(a) Of receiving neglected and destitute children in the colony of Victoria, or those in danger of becoming so, and of providing for their physical, moral, and spiritual welfare.

(b) Of employing and paying a person or persons as the agent or agents of the said society, who shall, so far as possible, visit once a year all the children under the care of the said society.

(c) Of establishing, maintaining, and supporting, in such place or places as the committee or governing body for the time being of the said society may deem most suitable, a receiving home or homes in which neglected and destitute children may be committed to the care of the society or of the said agent or agents, and may be lodged or cared for under the supervision and control of the committee or governing body for the time being of that society, and of providing therein, so far as the funds of the society will allow, skilled nursing and attendance for such children.

(d) Of having such children committed to the charge of the said society or its said agent or agents, duly empowered in that behalf under the provisions of section 61 of the *Neglected Children's Act 1890*.

(e) Of transferring neglected and destitute children so committed to the care of the society or its agent or agents as aforesaid to suitable homes in the country or elsewhere.

3. That the pamphlets accompanying this petition set out the names of the office bearers and ladies' committee and council of the said society, and also the fourth annual report and balance-sheet of the said society, and the rules under which the society has hitherto been carried on.

4. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society is an institution, society, or association established for the relief of destitute persons, and having for its objects the promotion of morality and the prevention of vice within the meaning of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

5. That such society is supported by the voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than One pound per annum for the support thereof.

6. That the persons signing this petition are 25 of such contributors.

Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency will be pleased, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the said *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, to declare the contributors for the time being to such society to be and continue politic and corporate, under the style and title of The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society, and to have perpetual succession and a common seal.

And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.

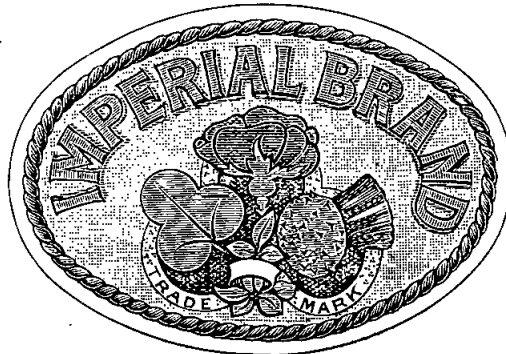

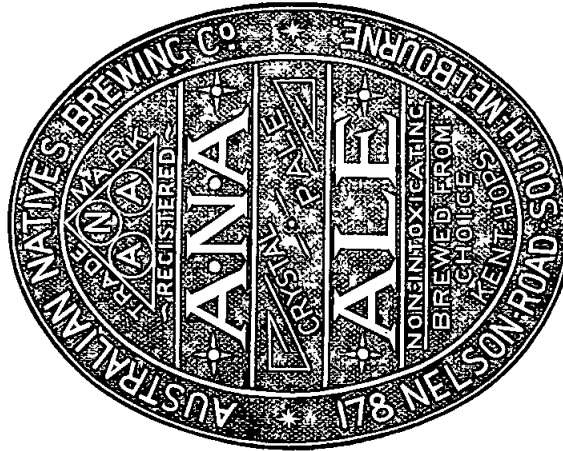

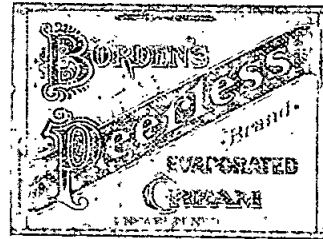

- “(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act.”

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts,

and known as the Colac and Beech Forest Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz:—

1. First meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.

2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.

3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least four members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of three members, exclusive of the Chairman.

4. Chairmen.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice paper for such meeting.

Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district and be willing to act.

6. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

7. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

8. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

9. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

10. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

11. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

13. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

14. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

15. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

16. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

17. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

18. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

19. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

20. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

21. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

22. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

23. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

24. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

25. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

26. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

27. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

28. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

29. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

30. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

31. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

32. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

33. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

34. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

36. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

37. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

38. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

39. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to

protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

40. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

41. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

43. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

44. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

45. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

46. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

47. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

48. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay to the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

49. Appointment, &c., of Officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

50. Salaries of Officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

52. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

53. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

54. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Alfred Richard Outhim, Her Majesty's Minister of Railways for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE CYANIDE PATENTS PURCHASE ACT 1900.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of May, 1900.

