## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to provide for the government discipline and maintenance of a Second Victorian Contingent for service with Her Majesty's Regular Forces in South Africa.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. KINSSELLA AND ROBB, MANUFACTURERS OF LEATHER GOODS, 19-21 SWAN-STREET, RICHMOND,

for a period of six weeks from the 15th January, 1900, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females or more than two boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females and two boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continuously posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1899.

THE births of 60 boys and 43 girls, or in all of 105 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December. Of these, 41 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 11 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 116, viz., 62 of boys and 54 of girls.

The deaths registered in December numbered 84, viz., 49 of males and 35 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 21. In November, the recorded deaths numbered 98; in December, 1898, they numbered 96; in December, 1897, they numbered 73; in December, 1896, they numbered 64; in December, 1895, they numbered 76; in December, 1894, they numbered 69; in December, 1893, they numbered 53; in December, 1892, they numbered 53; in December, 1891, they numbered 80; in December, 1890, they numbered 65; and in December, 1889, they numbered 72.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Although the number of deaths from influenza have fallen off from 40 in November last to only 4 in the month under review, the mortality of the month was still above the average. As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from diseases of the digestive system rose from 6 to 19. On the other hand, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system fell from 18 to 9; those from diseases of the respiratory system from 19 to 10; and those from diseases of the urinary system from 5 to 2.

In the year 1899 the births registered in Ballarat and suburbs numbered 1,363, viz., 694 of males and 669 of females, as against

1,240 in 1898. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 936, viz., 544 of males and 392 of females, as against 1,077 in 1898. The apparent gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was thus 427, as compared with 163 in 1898.

NOTE.—The natural increase of population during the quarter, although about 900 more than in the corresponding quarter of 1898—when a low birth and a high death rate prevailed—was about the same as in the September quarter of 1897 or 1896.

According to the records of the Immigration Agent there was a net emigration by sea during the quarter of 1,751, as against a net immigration of 1,024 in the corresponding quarter of 1898, but a net emigration of 886 and 5,386 in the same quarters of 1897 and 1896 respectively. If, however, allowance be made for unrecorded departures (estimated) there will be found to have been a net loss of population during the quarter of 3,148, as

compared with 548 in the corresponding quarter of 1898, of 2,499 in that of 1897, and of 7,264 in that of 1896. It may also be remarked that the net recorded emigration in the quarter under review was nearly five times as large as that in the second quarter, and more than twice as large as in the first quarter of the same year.

Deducting the net loss by emigration from the natural increase, there results an increase of population during the quarter of 1,548, as compared with one of 3,219 in the corresponding quarter of 1898, and of 2,174 in that of 1897; but with a decrease of 2,585 in that of 1896.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891), the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 63,181, viz., 48,900 males and 14,281 females. Had no such allowance been made, the population at the end of September would have been set down at 1,241,583, viz., 641,542 males and 600,041 females.

The records of migration—which include passengers merely calling at Victorian ports *en route*—show a balance in favour of immigrants of 273 from Foreign Ports, 271 from the United Kingdom, and 96 from South Africa; but a balance in favour of emigration of 1,089 to Western Australia, 497 to Queensland, 252 to New Zealand, 171 to South Seas, 166 to South Australia, 186 to Tasmania, 61 to New South Wales, and 19 to other British Possessions.

A noticeable feature in the quarterly estimate for September, 1898, was the temporary cessation of the emigration to Western Australia and to South Africa. In this statement, however, whilst the cessation of emigration to South Africa still continues, there was a net emigration to Western Australia amounting to 1,089. Taking the last fifteen months as a whole, however, there was a balance of immigration from Western Australia of 5,150 persons. The only exceptions to the regular outflow to Western Australia occurred in the fourth quarters of 1898 and 1897, in the third and fourth quarters of 1898, and in the first quarter of 1899, when there was a net gain of 379, 2,464, 1,763, 3,945, and 777 respectively.

