INTERNATIONAL CODE OF SIGNALS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Board of Trade has published a new edition of the International Code of Signals which will come into use on the 1st January, 1901, and that from the 1st January, 1901, until the 1st January, 1902, such new edition and the old edition of the Code will be used concurrently, the use of the new edition being denoted by the hoisting of the Code Pennant with the fly tied to the halyards, having above it a black ball or shape resembling a ball. From the 1st January, 1902, the new edition of the Code will alone be used, and its distinguishing sign will thenceforward be the Code Pennant hoisted in the ordinary way.

There is reason to believe that the Code will be generally adopted by the principal maritime powers on and after the 1st January, 1901, and that copies of the new edition of the Code will be obtainable shortly.

- 1. That all water supplied from the Trust works for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water supplied shall be by such method as shall be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the area watered shall be made by the water bailiff.

 2. That all pumped water shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per inch per acre for the first watering, which shall not be less than 3 inches per acre, and One shilling per inch per acre for the second watering, which shall not be less than 3 inches per acre.
- 3. Gravitation water shall be supplied during each season when available at the rate of Eightpence per inch per acro for first watering, not less than 3 inches to constitute a watering; and Fourpence per inch per acre for second or subsequent watering, not less than 3 inches to constitute a watering; and Threepence per inch per acre for surplus water for grass land, 2 inches to constitute a watering.
- 4. Every ratepayer who has constructed a proper channel from the Trust works, on application, shall receive a stock and domestic supply of water free of charge at an interval of 60 days from the last time water was available in the Trust channel from which he usually gets his supply.

 5. Every applicant for water shall enter his name in a book to be carried by the water bailiff, stating the date on which application is made, the area to be watered applied for, and paying the water bailiff the full price for such water, failing which no application will be entertained.

 6. In the event of the Trust being unable (through failure of works or any other cause) to supply any person with the full area paid for, the deficiency shall be refunded; but the Trust will not be answerable for any damage caused through such deficiency.

 7. Every person applying for water will receive notice from

Every person applying for water will receive notice from the water bailiff on the date on which such water shall be supplied, and no applicant who is the occupier of 320 acres shall (if other applicants are watering) be allowed to water, if by pumping, more than 20 acres, nor, if by gravitation, more than 40 acres, at one turn. A pro rata free will be allowed to be watered in the case of owners or occupiers of holdings of lesser or greater extent, provided that no one shall be limited to a lesser quantity than will water 5 acres of land. Each applicant will be given a supply of water in order of application.

When the water bailiff is of opinion that an applicant's channel is likely to cause delay and waste in the delivery of water, and where the land proposed to be watered is not sufficiently protected to prevent flooding the roads or adjoining lands, he may refuse to outertain any application for water, pending a reference to the Trust at its next meeting, who, if satisfied with the reason given by the water bailiff, may confirm his action, and direct him to supply no more water until the cause of complaint has been removed.
- 9. All outlets, whether their cost of construction has been paid for by the owner or occupier of the land to be watered by such outlet or by the Trust, shall remain under the control of the Trust.
- 10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the water bailiff, and no person other than the water bailiff shall, under any circumstances (unless with his written permission) open any such outlet or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.
- 11. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts.

REGULATION No. 2.

A NY person not a ratepayer of the Trust or not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall take, use, or carry away water from any stand-pipe, drinking tap, water trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every such offence.

2. Every house, tenement, factory, or steam boiler receiving water from the Trust shall have a separate and independent service-pipe connexion with the pipes of the Trust for every such house, tenement, factory, or steam boiler.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two clear days' notice, in writing, to the 1 rust of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of the provisions of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every such breach.

4. The service-pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises of less annual value than Twenty pounds sterling, and over, 3' inch diameter, except where special agreement is made; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer as the Trust may appoint. All service-pipes shall have a stop-cock at the main, with brass ferrule.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied with water from steep of the Trust to the boundary of such la

)

require repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

10. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

11. All water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

12. The fire pings shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed, in writing, by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

13. If water is used by any person supplied by the Trust for any other than domestic purposes, the Trust may, if it thinks fit, require that such person shall provide a meter, and, on receiving notice from the Trust to this effect, such person shall forthwith, at his own cost, cause a proper inster to be affixed.

14. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply and affix such meter within one calendar menth from the date of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day thereafter during which he refuses or neglects to comply with the terms of such notice.

15. Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of the duly authorized officer of the Trust, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being tested by the Trust's officer to be innecurate. No meter shall be affixed unless the diad of same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust.

16. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes, of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fitt

19. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this Regulation, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with this Regulation, and not otherwise.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which under any clause of this Regulation ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust, in addition to prosecuting at law the offender for any such contravention of this Regulation or for the recovery of rates or charges due to it, may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until such person cease to contravene this Regulation, or until he pay his rates or any lawful charge that may be due to the Trust, and the exercise of this power by the Trust shall in no wise relieve such person from paying any rates or charges made by the Trust and then due or at any time thereafter to become due on the lands, houses, or tenements from which the water has been cut off.

21. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any stone, earth, rubbish, dirt, filth, or any foreign matter into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every such breach of this Regulation.

22. If any person bathe in any reservoir or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

23. Any person who shall in any way tamper with, alter, or cause injury to any pipe, lock, cock, valve, work, weir, channel, reservoir, building, or engine the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's works or within any fenced enclosure containing any waterworks belonging to the Trust, without leave in writing from the Trust, shall be liable, for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

24. RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.-No. 3.

The Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under the sum of Twenty shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every vacant piece of land a rate of One shilling in the pound storling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land; provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings

of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land; provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half a mile from such stand-pipe one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling.

G. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust district shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moioties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of July, 1900, and the first moiety of the said rate shall be taken and is hereby deemed to have been paid. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rush-

4. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof at such times, in such order, and, in such manner as the Trust shall direct, and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

5. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by persons authorized by the Trust, and no person who is not so authorized shall, under any circumstances (unless he obtain permission from the Chairman of the Trust, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

6. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of the Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owers, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

7. Any person guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding for any offence the sum of Ten pounds.

8. That the regulation for the sale and distribution of water made by this Trust on the 3rd day of June, 1899, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