WHEREAS by the *Cyanide Patents Purchase Act 1900* (63 Vict. No. 1648), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such regulations as he deems necessary in order to give full effect to anything which by the said Act is expressed to be prescribed or to otherwise carry out the purposes of the said Act, and in and by such regulations he may impose a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for any breach thereof, and that all such regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

- In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, words importing the masculine gender shall be taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular.
In the case of a licensee being a company, "his" and "him" respectively shall include "its" and "it" respectively.
The word "Act" shall mean the *Cyanide Patents Purchase Act 1900*.
The word "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Mines for the time being, or the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Act.
- Every application for a licence shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the First Schedule hereto.
- Every licence shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto.
- The royalty payable in respect of all gold and all silver won or gained in connexion with the use or employment of the inventions and patent rights the subject of the Act shall be at the rate of Two pounds ten shillings sterling per centum on the value of the gold or silver won and recovered from any ores, tailings, or compounds by the application of the inventions or either of them, either alone or in conjunction with any other invention or process.
- The royalty on the value of the gold and of the silver recovered by the use or employment of the inventions or either of them as hereinbefore provided shall be payable to the Treasurer at the Receipt and Pay Office, Melbourne, or at such other Receipt and Pay Office elsewhere as the Treasurer may from time to time appoint, on the first day of every calendar month, for the gold and silver recovered during the calendar month immediately preceding.
- Every licensee shall at all times keep or cause to be kept full, correct, and true books, accounts, and records of the quantity of ore, tailings, and compounds treated by him, and of the quantity of gold and silver recovered therefrom, and of the value, and of the sale or disposition of such gold and silver, and shall, at the beginning of each and every calendar month, furnish or cause to be furnished to the Minister a true and correct statement abstracted from such books, accounts, and records of the work performed and the results obtained during the preceding calendar month, verified by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Third Schedule hereto.
- Every licensee, from time to time, if and when required by the Minister, shall furnish or cause to be furnished to the Minister all information reasonably necessary to check or verify the accuracy of any statement furnished by or on behalf of the licensee, or of any statutory declaration verifying the same, and will at all reasonable times permit the Minister, or any officer or agent as such Minister may at any time appoint for that purpose, either generally or in any particular case, to inspect and take extracts from or make copies of all books, accounts, records, assay certificates, and other documents relating to the licensee's business so far as the same are connected with or incidental to the treatment of ores, tailings, or compounds by means of the inventions or either of them, either alone or in conjunction with any other invention or process, and the recovery of gold and of silver thereby, and the sale or disposition of such gold or silver.
- Every licensee shall at all reasonable times permit the Minister, or any officer or agent as aforesaid, to enter and be upon every part of the licensee's works and premises where any tailings, ores, or compounds intended for treatment, or which have been treated, are stacked, stored, or deposited, or where any process connected with the treatment of any ores, tailings, or compounds, or of any gold or silver therefrom, or the use of the inventions or either of them, either alone or in conjunction with any other invention or process, is to be or is or has been carried on, and to make and take away any notes and observations, and to take any samples and extracts for testing and assaying, and to make any assays and trials as to the Minister, officer, or agent shall appear necessary for testing the accuracy of any statement, declaration, or information furnished by or on behalf of the licensee, and for testing and analyzing the quality of any tailings, ores, or compounds intended to be treated, or which are under treatment, or which have been treated by such inventions or either of them as aforesaid, and of any gold or silver the result of such treatment, and for testing the efficiency and thoroughness of the work and manipulation of the licensee.
- No licensee shall cede, assign, or underlet his rights under any licence granted under the Act or these regulations.
- In the event of any licensee failing or neglecting to observe or perform any of the requirements of his licence, or of these or of any other regulations for the time being in force under the provisions of the Act, or in the event of his failing or neglecting to pay in the manner required by his licence the royalty payable hereunder within a period of twenty-eight days from the due date for the payment of the same, the Minister may forthwith revoke such licence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything theretofore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber which, at a height of 3 feet from the surface of the ground, is of a less diameter than 12 inches, on or from the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Argyll, Carngham, Clarkesdale, Commeralghip, Dereel, Lynchfield, Scarsdale, Smythesdale, and Warrambine.—(99.F.13254.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

CITY OF HAWTHORN.
REGULATION No. 17.