The births of 956 children, viz., 506 boys and 450 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, 165 more than in December, 1898, and 34 more than in December, 1897, but were fewer than in any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 191 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 214 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in December numbered 676, viz., 365 of males and 311 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 280, or by 41 per cent., as against only 10 per cent. in December, 1898, and 45 per cent. according to the average. The number, it will be noticed, was 53 smaller than in December, 1898, and the lowest recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1893 and 1894; it was also 117 below the average of December during the last ten years, or 133 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 23.96 and of deaths registered to 16.91 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 21.80 and 19.87 respectively, and during the last ten years of 22.29 and 20.26 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 22.45 and 17.55.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 104.2° on the 31st, and the lowest was 45.5° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (65.6°) was 1.4° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (52.3°) took place on the 25th, and the least range (8.2°) on the 25th. The mean daily range was 24.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.204 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.269 inches on the 2nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.874 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on six days, the amount being 1.23 inches, which was lower than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except 1896 and 1898, and about three-fifths of an inch below the average during that period. The mean humidity of the month was 57.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 36 per cent. to that mortality, as against 41 per cent. in December, 1898; 43 per cent. in December, 1897; 43 per cent. in December, 1896; 42 per cent. in December, 1895; 39 per cent. in December, 1894; and 45 per cent. in December, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 195, as compared with 258 in December, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality was 205 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 304 in December, 1898; 343 in December, 1897; 255 in December, 1896; 256 in December, 1895; 209 in December, 1894; 260 in December, 1893; 246 in December, 1892; 273 in December, 1891; 189 in December, 1890; and 323 in December, 1889.

Seventy-two persons—as against 60 in December, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, an engine-driver, aged 75, died of dysentery; a carpenter, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 75, of cerebral hemorrhage; a bill-poster, aged 75, of paralysis; a saddler, aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, hanged herself; a gardener, aged 76, died of cancer; a gentleman, aged 76, of cerebral softening and bronchitis respectively; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a contractor, aged 77, of influenza; two gentlemen, each aged 77, of dilatation of the heart; a cook (male), aged 76, of pneumonia; another, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 78, of heart disease; a draper and a female, both aged 78, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 78, of bronchitis; two gentlemen, each aged 79, of diabetes and epilepsy respectively; three females, each aged 79, of syncope, pneumonia, and enteritis respectively; a miner, aged 79, of uræmia; two gentlemen, each aged 80, of cerebral hemorrhage and syncope respectively; a gardener, aged 80, of heart disease; a bootmaker, aged 80, of pneumonia; a labourer and a female, each aged 80, of nephritis and Bright's disease respectively; a farmer, aged 81, of influenza; a male, of no occupation, aged 81, of diarrhoea; an agent, aged 81, of cerebral effusion; female, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a labourer, aged 82, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of insanity; a manufacturer, aged 82, of pneumonia; a female, aged 82, of obstruction of the bowels; two females, each aged 83, of cancer and hemiplegia respectively; a female, aged 84, of endocarditis; a printer and a toothblack, both aged 84, of pneumonia; a miner, aged 86, of dysentery; a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a male, of no occupation, aged 88, of jaundice; a gentleman, aged 89, of pneumonia; a female, aged 91, of peritonitis; a gentleman, aged 93, a farmer and a gardener, both aged 76, a gentleman, a miner, and a nurse, all aged 77, a woman, aged 80, a grazer, a gardener, and a merchant, all aged 81, a cook (male), and a labourer, both aged 82, a gentleman and a tinsmith, both aged 83, four females, aged 81, 85, 87, and 89 respectively, a cabinetmaker and a female, both aged 90, and two females, aged 94 and 95 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-seven of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 30 in December, 1898—were from external causes, of which 21 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 37, was passed over by a railway train, and a farmer, aged 18, by a trolley; a labourer, aged 70, was thrown out of a buggy; a train-examiner, aged 40, was crushed between a trolley and a railway carriage; a lift attendant, aged 34, died of injuries, the result of a fall down stairs; a female, aged 5, of injury to the head, and an accountant, aged 66, of fracture of the skull, caused in both cases by falls; a male infant, aged 11 days, of extravasation of blood on the brain consequent on an injury at birth; a boy, aged 13, of traumatic tetanus; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; two females, aged 7 and 43 respectively, of burns; a labourer, aged 45, and a female, aged 25, of heat apoplexy; a coach painter, aged 39, of lead poisoning; a boy, aged 10, was drowned in a quarry hole; a clerk, aged 33, in the River Yarra; a male of unknown occupation, aged 55, and a farmer, aged 64, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female child, aged 2 months, and two male children, both aged 3 months, were suffocated by vomited matter getting into air passages; a female child, aged 3 weeks, was overhain; and a newborn male infant died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a new-born female infant, who died of suffocation (probably murder). The suicidal deaths were those of two females, aged 29 and 75 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and sixty-one deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—79 in the Melbourne, 16 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 6 in the Homœopathic, and 9 in the Austin Hospitals; 6 in the Metropolitan and 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 5 in the Benevolent, and 3 in the Infant Asylums; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 240, of which 141, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 196 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 436. Of these 224, or 51 per cent., were males, and 212, or 49 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 34 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 35 were between sixty-five and fifty and eighty-five, 42 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 28 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 4 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-five.

