POLICE TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.— REGULATIONS.

THE Lieutenant-Governor in Council, by an Order made on the 2nd day of July, 1900, has rescinded, from the 30th day of June, 1900, the Regulations made on the 31st December, 1894, fixing Rates of Allowances for Travelling Expenses of Officers, Sub-Officers, and Constables of the Police Force, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, such Regulations to have effect from and after the 1st day of July, 1900:—

- (a) Under these Regulations the day shall be reckoned to commence at Six a.m. and end at Twelve midnight; and the night to commence at Twelve midnight and end at Six a.m. But, if unavoidable circumstances necessitate an earlier departure than Six a.m., the day shall be reckoned as commencing from such starting time.
- (b) Members of the Force who claim for an absence of eight hours or more extending past midnight cannot also claim for the night.
- (c) No allowance will be paid under these Regulations for attendance at races, sports, shows, or special duty when suitable board, lodging, refreshment, or money allowance is given.
- (d) In reckoning distance travelled by claimants, four miles by railway and two by public conveyance shall be reckoned as one mile.
- (e) Allowances under sections 6 and 7 will be for periods over three (3) days, and will not, as a rule, be continued beyond two months.

THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—QUARANTINE OF THE S.S. "SOUTH AUSTRALIAN."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act; And whereas the steam-ship *South Australian* has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board a case of the contagious disease bubonic plague: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williams-town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails and cargo may be discharged into lighters, and may after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

This order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 6th April, 1900.

The collection in 1895 was, moreover, more complete than in 1894, especially in the city of Melbourne. The number of establishments returned for 1896, which would not have been included under the old basis, was about 131, employing 2,125 hands (viz., 499 males and 1,626 females), but on the other hand 210 small factories, employing 323 hands (viz., 509 males and 14 females), were rejected. The latter were for the most part establishments which were formerly included for comparative purposes, although their hands had fallen below the prescribed number.

THE MOUTH OF THE BARWON RIVER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (51 Vict. No. 1095) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation made in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid, and bearing date the 24th day of December, 1895, netting was permitted to be carried on in the Barwon River from Ocean Grove Jetty seawards: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation and to make another in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke such Proclamation, and do by this Proclamation define the mouth of the Barwon River to be a line commencing at a point marked by a beacon on the northern extremity of the reef to the northward of Barwon Head; thence extending north 32° west to a post on the foreshore to northward of the said river.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

3. SHIRE OF MALVERN.

By-LAW No. 39.

A By-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 39, for regulating traffic and processions, and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality, and for suppressing nuisances, and providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district, and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the shire so as in any way to obstruct or impede the traffic therein or thereon shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the foot-ways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the foot-way.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street, except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of an omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

6. The driver of any vehicle, of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle, by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic; and if the stopping prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall, upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle, so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. Between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public road-ways or foot-ways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such road-way or foot-way, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

8. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, desist from playing or singing in the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

9. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the president, or, in his absence, the secretary of the shire, and only by route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge at the police station.

10. Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice, in writing, under the hand or by direction of the president, or in his absence or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the shire secretary or the officer in charge of the police stationed at Malvern, any carriage-way, foot-way, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and, if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.

11. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall, as to the placing and otherwise thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.

12. That from and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person, between one half-hour after sunset and the following sunrise, shall, in, upon, or along any of the roads or streets within the Shire of Malvern, drive or ride any vehicle, bicycle, or other velocipede without having a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed at the off side of the front of such vehicle or in front of such bicycle or other velocipede, and lighted. Every person who by any wilful act or default shall be

guilty of any breach of this clause shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Ten shillings.

13. No person shall bring into or cart or carry with carts or other carriages drawn by horses or otherwise within the boundaries of the Shire of Malvern any night-soil, blood, offal, or other matter being offensive to smell or noxious to health, except with the consent under seal of the council of the said shire, and except between the hours of Eleven o'clock post meridian on any day and Six o'clock ante meridian of the next day.

14. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing by-law other than No. 12 shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings.

This by-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1890*, in the *Government Gazette*.
