in the Metropolitan and 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 3 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylums; and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 150, or 73 fewer than in February, 1899, of which 86, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 64, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 120 (or 42 fewer than in February, 1899) were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 2 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 345, or 38 less than in February, 1899. Of these 189, or 55 per cent., were males, and 156, or 45 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 38 were between seventy and seventy-five, 20 were between seventy-five and eighty, 12 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 was ninety.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one of the previous year, deaths from zymotic diseases fell off by 42 or by one-half, those from local diseases by 45 or by one-seventh, those from constitutional diseases by 16, of developmental diseases by 7 (nearly all under the head of "old age"), and of ill-defined causes (chiefly debility, &c.) by 8; whereas those from violence (chiefly fractures, &c.), increased by 9. Under the class, zymotic diseases, deaths from whooping cough fell from 21 to 2, those from typhoid fever from 25 to 10, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 24 to 14. Under the local class, there was also a decrease in deaths from diseases of the nervous system from 57 to 43, in those from diseases of the circulatory system from 50 to 42, of the respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.) from 44 to 31, and of the digestive system from 116 to 89; but, on the other hand, those from diseases of the urinary system rose from 21 to 32. Under the constitutional class, cancer shows a reduction in the mortality from 32 to 26, tubercular meningitis from 10 to 3, and tubercular diseases (scrofula, &c.) from 10 to 6.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first two months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.
