EXTRADITION TREATY WITH SAN MARINO.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty ondon Gazette, the Queen in Council, dated the 3rd of March, 1900, for giving effect to the Treaty between Her Majesty and March, 1900 San Marino for the mutual extradition of fujerive criminals, signed at Florence on the 16th of October, 1899, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Rome on the 5th of December, 1899. ne London Gazette, 9th March, 1900 (Extract).

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

EXTRADITION TREATY-SAN MARINO.

Windsor, 3rd March, 1900.

At the Court at Windsor, the 3rd day of March, 1900.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord Chancellor Lord President

Lord James of Heroford.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the sixteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, between Her Majesty and the Captains Regent of the Most Serene Republic of San Marino, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and the Most Serene Republic of San Marino, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, the said High Contracting Parties have named as their Planipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, his Excellency Philip Henry Wodehouse, Baron Currie of Hawley, a Member of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of Her Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Her Ambassador Extra-ordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Italy; No. 51.-MAY 18, 1900.-

And the Most Serene Republic of San Marino, his Excellency Cavaliere Paolo Onorato Vigliani, Patrician of San Marino, Grand Cross and Grand Cordon of the Order of Saint Maurice and Saint Lazarus, and of the Crown of Italy, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, &c., &c., Minister of State, ex-President of the Court of Cassation, Senator of the Kingdom of Italy;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

Article I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

Article II.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

- 1. Murder, or attempt, or conspiracy to murder, and manslaughter.
- Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Malicious wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
 Counterfeiting or altering money or uttering counterfeit

 4. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for counterfeiting coin.

 5. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged, counterfeited, or altered.

 6. Embezzlement or larceny.

 9. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzied, or unlawfully obtained

 14. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age, so far as such acts are punishable by the law of the State upon which the demand is made.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted, at the discretion of the State applied to, in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force the crant can be made. force, the grant can be made.

Article III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

Article IV.

The extradition shall not take place, if the person claimed on the part of the British Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of San Marino, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is actually upon his trial, within the territory of the other of the two High Contracting Parties, for the crine for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the British Government, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of San Marino, should be under examination, or be undergoing sentence under a conviction, for any other crime within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of his sentence, or otherwise. acquittal or on expiration of his sentence, or otherwise.

Article V

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

Article VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

Article VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

Article VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made in the following

Application on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty's Government

Application on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty's Government for the surrender of a fugitive criminal in San Marino shall be made by Her Majesty's Consul for the Republic of San Marino. Application on behalf of the Republic of San Marino for the surrender of a fugitive criminal in the United Kingdom shall be made either direct by the Captains Regent or by the Consul of the Republic accredited to the British Government in London. The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the cumpetent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

Article IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

Article X.

If the fugitive has been arrested in the British dominions, he shall forthwith be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him and conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the British dominions.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the British dominions shall adon't as valid evidence the swom depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in San Marino, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of, a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the Republic of San Marino.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the Republic of San Marino, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the Republic of San Marino.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or Judicial document must be authenticated either by the eath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal and legalization of the Republic of San Marino; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law in that part of the British dominions where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

Article XI.

If the ingitive has been arrested in the Republic of San Marino, his surrender shall be granted if, upon examination by a competent authority, it appears that the documents furnished by the British Government contain sufficient prima facte evidence to justify the extradition.

The authorities of the Republic shall admit as valid evidence records drawn up by the British authorities of the depositions of witnesses, or copies thereof, and records of conviction or other judicial documents, or copies thereof: Provided that the said documents be signed or authenticated by an authority whose competence shall be certified by the seal of a Minister of State of Her Britannic Majesty.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting If the individual claimed by one of the two high contracting Parties, in pursuance of the present Treaty, should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

Article XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugutive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper Tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugutive shall be set at liberty.

Article XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered, at the time of his apprehension, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery theroof, be given up when the extradition takes place, and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

Article XVI.

The expenses of arresting, maintaining, and transporting the person whose extradition is applied for, as well as those of handing over and transporting the property and articles, which by the preceding Article, must be restored or given up, shall be borne by the two States within the limits of their respective territories

The expenses of transport or other necessary expenses by sea or through the territories of a third State shall be borne by the demanding State.

Article XVII.

Either of the High Contracting Parties who may wish to have recourse for i purposes of extradition to transit through the territory of a third Power shall be bound to arrange the condi-tion of transit with such third Power.

Article XVIII.

