1. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society was founded in the year 1894, and has ever since continued and still continues in active existence, carrying out the objects for which it was formed.

2. That the said society was formed for the following pur

- (a) Of receiving neglected and destitute children in the colony of Victoria, or those in danger of becoming so, and of providing for their physical, moral, and spiritual welfare.
 (b) Of employing and paying a person or persons as the agent or agents of the said society, who shall, so far as possible, visit once a year all the children under the care of the said society.
 (c) Of establishing, maintaining, and supporting, in such place or places as the committee or governing body for the time being of the said society may deem most suitable, a receiving home or hones in which neglected and destinate children may be committed to the care of the society or of the said agent or agents, and may be lodged or cared for under the supervision and control of the committee or governing body for the time being of that society, and of providing therein, so far as the funds of the society will allow, skilled nursing and attendance for such children.
 (d) Of having such children committed to the charge of the
- allow, skilled nursing and attendance for such children.

 (d) Of having such children committed to the charge of the said society or its said agent or agents, duly empowered in that behalf under the provisions of section 61 of the Neglected Children's Act ISSO.

 (c) Of transferring neglected and destitute children so committed to the care of the society or its agent or agents as aforesaid to suitable homes in the country or elsewhere.
- 3. That the pamphlets accompanying this petition set out the names of the office bearers and ladies' committee and council of

the said society, and also the fourth annual report and balancesheet of the said society, and the rules under which the society
has hitherto been carried on.

4. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society is an
institution, society, or association established for the relief of
destitute persons, and having for its objects the promotion of
morality and the prevention of vice within the meaning of the
Hospitals and Charities Act 1890.

5. That such society is supported by the voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less
than One pound per annum for the support thereof.

6. That the persons signing this petition are 25 of such contributors.





And the Senior Commissioner of Audit having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf enabling him so to do, has taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the Government Gazette: And whereas by a Proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 9th April, 1900, made under the authority of the Water Acts, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the Senior Commissioner of Audit in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1900, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the Water Act 1890: Now therefore I, the said Senior Commissioner of Audit, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Water Acts, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 9th April, 1900, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1900, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by Division I. of Part I. of the Water Act 1900 the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Charlton Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office,—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 25th day of July, 1900, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 25th day of July in each

succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

Voters List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the Water Act 1990 in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 15th day of June, 1990, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

Voters' List to be propared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the Water Act 1900 which shall upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Chariton included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

- 10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Acts in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected. elected accordingly.
- 12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule. Notice of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Charlton township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at seven o clock in the afternoon. 12. - 13. Retirement of Candidates before polling day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirons that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice

- in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall therefupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Charlton township, a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erases such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

Poncils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

And in any cass any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, to be published. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.
- 20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.
- 21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempted depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall determine by lot the candidate to hold office.

24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

25. Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioner of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arrisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner as such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner at any election shall have b

Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In even to fany voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed as traordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election.

Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.

30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be manually manner before justices of the peace.

31. Interpretation.—In these Regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Conneil from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulations (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACT 1898.

LANDS ACQUIRED FOR PURPOSES OF CLOSER SETTLEMENT.

Farm Allotments.

Every application for a conditional purchase lease of a farm allotment shall be in the form

prescribed in Schedule 134 hereto.

The applicant shall, before lodging his application, pay to the nearest Receiver of Revenue the sum of Five shillings (5s.) for a certificate of registration, which must accompany the application, and such sum shall not be refunded unless specially authorized in exceptional cases.

The fee for the preparation of a conditional purchase lease shall be One pound.

Every lessee of a farm allotment shall, on the expiration of three years, and again on the expiration of six years from the date of his lease, forward to the Secretary for Lands a statement in the form prescribed in Schedule 135 hereto as to the performance of the covenants of his lease.

PULES and Regulations made by the Trustees of the St. Arnaud Public Cemetery.

1. The Rules and Regulations, numbered 1 to 31, shall be the Rules and Regulations of the St. Arnaud Public Cemetery, and after the publication thereof in the Government Gacette all Rules and Regulations heretofone made shall be rescinded.

2. The office of the 'Trust will be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to

Four p.m.

3. No hurial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust. An order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees, when not remitted, paid.

4. The charges will be a second of the trust.

paid.

4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person in the cemetery on a certificate of a Justice of the Peace, who before signing shall satisfy himself, that such person was a pather, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The fees mentioned in the scale shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at the time of making application for any order.

under the Act, and shall be paid at the time of making application for any order.

6. A burial right (Schedule C) shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

7. A permit (Schedule D) will, on application of the holder of a burial right and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, and a copy of the proposed inscription in

or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and cons as they may see fit to impose.

8. Any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall e reserved for the special decision of the trustees.

9. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee under Schedule C, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct same, subject to the approval of the trustees or their surveyor, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

10. Any tomb or monument requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected and replaced by the owner at his own cost.

11. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized, in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.

12. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

13. Any grave may, on the approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave (Schedule C, Rule 6) on payment of the fees or balance of the fees provided for herein, such payment giving the owner the right, without further payment, of enclosing or otherwise dealing with the land in accordance with the provisions of Schedule D, Rule 7.

14. No grave shall be less than 6 feet in depth, and the bodies of two children under the age of twelve years, or one adult and one child under the age of twelve years, may be interred therein, provided that in the latter case the first interment is that of the adult body.

15. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level 15. No come shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

16. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence, for disinterment, of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

17. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery not later than Five o'clock on the evening of the day preceding the burial. If presented later the sexton may decline to receive the order until receipt for the fee for insufficient notice is produced.

18. No order for burial shall be issued until the certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, Coroner, or Justice of the Peace has been produced for inspection.

been produced for inspection.

19. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., from September to April, both months inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to half-past Four p.m. in the other four months. On Sundays throughout the year the usual time for burial shall be from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

20. The time fixed for burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

21. Hearses and mourning carriages only are to be allowed within the cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the trustees, their officers and servants, as may be found necessary from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.

22. No catacomb or wooden crection shall be allowed on or about any vault or grave allotment.

23. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except with the approval of the cemetery trustees.

24. Licensed exhumations shall be made at such hours as the trustees shall in each case direct, and in all cases of exhumation the trustees may, where necessary, impose special conditions. Non-compliance therewith will be a breach of the rules.

25. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the cemetery

26. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

27. No person shall pluck any flowers, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery without the permission of the rustees.

28. The cemetery will be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. daily, but the trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers, and servants, of removing all persons misconducting themselves, violating the rules of propriety or decorum, committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection, tree, shrub, flower, or border.

29. No person engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees shall be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof without the permission of the trustees.

30. Any workman employed in the cometery, though not in the employ of the trustees, shall comply with such general direc-tions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cometery.

31. All material required for the performance of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

Under the provisions of the Cometeries Act 1899, every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.
