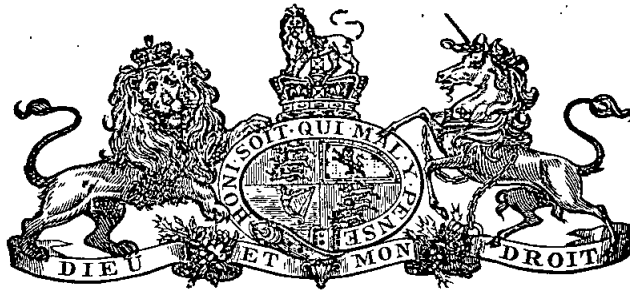

FURTHER PROROGUING PARLIAMENT AND FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE FOURTH SESSION OF THE SEVENTEENTH PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 12th day of June, 1900, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same and to fix the time for holding the next session thereof: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Wednesday, the 27th day of June, 1900, and also I do hereby fix Wednesday, the 27th day of June, 1900, aforesaid, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament-place, Spring-street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

Municipalities' Loans Extension Act 1898, Section 18 (2).

EXTENSION OF LOAN OF £47,000 OF THE BOROUGH OF FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON TO THE 1ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1934.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington has applied to the Treasurer to take advantage of the provisions of the above-recited Act in respect to its

- No. 1 Loan for £15,000, maturing on 31st December, 1914.
- No. 2 Loan for £12,000, maturing on 30th June, 1917.
- No. 3 Loan for £20,000, maturing on 31st December, 1919.

And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of an application from the said council that an agreement between the said council and the Treasurer be entered into under the provisions of the Act: And whereas the said agreement has been entered into on 11th December, 1899, under which the said council covenants to pay to the Treasurer certain sums on certain fixed dates, and the said council has issued and lodged with the Commissioners of Audit certain debentures as security for such payments in pursuance of the said Act: And whereas the Treasurer has, in pursuance of the said agreement and the said Act, inscribed an additional sum of £30,673 ls. 10d. of Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock as a sinking fund for the said loans:

Now I, the Treasurer of Victoria, hereby notify that the period during which the Council of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington is required to provide for the payment of the principal moneys secured on the debentures under the said loans has been extended until the 1st day of October, 1934, and the said council shall not be bound or required from the date of the said agreement to cause any sum to be invested or to make any payment under the Principal Act into any sinking fund formed for the purpose of the liquidation of the loan in respect of which such debentures have been so issued.

No. 1039, to The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society, are published hereunder, pursuant to an Order of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, made on the 7th day of May, 1900, under the provisions of section 4 of the Act aforesaid.

To His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

THE humble petition of the contributors of The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society sheweth—

1. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society was founded in the year 1894, and has ever since continued and still continues in active existence, carrying out the objects for which it was formed.

2. That the said society was formed for the following purposes:—

- (a) Of receiving neglected and destitute children in the colony of Victoria, or those in danger of becoming so, and of providing for their physical, moral, and spiritual welfare.
- (b) Of employing and paying a person or persons as the agent or agents of the said society, who shall, so far as possible, visit once a year all the children under the care of the said society.
- (c) Of establishing, maintaining, and supporting, in such place or places as the committee or governing body for the time being of the said society may deem most suitable, a receiving home or homes in which neglected and destitute children may be committed to the care of the society or of the said agent or agents, and may be lodged or cared for under the supervision and control of the committee or governing body for the time being of that society, and of providing therein, so far as the funds of the society will allow, skilled nursing and attendance for such children.
- (d) Of having such children committed to the charge of the said society or its said agent or agents, duly empowered in that behalf under the provisions of section 61 of the *Neglected Children's Act 1890*.
- (e) Of transferring neglected and destitute children so committed to the care of the society or its agent or agents as aforesaid to suitable homes in the country or elsewhere.

3. That the pamphlets accompanying this petition set out the names of the office bearers and ladies' committee and council of the said society, and also the fourth annual report and balance-sheet of the said society, and the rules under which the society has hitherto been carried on.

4. That The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society is an institution, society, or association established for the relief of destitute persons, and having for its objects the promotion of morality and the prevention of vice within the meaning of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

5. That such society is supported by the voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than One pound per annum for the support thereof.

6. That the persons signing this petition are 25 of such contributors.

Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency will be pleased, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the said *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, to declare the contributors for the time being to such society to be and continue politic and corporate, under the style and title of The Victorian Neglected Children's Aid Society, and to have perpetual succession and a common seal.

And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.

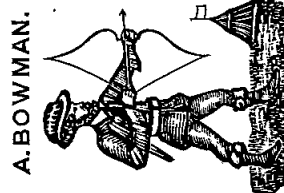

BOROUGH OF CARISBROOK.

BY-LAW No. 29.

By-law of the Borough of Carisbrook, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 29, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles and other velocipedes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carisbrook order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression machine shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.
2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.
3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such wagon, cart, or carriage, horse or other

beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle or any horse or any other beast of burden shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any wagon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such wagon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive and alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such wagon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall whilst riding, driving, or impelling a machine proceed across any of the street crossings within the borough at a greater speed than four miles an hour.

8. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
