Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO DETERMINE THE LOWEST PRICE OR RATE WHICH MAY BE PAID TO ANY PERSON FOR WHOLLY OR PARTLY PREPARING OR MANUFACTURING, EITHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE A FACTORY OR WORK-ROOM, BOOTS, SHOES, AND SLIPPERS OF EVERY DESCRIPTION.

THE Board has fixed the 4th June, 1900, as the date from which the following determination of the Board shall come into force:—

That the maximum number of hours per week for which the lowest wages, price, or rate fixed by the Board, and set forth in its determination which came into force on the 18th July, 1898, shall be payable to all male employes over the age of sixteen years shall be 48 hours.

That the higher price or rate than those set forth in the determination of the Board which came into force on the 18th July, 1898, as the prices or rates payable for the maximum number of hours per week which shall be paid to any male employe over the age of sixteen years who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be Threepence per hour extra.

GRENVILLE ELECTION.—PETITION.

To the Honorable Francis Conway Mason, The Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of the Colony of Victoria.

The Petition of GEORGE DICK MEUDELL, of 54 Queen-street, Melbourne, in the Colony of Victoria, Sharebroker,

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH :

1. That on the 11th day of April, 1900, an election was held for one Member to serve in this present Parliament in the Legislative Assembly of the Colony of Victoria for the Electoral District of Grenville.

2. That your Petitioner was a candidate at such election.

3. That James Thomas Sadler, of Leaderville, in the Colony of Western Australia, schoolmaster, was the only other candidate at the said election.

4. That, as the result of the said election, the Returning Officer announced that the said James Thomas Sadler had received 1,349 votes, and that your Petitioner had received 687 votes; and the said Returning Officer publicly declared that the said James Thomas Sadler had received the majority of votes, and was duly elected as Member as aforesaid, and made his return accordingly.

5. That your Petitioner has been informed, and believes and now alleges that the said James Thomas Sadler was at the time of the said election incapable of being lawfully elected a Member of the Legislative Assembly, and is incapable of sitting or voting in the said Legislative Assembly by reason of his not having consented in due form under his hand or at all, as is required by law, to the nomination paper naming him as a candidate at the said election, as is necessary in order to render him capable of becoming a candidate for election as a Member of the said Legislative Assembly.

6. That your Petitioner is advised and believes that by reason of the premises the said James Thomas Sadler is not entitled to be declared a duly elected Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Electoral District of Grenville.

Your Petitioner therefore respectfully prays :

That you will communicate the matter of this Petition to the Legislative Assembly of Victoria, in order that the case may be referred to the "Committee of Elections and Qualifications."

That the return of the said Returning Officer be declared void as respects the said James Thomas Sadler.

That it be declared that the said James Thomas Sadler was at the date of such election and now is unqualified to be and disqualified from being so elected or returned as a Member of the said Legislative Assembly of Victoria for the said Electoral District of Grenville, or from sitting or voting as a Member for the said District, and that it be declared that the said James Thomas Sadler was not duly elected or returned.

That in the event of the said James Thomas Sadler being declared not to have been duly elected the return of the said Returning Officer be amended by striking out the name of the said James Thomas Sadler and inserting in the place thereof the name of your Petitioner, and that your Petitioner be declared duly elected as a Member of the said Legislative Assembly of Victoria for the said Electoral District of Grenville.

And that your Petitioner may have such other and further relief as the circumstances of the case may require, or as to the Committee may seem meet.

And your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.
