The births of 1,052 children, viz., 565 boys and 487 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. Since May. 1896, when the births fell for the first time for many years below 1,100, there was at first a gradual recovery to 1,139 in May, 1898; but a decline again occurred, until, in May, 1900, the number was lower than in the corresponding month of any of the previous ten years, except 1896. The births in May, 1900, were, moreover, 246 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 285 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in May numbered 494, viz., 286 of males and 226 of females; the births thus exceeded the doaths by 558, or 113 per cent., as against 103 per cent. in May, 1899, and 117 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 46 smaller than in May, 1899, and the present was the first occasion in May, since 1883, that the deaths were fewer, than 500; they were also fewer by 105 than the average of May during the last ten years, or 123 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25°92, and that of deaths registered to 12°17 per annum, as compared with averages for the same month in 1899 of 27°51 and 13°53 respectively, and during the last ten years of 32°2 and 15°25 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31°27 and 16°50.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73°5 on the 7th, and the lowest was 33°5 on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (52°2) was 1°3' below the average. The greatest range of the highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30°429 inches on the 14th, and the lowest was 29°659 inches on the 18th. Comparing the month under review with the similar period of 1893, it will be noticed that deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 55 to 36, chiefly owing to the decrease in deaths from typhoid fever from 16 to 8 and indiar head diseases from 18 to 3. Under parasitic diseases there was a fall from 2 to nil: but from dictic, constitutional, and developmental diseases, and ill-defined causes, there was but little variation in the mortality of the two periods. Under local diseases, the deaths fell from 28 to 288, the chief decrease appearing under the head of enteritis, the mortality from which fell from 24 to 17. The Class: "Violence" was the only one which showed an increase, which was accounted for by 7 deaths having been caused by scalds and suffocation, as against not one case in May, 1899.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first five months of 1990, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.





WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works and their successors in respect of Albert Park, in the City of South Melbourne and the Borough of Saint Kilda (now called the City of Saint Kilda), it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park for the recreation, convenience, and anuscement of the people and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Mayor, Councillors, and Gitizens of the City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works. And whereas by section 137 of the Land Act 1820 it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time, to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Council of the City of South

Melbourne, the Council of the City of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works do hereby rescind the regulations made by them and published in the Government Gazettes of 17th September, 1886, 10th December, 1886, 25th March, 1887, 6th February, 1893, and 25th February, 1893, respectively, in regard to the said Albert Park, and do hereby make the regulation following in respect thereof:—

REGULATION.

The undermentioned gentlemen shall constitute a Committee of Management to exercise control over the said Albert Park:
