Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF ROBERT HARPER AND CO. PROPRIETARY LTD., MANUFACTURERS OF GROCERS' SUNDRIES, BEACH-STREET, PORT MELBOURNE, for a period of six weeks from the 5th June, 1900, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF GEORGE AND GEORGE LTD., COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE (DRESS, MANTLE, AND TAILORING DEPARTMENTS), for a period of six weeks from the 5th June, 1900, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

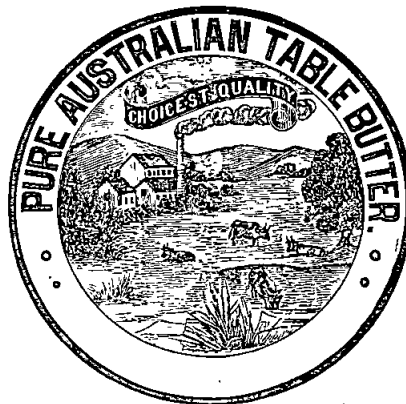

SHIRE OF MALVERN.

By-LAW No. 39.

A By-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 39, for regulating traffic and processions, and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality, and for suppressing nuisances, and providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, foot-ways, or other public places of the shire so as in any way to obstruct or impede the traffic therein or thereon shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the foot-ways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the foot-way.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street, except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of an omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

6. The driver of any vehicle, of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle, by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic; and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall, upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. Between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public road-ways or foot-ways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such road-way or foot-way, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

8. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, desist from playing or singing in the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

9. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the president, or, in his absence, the secretary of the shire, and only by route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge at the police station.

10. Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice, in writing, under the hand or by direction of the president, or in his absence or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the shire secretary or the officer in charge of the police stationed at Malvern, any carriage-way, foot-way, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and, if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.

11. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall as to the placing and otherwise thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.

12. That from and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person between one half-hour after sunset and the following sunrise shall in, upon, or along any of the roads or streets within the Shire of Malvern drive or ride any vehicle, bicycle, or other velocipede without having a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed at the off side of the front of such vehicle or in front of such bicycle or other velocipede, and lighted. Every person who by any wilful act or default shall be

guilty of any breach of this clause shall for every such offence forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Ten shillings.

13. No person shall bring into or cart or carry with carts or other carriages drawn by horses or otherwise within the boundaries of the Shire of Malvern any night-soil, blood, offal, or other matter being offensive to smell or noxious to health, except with the consent under seal of the council of the said shire, and except between the hours of Eleven o'clock post meridian on any day and Six o'clock ante meridian of the next day.

14. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing by-law other than No. 12 shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings.

This by-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the Local Government Act 1890, in the Government Gazette.