Of the total increase of 98 deaths in the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, 15 occurred under the head of zymotic diseases, 54 under that of local diseases, 14 under that of ill-defined causes (chiefly debility, &c.), 9 under that of dietic diseases, chiefly want of breast milk; 8 under that of constitutional diseases, and 3 under that of violence; as against which the only increases were 4 under developmental diseases (chiefly premature birth), and 1 under parasitic diseases. In the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 28 in December, 1898, to 3 in December, 1899, those from diarrheal diseases from 31 to 21, and those from typhoid fever from 12 to 6; but deaths from influenza, owing to its recent outbreak in an epidemic form, rose from 4 to 31. In the local class decreases occurred under the heads of diseases of the nervous system from 83 to 66, those of the circulatory system from 63 to 54, and in those of the digestive organs (chiefly enteritis) from 149 to 113; partly counterbalanced by an increase under diseases of the respiratory system from 65 to 77.

Influenza seems to have first appeared in an endemic form in Melbourne in April, 1890 (when 30 deaths occurred). Prior to that period the average annual number of deaths from the disease was only 7, and the highest ever recorded was 15; but, since 1889, the maximum number was 406 in 1891, next 329 in 1899, and varied in the other recent years from 34 in 1892 to 134 in 1895. The largest number ever recorded in one month was 233, viz., in October, 1891, the next largest being 152 in November, 1899, and the next in October, 1899, and November, 1891—when 91 and 90 deaths respectively occurred. As a rule the principal epidemics appear in the spring season of the year (September to November). The recent epidemic was especially fatal to old people, the great majority of them who died being over 60 years of age. The number of deaths from influenza in each month during the ten years ended with 1899 is shown in the following table:—

Owing, it is suspected to a deterioration of the milk supply during hot weather, diarrheal diseases and enteritis are responsible for the deaths of from 600 to nearly 1,000 persons annually—between three-fourths and eight-ninths of whom are mere infants under the age of two years—which take place for the most part in the six months November to April, which, of course, include the hottest period of the year. During the year just closed 706 such deaths were recorded, which, although nearly 260 fewer than in 1898, were only 28 below the average of the last six years. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1900.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1900 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement; house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate Made this 11th day of December, 1899.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz:—

REGULATION No. 20.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum, upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Nine pounds annual municipal value and under the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value and upwards an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than One pound sterling.

