#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN MADDEN, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** Her Majesty was graciously pleased by Commission under Her Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Her Majesty's Court, at Saint James's, the first day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, to appoint the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies: And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by Commission under Her Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Saint James's the twenty-ninth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, to appoint me to be, during Her Majesty's pleasure, Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony and its Dependencies, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said office belonging or appertaining, and further, in case of the death, incapacity, or removal of the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony, or of his departure from the said Colony, to authorize and require me to administer the Government thereof: And whereas the said Thomas, Baron Brassey, is now absent from the said Colony: Now therefore I, Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, hereby proclaim that all the powers and authorities granted by the said Letters Patent to the said Thomas, Baron Brassey, and exercised by him as Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, became and are now vested in me as Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony now residing therein, to be by me exercised and enjoyed in accordance with the terms of the aforesaid Letters Patent bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine: and, in Her Majesty's name, I do require and command all officers, civil and military, and all others, the inhabitants of the said Colony of Victoria, to be obedient, aiding and assisting in the exercise of the functions assigned by the respective Letters Patent aforesaid to me as the Officer administering the Government of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at the Government Offices, Melbourne, this fifteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

THURSDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Wedderburn;

WEDNESDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Central and North-West Ridings of the Shire of Tungamah\*;

THURSDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Queenscliff\*;

WEDNESDAY, THE 31ST DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the City of St. Kilda;

SATURDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the North-West Riding of the Shire of Tungamah\*;

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Southern Riding of the Shire of Tungamah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Devenish and Mokoan Ridings of the Shire of Benalla, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Echuca.
