THE Lieutenant-Governor in Council, by an Order made on the 2nd day of July, 1900, has rescinded, from the 30th day of June, 1900, the Regulations made on the 31st December, 1894, fixing Rates of Allowances for Travelling Expenses of Officers, Sub-Officers, and Constables of the Police Force, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, such Regulations to have effect from and after the 1st day of July, 1900:— REGULATIONS. POLICE TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE. For Officers. For each day on which an officer travels not less than thirty miles on duty, or is necessarily absent from his station on duty not less than eight hours ...
 For each day on which an officer is necessarily absent from his station on duty not less than twelve hours ...
 For each night necessarily absent from his station on duty ... 6 For Sub-Officers and Constables. time.

(b) Members of the Force who claim for an absence of eight hours or more extending past midnight cannot also claim for the night.

(c) No allowance will be paid under these Regulations for attendance at races, sports, shows, or special duty when suitable board, lodging, refreshment, or money allowance is given.

(d) In reckoning distance travelled by claimants, four miles by railway and two by public conveyance shall be reckoned as one mile.

(e) Allowances under sections 6 and 7 will be for periods over three (3) days, and will not, as a rule, be continued beyond two months.

THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—QUARANTINE OF THE S.S. "SOUTH AUSTRALIAN."

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship South Australian has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board a case of the contagious disease bubonic plaque: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Auchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmath-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails and cargo may be discharged into lighters, and may after careful disinfection under the supervision; and, further, that are open provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship,

This order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 6th April, 1900.

WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act 1890 [51] Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be pub ished in the Government Gazette, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation made in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid, and bearing date the 24th day of December, 1895, netting was permitted to be carried on in the Barwon River from Ocean Grove 1etty seawards: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation and to make another in lien thereof: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke such Proclamation, and do by this Proclamation define the mouth of the Barwon River to be a line commencing at a point marked by a beacon on the northern extremity of the reef to the northward of Barwon Head; thence extending north 32° west to a post on the foreshore to northward of the said river.

way to obstruct of inspect the traine therein or detection stand discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the foot-ways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or oranibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street, except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of an omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other committees of hackney carriage in competition against or to the amoyance of any other pieson.

Any vehicle pieson.

Any vehicle, of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether privato or public, before stopping the same in any carriage way for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle, by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic; and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, to interrupt or delay traffic, he shall, upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle, so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, or so as to discontinue such interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public road-ways or foot-ways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such road-way or foot-way whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

8. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, desist from pla

guilty of any breach of this clause shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Ten shillings.

13. No person shall bring into or cart or carry with carts or other carriages drawn by horses or otherwise within the boundaries of the Shire of Malvern any night-soil, blood, offal, or other matter being offensive to smell or noxious to health, except with the consent under seal of the council of the said shire, and except between the hours of Eleven o'clock post meridian on any day and Six o'clock ante meridian of the next day.

meridian on any day and only any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing by law other than No. 12 shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings. This by-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the Local Covernment Act 1890, in the Government Gazette.