Regulation of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Hawthorn, made under clause 2 of Part 4 of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, adopted by By-law No. 45, for the proper management and control of the Hawthorn Public Library.

THAT in pursuance of and in exercise of the several powers and authorities to them given by the provisions of clause 2 of Part 4 of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Council of the City of Hawthorn do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. The public library belonging to and under the control of the said council shall be subject to the supervision and directions of the Town Hall Committee of the said council, acting by and through the town clerk of the said city.
2. The said library shall be open to the public every evening, except when the committee shall otherwise direct, between the hours of Seven o'clock p.m. and Ten o'clock p.m., or such other hours as the committee may direct.
3. Any ratepayer of Hawthorn, satisfying the librarian of same, or any other person, being a resident, having reached the age of fifteen years, who shall deliver to the librarian a guarantee signed by two such ratepayers, may borrow books from the lending library.
4. All books borrowed must be returned within fourteen days, and all magazines borrowed must be returned within three days, and in case of loss or damage, the borrower or his guarantor or guarantors must replace the book, or pay to the librarian the value of any book, set or series, lost or damaged, within one week of the date on which the injury has been notified to him. The committee shall be sole judge of the value of any book, set or series, lost, or of any damage done.
5. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the library nor exchange them with each other.
6. Borrowers ceasing to use the library are required to return their tickets to the librarian, in order to have them cancelled, as, until the tickets are returned, borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.
7. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify the change to the librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets.
8. Borrowers who have lost their tickets are required to give immediate notice, in writing, to the librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.
9. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time, unless the committee direct otherwise.
10. No person shall write in or upon or mark or fold down any leaf of any book or document, or deface, mutilate, or in any manner injure the same.
11. Borrowers finding any books written on, or mutilated, are required to report the fact to the librarian.
12. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.
13. The librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the lending library, or who is not entitled for any other reason to be intrusted with books.
14. No person shall be allowed to take any book into or out of other than those belonging to the library.
15. Every person removing any book or document from its place in the library shall replace the same before leaving the library.
16. No person shall use any ink within the library except by express permission of the librarian.
17. No male person shall wear his hat within the library except by express permission of the librarian.
18. No person shall shift any article of furniture, or any map, chart, or drawing placed in or hung upon the walls of the library or its precincts.
19. Every person visiting the library shall enter his true name and address in "The Visitors' Book."
20. No person under the age of 14 years shall at any time enter or remain within the library except by permission of the librarian.
21. No person shall stand or place his feet upon any chair or table in the library.
22. No person shall smoke any tobacco or other substance, or shall ignite any match or other article or thing, within the library or its precincts, or any approach thereto.
23. No person shall spit upon the floor of the library, or upon any of the property of the council therein.
24. No person shall interfere with any gas jet or pipes within the library or its precincts.
25. No person shall allow any water to overflow in any lavatory basin, nor commit any nuisance therein, nor allow the water from any tap to continue running after using such tap.
26. No person shall remain, or attempt to remain, within the library after the appointed time for closing it.
27. No person shall enter or remain in the library who is not decently attired and cleanly in person in the opinion and judgment of the librarian, or the person for the time being in charge of the library.
28. Subject to the directions from time to time of the Town Hall Committee the librarian of the said council, or the person for the time being in charge of the said library, shall be charged with the carrying into effect of this regulation.
29. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this regulation may be forthwith removed from the library by the librarian, or the person for the time being in charge of the