5. For every water trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carrier's stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July in each year.
9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
10. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.
11. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
12. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.
14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July, 1900, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

#### MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

##### RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1900, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust district.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upward (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1900.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show yards, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure. Provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust, used for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation, providing that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Nine o'clock a. m. and Nine o'clock p. m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1900, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

The following rate is hereby made, and shall be payable for the year 1900 equally upon all rateable property within the Avoca Water Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the district within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated, that is to say, on all such rateable property the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling on such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the 1st day of February, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates.

**LANCIEFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION No. 11.**

A Regulation of the Lancelfield Waterworks Trust, made under the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred under the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Lancelfield Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *Australien* arrived in Victorian waters on 27th December ultimo, having on board persons from a place infected with the plague, namely, Noumea: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be stowed or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

WHEREAS by the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* (No. 1451), it is among other things provided that the sum of Thirty-five thousand pounds to be raised by the issue of Treasury Bonds under the authority of the said Act may be applied for the giving of bonuses for dairy produce, fruits, and honey of best quality, and in best order exported to markets other than Australasian; for the construction of wineries in vine-growing districts, and viticultural education generally; for the sowing and planting, and cultivation of seeds or plants to be used for the manufacture of same; and for the manufacture of raisins, currants, and figs, to be expended under Regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 10th day of November, 1896, Regulations were made for payment of bonuses for export of fruit pulp: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Regulations made for the purpose aforesaid in the manner following (that is to say):—

Bonus for Export of Fruit Pulp.

11. An advance of 50 per cent. of the amount of bonus of one half a penny per pound may be paid on shipment of fruit pulp on the certificate of the inspecting officer, and payment of the

balance of bonus may be made on condition that such pulp arrived at the port of consignment in a good and marketable condition, and sold at the price realized for good pulp.

12. Account sales of the fruit pulp exported shall be obtained and forwarded to the secretary for agriculture by the person or persons claiming bonus, and shall be verified to the satisfaction of the Minister of Agriculture in such manner as he may think fit to require.

Clause 8 in the aforesaid regulations is amended by inserting after the word "days" "or such further time as may be considered necessary by the inspecting officer."

The following clause is also hereby added.

13. Pulp which has been re-boiled owing to defect in prior treatment shall bear a distinguishing brand on the casing or tin to indicate that it has been so treated.

## LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM POLYNESIA, MADAGASCAR, SEYHELLES ISLANDS, AND REUNION.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies; &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (51 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have come or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively; And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected

place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation notify that

POLYNESIA, MADAGASCAR, SEYHELLES ISLANDS, AND REUNION

are infected with the Plague, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such places to Victoria.

TOWNSHIP AT EGERTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I., section 73) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and that the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of *The Land Act 1884* shall be sold by auction in the manner provided in the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and that the lands upon which such street or road have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: And whereas by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, annul and rescind any Proclamation made under the said Act or any Act of Parliament thereby or theretofore repealed of any portion or portions of Crown lands as towns or townships: And whereas by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of *The Land Act 1884*, and bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1890, certain Crown land at Egerton, in the parish of Bungal, county of Grant, as described in such Proclamation, was, amongst other Crown lands, proclaimed as a township: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice rescind the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, so far only as it relates to the Township of Egerton aforesaid, and do hereby proclaim as a township the portion of Crown lands hereunder described, that is to say:—

TOWNSHIP AT EGERTON, IN THE PARISH OF BUNGAL.—County of Grant, parish of Bungal: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment A<sup>1</sup> of section A; bounded thence by that allotment, a line, and allotments 8 and 7 of section B bearing southerly to a point in line with the northern boundary of M. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of *The Land Act 1869*, and bearing date the 23rd day of July, 1877, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay or from any Crown land situate within a distance of one chain from high-water mark in the said bay: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far only as it relates to the removal of sand from below high-water mark at the mouth of the Kananook Creek in the Township of Frankston.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH, HAMILTON.—POWER TO DISPOSE OF SITE.
