Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO FIX THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES OF PAYMENT FOR BREAD MAKING OR BAKING.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment for bread making or baking has made the following determination, namely:—

1. That the determination made by the Board and dated the 15th March, 1897, be cancelled and annulled.
2. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person for bread making or baking shall be Twelvence halfpenny per hour, or Two pounds ten shillings for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.
3. That the number of apprentices who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the bread making or baking trade shall be one apprentice to every three persons or fraction of three persons receiving the minimum wage of Twelvence halfpenny per hour. Provided that only one apprentice may be employed to every five persons receiving the minimum wage of Twelvence halfpenny per hour if an improver is working in the same factory.
4. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to such apprentices shall be as follows:—

First year, 5s. per week of 48 hours;
Second year, 7s. 6d. " "
Third year, 10s. " "
Fourth year 15s. " "

and thereafter Twelvence halfpenny per hour, or £2 10s. per week of 48 hours.

5. That the number of improvers who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the breadmaking trade shall be one improver to every five persons receiving the minimum wage of Twelvence halfpenny per hour as determined by the Board.
6. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to such improvers shall be as follows:—

First year, 5s. per week of 48 hours;
Second year, 7s. 6d. " "
Third year, 10s. " "
Fourth year, 15s. " "

and thereafter Twelvence halfpenny per hour, or £2 10s. per week of 48 hours.

7. That any male person over the age of sixteen years who may be employed in bread making or baking for more than 48 hours per week shall be paid for such extra hours *pro rata* rates, and in addition the sum of Threepence per hour.
8. That the above determination shall come into force from and after the nineteenth day of May, 1900.

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW No. 50.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Town of Brighton in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said town for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

No person shall carry on the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman or purveyor of milk within the jurisdiction of the Council of the Town of Brighton, unless and until such person cause himself to be registered with the said council.

Each applicant for registration under this by-law shall in each year sign and forward to the Town Clerk of the said council an application for registration in the form hereunder written, adapted to meet the circumstances of each case, and shall pay or cause to be paid to the said council a fee of ten shillings.

Unless otherwise expressly provided, every registration shall cease and determine on the 31st day of the month of January next following the date when such registration was effected.

Application for registration as

To the Town Clerk of the Town of Brighton.

Sir, I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

Name in full

Whether registration is desired in respect of the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, purveyor of milk. Purveyor of milk (who is not registered as a cow-keeper or dairyman under this by-law) style or firm under which trade is to be carried on.

Every place (if any) within the jurisdiction of the council at which the applicant keeps cows or has a dairy. Every shop,

store, or other building (if any) within the jurisdiction of the council occupied or used by the applicant for the purveying of milk other than the place where the applicant keeps cows or has a dairy.

Where applicant carries on the trade of a purveyor of milk, and is not registered under this by-law as a cow-keeper or dairyman or as a purveyor of milk, in conjunction with either of those trades, the manner and mode in which he proposes to carry on such trade.

Upon the receipt of every such application and fee the Town Clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose.

If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and to a further penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings (20s.) for each day during which such breach is committed.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages; free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken; or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The supplies to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

4. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct; not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

5. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

6. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies; accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

8. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.

11. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

13. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15.
