ST. VINCENT GULF.—APPROACH TO PORT ADELAIDE.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 7, of 1899, masters of vessels and others are hereby informed that the erection of the new Lighthouse on Wonga Shoal, Port Adelaide, will be commenced at an early date, and that during the continuance of the work a temporary riding light will be exhibited between sunset and sunrise from the works in progress on that shoal. It is expected that the new Lighthouse will be completed about January, 1901.

For a period of about one month before the new light is exhibited from Wonga Shoal the existing Port Adelaide illuminating apparatus will be removed from its present position at the entrance to the River. During its transfer to the Wonga Shoal Tower a Light of the Third Order, revolving every thirty seconds (as at present) visible for about fifteen (15) miles, will be exhibited from a temporary tower erected on the position now occupied by the Port Adelaide Lighthouse.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eighteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eighteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence ten money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continuously posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

THE VICTORIAN NEGLECTED CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY.—PETITION FOR INCORPORATION.

No. 1039, to The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society, are published hereunder, pursuant to an Order of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, made on the 7th day of May, 1900, under the provisions of section 4 of the Act aforesaid.

To His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

THE humble petition of the contributors of The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society sheweth—

1. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society was founded in the year 1894, and has ever since continued and still continues in active existence, carrying out the objects for which it was formed.

2. That the said society was formed for the following purposes:—

- (a) Of receiving neglected and destitute children in the colony of Victoria, or those in danger of becoming so, and of providing for their physical, moral, and spiritual welfare.
- (b) Of employing and paying a person or persons as the agent or agents of the said society, who shall, so far as possible, visit once a year all the children under the care of the said society.
- (c) Of establishing, maintaining, and supporting, in such place or places as the committee or governing body for the time being of the said society may deem most suitable, a receiving home or homes in which neglected and destitute children may be committed to the care of the society or of the said agent or agents, and may be lodged or cared for under the supervision and control of the committee or governing body for the time being of that society, and of providing therein, so far as the funds of the society will allow, skilled nursing and attendance for such children.
- (d) Of having such children committed to the charge of the said society or its said agent or agents, duly empowered in that behalf under the provisions of section 61 of the *Neglected Children's Act 1890*.
- (e) Of transferring neglected and destitute children so committed to the care of the society or its agent or agents as aforesaid to suitable homes in the county or elsewhere.

3. That the pamphlets accompanying this petition set out the names of the office bearers and ladies' committee and council of

the said society, and also the fourth annual report and balance-sheet of the said society, and the rules under which the society has hitherto been carried on.

4. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society is an institution, society, or association established for the relief of destitute persons, and having for its objects the promotion of morality and the prevention of vice within the meaning of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

5. That such society is supported by the voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than One pound per annum for the support thereof.

6. That the persons signing this petition are 25 of such contributors.

Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency will be pleased, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the said *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, to declare the contributors for the time being to such society to be and continue public and corporate, under the style and title of The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society, and to have perpetual succession and a common seal.

And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.

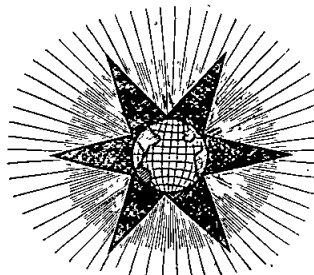

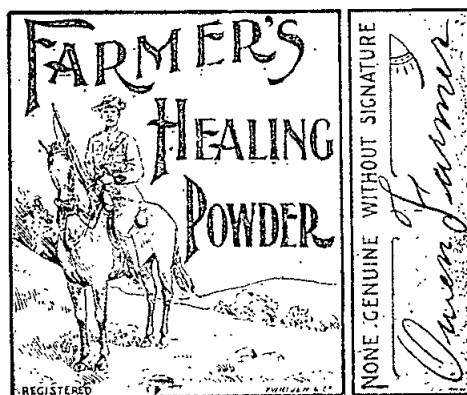

SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.—URBAN PORTIONS.—REGULATION BY THE SENIOR COMMISSIONER OF AUDIT.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a redemption fund for the liquidation of such loans. And the Senior Commissioner of Audit having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf enabling him so to do, has taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 9th April, 1900, made under the authority of the Water Acts, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the Senior Commissioner of Audit in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1900, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the *Water Act 1899*: Now therefore I, the said Senior Commissioner of Audit, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Water Acts, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 9th April, 1900, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1900, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1900 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. The rate to be paid in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1900.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—ALTERATION IN THE CONSTITUTION OF THE TRUST.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the *Water Act 1900* it is enacted that where, under Section 25 of the Principal Act (the *Water Act 1880*), a Municipal Council, together with one or more persons, not being members of the Council, have been appointed by the Governor in Council to be the Commissioners of a Waterworks Trust for a Waterworks District, the Governor in Council, upon the petition of a majority of the ratepayers in so much of any municipal district or districts as is within the Waterworks District of such Trust, may, if he thinks fit, declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of such Trust by virtue of their office as Municipal Councillors or by appointment of the Governor in Council shall, from a day to be named in such Order, cease to be Commissioners of such Waterworks Trust, and shall be succeeded by Commissioners elected for such Trust.