When in a criminal case of a non-political character either of the High Contracting Parties should think it necessary to take the evidence of witnesses residing in the dominions of the other, or to obtain any other legal evidence, a "Commission Rogatoire" to that effect shall be sent through the channel indicated in Article VIII, and effect shall be given thereto conformably to the laws in force in the place where the evidence is to be taken.

Article XIX.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugutive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such Colony or possession as a Consular officer of the Republic of San Marino.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from San Marino who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugutive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

Article XX.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Home as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty in duplicate in English and Italian, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.



Uniform Clothing for the Permanent Force.

Contract from 1st August, 1896, to 30th June, 1901.

(All items to Sample.)

Orders will be issued from time to time for such articles as may be required, and contractor will be bound to complete the orders at the rate of not less than 100 garments every week under each of the contracts.

All the clothing must correspond in every particular with the standard patterns as regards shape, make, and workmanship. Machine sewing to be not less than nine or more than eleven stitches to the inch, and fellings to be seven stitches to the inch. All garments are to be cut full to the sizes, and linings must fit easily. All pipings must show a regular width all round.

All garments for non-commissioned officers and rank and file must be supplied of such sizes as may be demanded on size rolls, and, in the case of tunics, jumpers, and trousers, must conform to the following scales of dimensions.

The Defence Department reserves to itself the right of altering the scales of dimensions from time to time.

The births of 962 children, viz., 495 boys and 467 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. The number was the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1898 and 1899, and was, moreover, 224 below the average of the month during that period, or 260 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in April numbered 518, viz., 296 of males and 222 of females: the births thus exceeded the deaths by 414, or 86 per cent. as against 71 per cent. in April, 1899, and 83 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 39 smaller than in April, 1899, and the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years except in 1897; it was also 131 below the average of April during the last ten years, or 151 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.49 and of deaths registered to 18.19 per annum, as compared with averages of the same mouth in 1899 of 24.70 and 14.42 respectively, and during the last ten years of 30.41 and 17.02 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 74.0° on the 8th, and the lowest was 39.0° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (54.6°) was 41° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.0°) took place on the 8th, and the least range (2.3°) on the 24th. The mean daily range was 12.4°.

The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.298 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.491 inches on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.969) inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on nineteen days, the amount being 4.97 inches, which was higher than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except April, 1890, and 2.58 inches above the average durin

As compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, there was little variation in the mortality under the various classes of diseases. From parasitic and from ill-defined diseases an equal number of deaths was recorded at each period, whilst those from constitutional and developmental diseases showed increases of only 1 and 3 respectively; but there was a reduction of 20 in deaths from symotic diseases, chiefly made up of a decrease of 12 under whooping cough, of 7 under typhoid fever, and of 5 each under influenza and diarrhea, less an increase of 8 under diphtheris, and one of 11 in those from local diseases, chiefly accounted for by a falling off of 34 under diseases of the digestive system (especially enteritis) less an increase of 20 under those of the nervous system; deaths from violence and from dietic diseases also showed decreases of 10 and 2 respectively.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first four months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURES DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1900.

THE births of 62 boys and 55 girls, or in all of 117 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April. Of these 48 occurred in Ballarat East, 65 in Ballarat West, 2 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 100, viz., 54 of boys and 46 of girls.

The deaths registered in April numbered 89, viz., 60 of males and 29 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 28. In March, the recorded deaths numbered 81; in April, 1899, they numbered 67; in April, 1898, they numbered 96; in April, 1897, they numbered 56; in April, 1898, they numbered 71; in April, 1895, they numbered 62; in April, 1894, they numbered 76; in April, 1891, they numbered 81; in April, 1892, they numbered 82; in April, 1891, they numbered 74; and in April, 1890, they numbered 90.

Reserve for Public Recreation in the Borough of Stawell.

THIE Council of the Borough of Stawell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in section 24, Borough of Stawell, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and recipit of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 137 of the Land Act 1890.—

REGULATIONS.

All previous resolutions are hereby repealed.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sumise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding fifty in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for fetes, sports, or shows, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (is.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct; and no society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the reserve without the written consent of the committee of management.

- 3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the reserve, or leave or roll stones therein, or pollute any water in the reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.
- 4. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any misance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing, or any litter.
- 5. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the reserve, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without having first obtained the written permission of the committee of management; and no person shall light any fires in the reserve without the special permission in writing of the committee of management.
- 6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog for coursing or other purposes of sport, or on days on which fetes, sports, or shows are held, and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found therein, shall be liable to be destroyed.
