The births of 1,052 children, viz., 565 boys and 487 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. Since May, 1896, when the births fell for the first time for many years below 1,100, there was at first a gradual recovery to 1,139 in May, 1898; but a decline again occurred, until, in May, 1900, the number was lower than in the corresponding month of any of the previous ten years, except 1896. The births in May, 1900, were, moreover, 216 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 285 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in May numbered 494, viz., 268 of males and 226 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 558, or 113 per cent., as against 103 per cent. in May, 1899, and 117 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 46 smaller than in May, 1899, and the present was the first occasion in May, since 1883, that the deaths were fewer than 500; they were also fewer by 105 than the average of May during the last ten years, or 123 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.92, and that of deaths registered to 12.17 per annum, as compared with averages for the same month in 1899 of 27.51 and 13.53 respectively, and during the last ten years of 32.92 and 15.25 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.50.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73.5° on the 7th, and the lowest was 48.5° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (52.2°) was 1.3° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.6°) took place on the 16th, and the least range (3.9°) on the 19th. The mean daily range was 12.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.429 inches on the 14th, and the lowest was 29.659 inches on the 18th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.113 inches) was one-twentieth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on fifteen days, the amount being 3.83 inches, which was higher than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except May, 1893, and 1.53 inches above the average during that period.

Fog occurred on six days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was .863.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. to that mortality, as against 22 per cent. in May, 1899; 34 per cent. in May, 1898; 25 per cent. in May, 1897; 30 per cent. in May, 1896; 25 per cent. in May, 1895; and 28 per cent. in May, 1894. The falling off in this proportion is a natural result of the smaller proportion of children in the population, owing to the decline in the birth rate.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 76, as compared with 93 in May, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was 72 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 85 in May, 1899; 108 in May, 1898;

84 in May, 1897; 106 in May, 1896; 88 in May, 1895; 79 in May, 1894; 91 in May, 1893; 76 in May, 1892; 87 in May, 1891; and 99 in May, 1890.

Fifty-two persons—as against 53 in May, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a tailor and a female, each aged 73, died of syncope; a female, aged 75, of aneurism; a labourer, aged 75, of heart disease; a bus driver, aged 75, of disease of prostate; a messenger, aged 76, of aneurism; a hammerman, aged 76, of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 76, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77, of erysipelas; an engine driver and a female, each aged 77, of phthisis; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of pulmonary apoplexy; a female, aged 78, of heart disease; another, aged 79, of cancer; a greengrocer and a female, each aged 79, of heart disease; an inspector, aged 79, of obstruction of the intestines; an engineer and a dealer, each aged 80, of cystitis; a female, aged 81, of rheumatism; a farmer, aged 81, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 81, of heart disease; a female, aged 81, of obstruction of the intestines; another, aged 82, of cancer; a gentleman and a female, each aged 82, of apoplexy; a female, aged 82, of syncope; a blacksmith, aged 82, of heart disease; a civil servant, aged 83, of diarrhoea; two females, each aged 83, of syncope; a male of no occupation, aged 84, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 84, of suffocation, from vomited matter getting into air passages; a nurse, aged 85, of cancer; a wheelwright, aged 85, of mitral stenosis; a gunmaker, aged 85, of syncope; a farmer, aged 85, of disease of the prostate; a gentleman, aged 87, of paralysis; a female, aged 95, of pneumonia; a sugar-boller, aged 76, a grazier and a sailor, each aged 77, a stonemason and a female, each aged 79, three females, each aged 80, a female, aged 81, a labourer, aged 82, and two females, aged 87 and 88 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-six of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 20 in May, 1899—were from external causes, of which 24 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jockey, aged 27, was killed by his horse falling with him in a race; a cabman, aged 69, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a cab; a storeman, aged 29, of injuries, consequent on being crushed in a lift; a maltster, aged 59, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a ladder; a storeman, aged 22, of injuries to the head, the result of a fall from a building; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, of injuries to the head, consequent on a fall whilst drunk; a clerk, aged 28, a house painter, aged 49, and a cab proprietor, aged 52, of fracture of the skull, the result of falls; a female, aged 44, of fracture of the thigh bone; a grazier, aged 22, of gunshot wounds; two females, aged 70 and 72 respectively, of burns; a female child, aged 3, of scalds; a clerk, aged 42, of heart failure, resulting from sunstroke; a boy, aged 12, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; three persons were found drowned, viz., a clerk, aged 42, in the River Yarra; a plumber's assistant, aged 43, in Port Melbourne Lagoon; and a dressmaker, aged 31, in Hobson's Bay; a fireman, aged 38, was suffocated owing to being caught in machinery; a male child, aged 4 months, and a gentleman, aged 84, by food getting into air passages; a new-born male infant, during birth; and a new-born female infant, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a male of no occupation, aged 49, who died of injuries, the result of being run over by a cart, a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicidal death was that of a female, aged 30, who drowned herself.

