The births of 943 children, viz., 505 boys and 438 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. The number was, with one exception, February, 1899, the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years; and was as much as 389 below the average of the higher level prevailing in the first four, but only 26 below that of the lower level prevailing in the last six, years of that period. The number was, moreover, 171 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 204 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in February numbered 495, viz., 275 of males and 220 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 448, or by 91 per cent., as against 52 per cent. in February, 1899, and 64 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 111 smaller than in February, 1899, and the lowest recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1897; it was 249 below the average of the first four, but 112 lower than the average of the last six years of the decade, whilst it was 167 below the average of the whole period, or 187 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.72 and of deaths registered to 18.51 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 25.59 and 16.82 respectively, and during the last ten years of 31.08 and 18.52 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

Under the local class, there was also a decrease in deaths from diseases of the nervous system from 57 to 45, in those from diseases of the circulatory system from 50 to 42, of the respiratory system (bronchitis, pneumonia, &c.) from 44 to 31, and of the digostive system from 116 to 89; but, on the other hand, those from diseases of the urinary system rose from 21 to 32. Under the constitutional class, cancer shows a reduction in the mortality from 32 to 26, tubercular meningilis from 10 to 3, and tubercular diseases (scrotlua, &c.) from 10 to 6.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first two months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.
