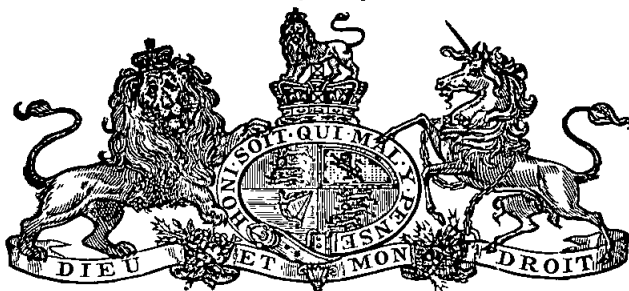

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Rochester;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Warrnambool,* and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Heyfield, Maffra, and Warrnambool;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MAY NEXT, as a Bank Holiday at Elmore;

THURSDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF MAY NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Clunes;

FRIDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF MAY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bright.