One hundred and thirty-three deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—54 in the Melbourne, 12 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 2 in the Children's, 3 in the Homoeopathic, and 14 in the Austin Hospitals; 12 in the Metropolitan and 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Benevolent and 3 in the Infant Asylums; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital; 1 in the Protestant Refuge; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 99, of which 53, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 46, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 76 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 395. Of these 215, or 54 per cent., were males, and 180, or 46 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 36 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 45 were between sixty-five and seventy, 37 were between seventy and seventy-five, 23 were between seventy-five and eighty, 21 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 at the age of ninety-five.

Comparing the month under review with the similar period of 1899, it will be noticed that deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 55 to 36, chiefly owing to the decrease in deaths from typhoid fever from 16 to 8 and in diarrheal diseases from 13 to 3. Under parasitic diseases there was a fall from 2 to nil; but from dietic, constitutional, and developmental diseases, and ill-defined causes, there was but little variation in the mortality of the two periods. Under local diseases, the deaths fell from 284 to 268, the chief decrease appearing under the head of enteritis, the mortality from which fell from 24 to 17. The Class "Violence" was the only one which showed an increase, which was accounted for by 7 deaths having been caused by scalds and suffocation, as against not one case in May, 1899.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first five months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.

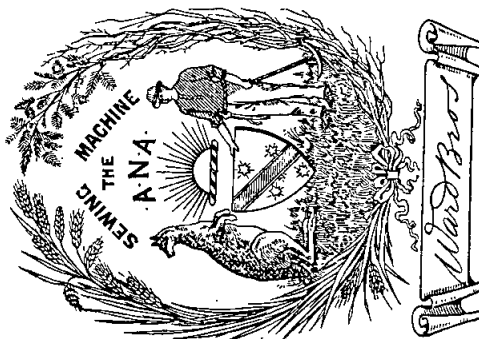

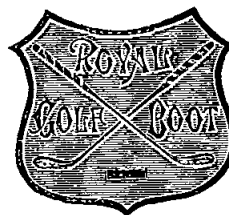

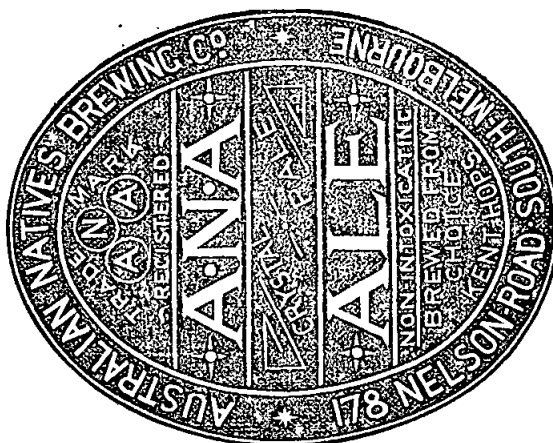

Vegetables required for Swan Island must be delivered at the tramway, and, when required for vessels of the Victorian Navy, at the sea end of the new pier, Queenscliff.

Cabbage to be supplied free from outside leaves and stalks, carrots and turnips free from tops.

(Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractor to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to him, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.)

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION providing for the Sale of Water for the year 1900.

REGULATION No. 19.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The forms of measure shall be and are hereunder determined by the Trust.

Gravitation Water.

5. Filling tanks outside of Trust area, a charge of Two pounds (£2) for each tank shall be made; but when the parties are irrigating land in the immediate neighbourhood of such tanks a demand of One pound (£1) only for each tank shall be made.

Fallow Land.

6. For fallow land a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made.

Irrigation by Pumping.

7. For all kinds of crops or land all the year round the charge shall be Tenpence (10d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering. Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) to be the minimum charge for each acre.

Filling Tanks.

8. Filling tanks inside of Trust area, a charge of One pound (£1) for each tank shall be made. Filling tanks outside of Trust area, a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made.

Garden Rights.

9. The rate or price for the right to irrigate gardens or orchards shall be at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per acre or part of an acre for the year round; but in all cases, either for gardens or other crops or grasses, the minimum charge shall be One pound (£1).

10. A garden shall be taken to mean an area not exceeding 1/20 acres.

11. Such person or persons as the aforesaid Trust shall appoint from time to time for the purpose of collecting water rates shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates and charges.

Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter, water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1900.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church, or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is also further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