And it is further provided by the aforesaid section that the Governor in Council may, by the same or any subsequent Order, direct that any number of Commissioners stated in such Order shall, within a time specified in such Order, and from time to time, be elected in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations made by the Governor in Council.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 21st of December, 1897, a certain Waterworks Trust, known as the Charlton Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the Councillors for the Shire of Charlton for the time being and three other persons were in and by such Order appointed to be the Commissioners of such Trust.

And whereas a petition has been signed by a majority of the ratepayers within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Charlton included within the Waterworks District of the said Trust, praying that the Councillors for the Shire of Charlton for the time being and the three other persons appointed Commissioners of the Trust shall cease to hold office, and that they be succeeded by Commissioners to be elected by ratepayers within the aforesaid portion of the said shire.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the said *Water Act 1900*, doth hereby declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Charlton Waterworks Trust by virtue of their office as municipal councillors, and the three other persons appointed Commissioners of such Trust shall, after the 24th day of July, 1900, cease to hold office as such Commissioners accordingly, and shall after such day be succeeded by five Commissioners, to be elected for such Trust on the 25th day of July, 1900, in the manner prescribed by regulations made for that purpose, and also for the purpose of conducting subsequent elections.

And the Honorable Alfred Richard Outtrim, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by Division I. of Part I. of the *Water Act 1900* the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Charlton Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 25th day of July, 1900, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 25th day of July in each

succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the *Water Act 1900* in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 15th day of June, 1900, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the *Water Act 1900* which shall upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Charlton included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Charlton township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the *Water Acts* in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule. Notice of Poll. Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Charlton township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before polling day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice

in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Charlton township, a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

16. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

17. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

18. Mode of voting where Voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in any case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

19. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

22. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

23. Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately on the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulations (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACT 1898.

LANDS ACQUIRED FOR PURPOSES OF CLOSER SETTLEMENT.

Farm Allotments.

Every application for a conditional purchase lease of a farm allotment shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule 134 hereto.

The applicant shall, before lodging his application, pay to the nearest Receiver of Revenue the sum of Five shillings (5s.) for a certificate of registration, which must accompany the application, and such sum shall not be refunded unless specially authorized in exceptional cases.

The fee for the preparation of a conditional purchase lease shall be One pound.

Every lessee of a farm allotment shall, on the expiration of three years, and again on the expiration of six years from the date of his lease, forward to the Secretary for Lands a statement in the form prescribed in Schedule 135 hereto as to the performance of the covenants of his lease.

SHIRE OF MARONG.—DEVIATION OF A ROAD IN THE TOWN OF LOCKWOOD.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Marong has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the town of Lockwood in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

ST. ARNAUD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations made by the Trustees of the St. Arnaud Public Cemetery.

1. The Rules and Regulations, numbered 1 to 31, shall be the Rules and Regulations of the St. Arnaud Public Cemetery, and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette* all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust will be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust. An order in the form Schedule A. obtained, and the fees, when not remitted, paid.

4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person in the cemetery on a certificate of a Justice of the Peace, who before signing shall satisfy himself, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The fees mentioned in the scale shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at the time of making application for any order.

6. A burial right (Schedule C) shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

7. A permit (Schedule D) will, on application of the holder of a burial right and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, and a copy of the proposed inscription

or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

8. Any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.

9. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee under Schedule C, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct same, subject to the approval of the trustees or their surveyor, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

10. Any tomb or monument requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected and replaced by the owner at his own cost.

11. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized, in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.

12. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

13. Any grave may, on the approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave (Schedule C, Rule 6) on payment of the fees or balance of the fees provided for herein, such payment giving the owner the right, without further payment, of enclosing or otherwise dealing with the land in accordance with the provisions of Schedule D, Rule 7.

14. No grave shall be less than 6 feet in depth, and the bodies of two children under the age of twelve years, or one adult and one child under the age of twelve years, may be interred therein, provided that in the latter case the first interment is that of the adult body.

15. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

16. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence, for disinterment, of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

17. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery not later than Five o'clock on the evening of the day preceding the burial. If presented later the sexton may decline to receive the order until receipt for the fee for insufficient notice is produced.

18. No order for burial shall be issued until the certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, Coroner, or Justice of the Peace has been produced for inspection.

19. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., from September to April, both months inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to half-past Four p.m. in the other four months. On Sundays throughout the year the usual time for burial shall be from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

20. The time fixed for burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

21. Hearse and mourning carriages only are to be allowed within the cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the trustees, their officers and servants, as may be found necessary from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.

22. No catacomb or wooden erection shall be allowed on or about any vault or grave allotment.

23. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except with the approval of the cemetery trustees.

24. Licensed exhumations shall be made at such hours as the trustees shall in each case direct, and in all cases of exhumation the trustees may, where necessary, impose special conditions. Non-compliance therewith will be a breach of the rules.

25. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the cemetery.

26. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

27. No person shall pluck any flowers, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery without the permission of the trustees.

28. The cemetery will be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. daily, but the trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers, and servants, of removing all persons misconducting themselves, violating the rules of propriety or decorum, committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection, tree, shrub, flower, or border.

29. No person engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees shall be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof without the permission of the trustees.

30. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employ of the trustees, shall comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

31. All material required for the performance of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

Under the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.
