Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

BY-LAW No. 1/99.

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 1/99, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rutherglen order as follows:—

1. That this by-law shall apply to the following areas:—

(a) Area east of Rutherglen Borough embracing all the land lying between the eastern boundary of the said borough and a road extending in a northerly direction from the three-chain road north of allotment 1A, section 45, parish of Carlyle, as far northward as the north-west angle of allotment 11, section 42, in the same parish; also allotments 1A, 1, 2, and 12 of section 45; also allotments 1, 2, the frontage three chains in depth on the west side of J. Fortune's licensed holding 237/65, allotments 3, 4, and 10 of section 45A, in the same parish.

(b) Such portions of the Wahgunyah pre-emptive right as are included within the following boundaries, viz.:—Beginning at a point on the south side of Barkly-street situated at the north-east angle of the Wahgunyah railway yard; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the said yard to Victoria-street; thence westerly along said street to the north-east angle of allotment 3, section V; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said allotment; thence westerly to Main-street; thence southerly by said street to Dennison-street; thence westerly by said street to Traton-street; thence northerly by the last-mentioned street to Blanche-street; thence westerly by Blanche-street to Sunday Creek; thence northerly and easterly by said creek and the Murray River to the north-eastern angle of the allotment occupied by Webster's mill; thence southerly by the eastern side of said allotment to Mill-street; thence easterly by Mill-street and Barkly-street to the point of commencement.

2. The system of removing the contents of closet pans will be the day service known as the double-pan service, and the pans and covers used in making the removals will be provided by the Council.

3. Once in every week the persons contracted with by the Council shall remove the pans in use, and shall leave thoroughly cleansed ones in their place.

4. No owner or occupier of premises shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of closet pans or their contents, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person

or persons save and except the person or persons appointed in that behalf by the Council, and such pans and their contents shall be removed by the contractor at such times and in such manner as the Council may from time to time direct.

5. Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

6. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for the double-man service herein provided, and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

7. For the use of each pan supplied, and for the removal and disposal of its contents, each owner or occupier shall pay to the Council monthly, and in advance, such sum as the Council may from time to time fix.

8. If any owner or occupier require his or her closet pan emptied oftener than once a week, he or she may, at his or her own cost, arrange with the contractor to empty such pan or pans at a rate not exceeding Ninepence per pan for each such extra occasion. If any householder shall require his or her closet pan to be specially emptied at any time, and shall give notice at the office of the Council, and deposit One shilling and sixpence to defray the cost per pan thereof, the contractor shall, within 24 hours of the notice being given, thoroughly empty and cleanse such pan or pans.

9. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF HOWQUA.

BY-LAW No. 1.

THE Council of the Shire of Howqua, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, in the Colony of Victoria, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1899*, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 1 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. All occupiers of houses or premises shall provide boxes or other receptacles for the temporary deposit of all house refuse, and no such refuse shall be swept, deposited, or emptied into any street, drain, or gutter running into any open channel of any street.

5. The occupier of any premises shall within 24 hours from the service of notice by an inspector remove all refuse so temporarily deposited as aforesaid, as also any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, and soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, shed, or place whatsoever to the depot provided by the said council for that purpose, and in case of the occupier neglecting to comply with such notice the council may itself carry out such removal at the expense of the occupier.

6. All earth-closets, privies, cesspools, and places for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter shall be emptied, cleansed, and disinfected at such times so that the same shall always be clean and in no ways a nuisance or injurious to health. Provided that the contents of any cesspool, closet, privy, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that such contents shall not be removed until such have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect same.

7. All buildings or structures or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water

or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any such buildings or structures.

8. All buildings or structures or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be regularly swept and kept perfectly clean, and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. No pigs shall be kept in any sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered by any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or allowed to wander in any public thoroughfare or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to public health.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and contents thereof and emptying and cleansing the same. Every such pan shall be of galvanized iron or other approved material properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and provided with suitable and sufficient handles, and shall always be kept in good repair. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of such trade shall forthwith report, in writing, to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered or not registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of the council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its continuation has ceased.

13. If any occupier or owner neglect or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this by-law, by neglecting or failing to remove any nuisance as hereinbefore stated, such nuisance may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier or owner.

14. In the interpretation of this by-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

15. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and every inspector of the council shall and is hereby empowered to take proceedings against any person offending against any by-law of the council, as provided by section 37 of the *Health Act 1899*.

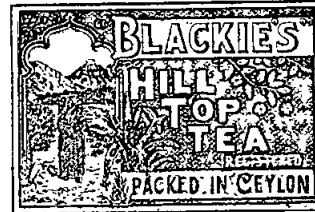

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1900 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 20.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum, upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Nine pounds annual municipal value and under the sum of Ten shillings sterling.
4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value and upwards an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than One pound sterling.
5. For every water trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.
6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows :—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carrier's stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July, 1900, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

4. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the 1st day of January, 1900, and one moiety on the 1st day of July, 1900.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1900, commencing on the 1st January, 1900; and terminating on the 31st December, 1900, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are inscribed on the municipal roll of the City of Ballarat has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd day of November, 1899, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the City of Ballarat aforesaid, and, in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth hereby subdivide the said city into three separate wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of nine members be elected accordingly.

NORTH WARD.

Commencing at a point at the intersection of Sturt and Grenville streets; thence north along Grenville-street to the Yarrowee Creek; thence continuing north along the Yarrowee Creek to Havelock-street; thence continuing north along Havelock-street to Gregory-street; thence west along Gregory-street to the western boundary of the city; thence south along the western boundary of the city to Carlton-street; thence east along Carlton-street to Wendouree-parade; thence continuing east along Wendouree-parade to Webster-street; thence continuing east along Webster-street to Market-street; thence south-easterly by that street to Armstrong-street; thence south along Armstrong-street to Sturt-street; thence east along Sturt-street to the starting point.