library, or any officer of the council, and such removal shall not prejudice or affect any proceedings against such person for so offending.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 44.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under section 48 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 44, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections, and authorizing the council to pull down and remove buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to such by-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under such by-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees or penalties due by the owner thereon, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes, or some of them.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1891*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. In this by-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith "Hoardings" shall include any building or erection, any part of which shall be at a distance less than 50 feet from any street, and of a height greater than 7 feet measured from the actual level of the footpath of any street within 50 feet from any part of such building or erection, except any house, room, or office, but shall not include any fence erected in a street in connexion with building operations. "Council" shall mean the council of the city of Hawthorn. "Street" shall include any public or private street, road, right-of-way, lane, or thoroughfare. "Town clerk" shall mean the town clerk for the time being of the city of Hawthorn. "Person" shall include a corporation, and the singular shall include the plural, and the plural the singular.
2. This by-law shall be in force and take effect in and throughout the whole of the city of Hawthorn.
3. No person shall build, erect, or construct, or cause or permit to be built, erected, or constructed any hoarding, except in accordance with the following Regulations:—
 - (a) Every hoarding which does not exceed 16 feet in height, measured from the level of the nearest adjoining footpath to the highest part of such hoarding, may be built or erected on the building line of any street.
 - (b) Every hoarding which exceeds 16 feet in height, measured from the level of the nearest footpath to the highest part of such hoarding, shall not be built nearer to the building line of any street, passage, or thoroughfare than a distance equal to 1 foot in excess of the height of such hoarding.
 - (c) Every hoarding shall be constructed of wood, or wood and iron; that is to say, the base of every hoarding shall consist of sound redgum blocks, measuring 4 inches by 4 inches in cross section, and sunk in the ground 2 feet at the least, and remaining 3 inches above the ground to fix the posts at a greater distance apart from centre to centre than 4 feet. Upon the redgum blocks hereinbefore referred to, there is to be, well secured by means of nails or screws, a sill of hardwood measuring in section 4 inches by 3 inches and of the longest lengths obtainable; where it is necessary to have such sill in more than one piece, each piece shall be joined to its adjoining piece over one of the redgum blocks hereinbefore referred to by means of a half-lapped joint, 4 inches in length, and well secured by nails or screws.
 - (d) The sill hereinbefore referred to shall be mortised quite through; the said mortise shall measure 2 inches by 2 inches square cut, and not more than 3 feet apart from the centre of one mortise to the centre of the next adjoining mortise.
 - (e) The upright posts or studs shall be of sound hardwood timber, measuring in cross-section 4 inches by 2 inches and shall be tenoned at the bottom to fit the mortises, but in the sill hereinbefore referred to, and shall be tenoned at the top to fit the mortises in the top plate hereinafter referred to.
 - (f) The top plate shall be of sound hardwood, measuring in cross-section 4 inches by two inches, and shall be mortised quite through; every such mortise shall measure 2 inches by 1 inch square cut and shall correspond with the mortises in the sill.
 - (g) The sill studs and top plate are to be well framed and braced, and all joints to fit tight and be well secured by nails or screws.
 - (h) The studs are to be covered on the side facing the nearest street with good sound boards at least 1 inch thick securely nailed or iron, and around the margin of the hoarding there is to be secured a cap. If it is desired to face any hoarding or the framework thereof with sheet iron, it shall be lawful to do so either by securing the iron to a cross-boarded backing previously well secured to the framework, or by securing the iron to hardwood battens, measuring 3 inches wide on the face by 1 inch thick, and placed horizontally 1 ft. 6 in. apart measuring from centre to centre, and secured by means of 3-in. wire nails to each of the upright studs. The iron is to be secured by means of 1½-in. iron clouts.

- (i) Every hoarding in addition to being constructed as herebefore described shall be supported by means of sound hardwood stays, measuring in cross-section 4 inches by 2 inches; each stay shall be secured by means of an iron bolt $\frac{1}{2}$ in. in diameter to a point in each stud 2ft. 6in. below the top plate, and the lower end of every such stay shall be secured by a redgum block measuring 4 inches by 3 inches in cross-section, and sunk in the ground not less than 3 feet in depth and at a distance from the base of the hoarding equal to the height where the said stay is attached to such hoarding, and every such stay shall be stiffened by means of a sound hardwood piece measuring 2 inches by 3 inches in cross-section, and one end of which shall be secured to every such stay at a point in the middle of its length by means of a $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter bolt, and the other end of which shall be secured in like manner to each stud immediately above the sill.
- (j) Every person who shall intend to build, erect, or construct, or to cause or permit to be built, erected, or constructed any hoarding, shall first submit a plan and specifications thereof to the town clerk for his approval, and if such plan and specifications shall be in accordance with this by-law, the town clerk shall certify his approval thereof, and retain the same for future reference, and no person shall build, erect, or construct, or cause or permit to be built, erected, or constructed any hoarding, except in strict accordance with the plan and specifications which shall have been so approved.
