NEW TOWER AND ALTERATION OF GATCOMBE HEAD LIGHTHOUSE, AND ESTABLISHMENT OF LEADING LIGHTS FOR SOUTH CHANNEL, PORT CURTIS.

It is intended to erect a new tower at Gatcombe Head, about 450 feet north by east of the present tower. The tower will be 38 feet high, circular in shape, and painted white, with a red dome. The light will be at an elevation of 122 feet above high water, and will be visible for 13 miles from a ship's deck in clear weather.

The red sector seawards will be discontinued. The light will be white between the bearings S. 29° W. and N. 70° W., also between N. 45° W. and N. 21° E.; red between N. 21° E. and N. 43° E.; to the northward of the latter bearing it will be white until obscured by the land, and between the bearings of N. 70° W. and N. 45° W. it will also be obscured.

LEADING LIGHTS, SOUTH CHANNEL.

Near the mouth of the Boyne River two leading lights will be shown, the front light from a skeleton tower 30 feet high, having a total elevation of 66 feet above high water, and the back light from a small square building situated on a hill at the back, at a total elevation of 121 feet above high water. Both structures

are painted white, and the distance between them is 5,750 feet. The lights on these structures will be 4th order holophotes, and will be visible 12 and 14½ miles respectively. These lights, forming the first lead, bear when in line S. 75° W.

The second line of leading lights is placed on the slope of the hill on the west side of Gatecombe Head. The front light is in a small house at an elevation of 32 feet above high water, and the back light on a skeleton tower 30 feet high, the total elevation of the light being 66 feet above high water.

It is anticipated that the lights for the South Channel will be ready for exhibition in August. Instructions for using the lights and further notice will be issued before they are exhibited.

INNER ROUTE, TORRES STRAIT.

NEW LIGHT-HOUSE, PIPON ISLANDS, AND REMOVAL OF CHANNEL ROCK LIGHT-SHIP.

It is intended to erect a skeleton iron tower on the South Islet of the Pipon Island Group carrying a lantern with a 4th order dioptric light. The tower will be 60 feet high and the focal plane 55 feet above high water. The skeleton structure will be painted red, and the lantern white, with a red dome. The light will be visible through an arc of 160 degrees, white between bearings of N. 72° W. THE HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 3.

STANDING ORDERS FOR REGULATING AND APPOINTING THE PLACE, AND HOUR OF MEETINGS OF "THE HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST," AND PROVIDING FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS THEREAT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. In all cases not provided for by the above-mentioned Act of the Parliament of Victoria or by this Regulation, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Commissioners.

2. Place, hour, and adjournment of meetings.—Meetings of the Commissioners shall be held periodically at the Town Hall, Hamilton, on every first and third Friday in the month, at the hour of Eight o'clock p.m., or on such other days and at such other time as may be by them hereafter determined, and the Commissioners may from time to time by adjournment from any such meeting, or from any subsequent adjournment thereof, meet together at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

3. Meetings, special.—A special meeting of the Commissioners may, or shall, be summoned at any time in case of emergency, or otherwise, by the Secretary, under direction of the Chairman, or by the Chairman or Secretary, upon receiving a requisition, in writing, under the hand of at least two Commissioners, stating the business required to be transacted at such meeting, and such special meeting shall be called, by notice to be delivered or addressed, as provided in clause 6, at least twenty-four hours prior to the time appointed for such meeting to take place, such notice to state the particular business to be transacted, and no other business than that set forth in such requisition or notice shall be transacted at any such meeting, and such meeting may be adjourned from time to time as provided in clause 2.

4. Quorum of Commissioners.—All powers vested in a Waterworks Trust may be exercised by one-half the whole number or more of such Commissioners at any meeting of Commissioners holden in pursuance of this Regulation, and no business shall be transacted at any such meeting unless at least one-half of the whole number of the Commissioners shall be present at any such meeting. If at any meeting there shall not be that number present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for such meeting, then it shall be lawful for the Commissioners present, or the major part of them, or any one Commissioner, if only one be present, to adjourn such meeting until another day, and if no Commissioner shall be present then it shall be lawful for the Secretary to adjourn the meeting to another day.

5. Majority to decide.—All questions at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the Commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote in addition to his vote as a Commissioner.

6. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each Commissioner, one clear day at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held, except in cases of emergency, when a special meeting may be called as hereinbefore provided.

7. Meetings, resolutions at, not to be revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting; nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to; or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

8. Business, &c., order of.—Minutes.—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman of such meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.

9. Order of Business.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
5. Presentation of reports of Committees.
6. Payments.
7. Ordinary business.
8. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
9. Other motions of which previous notice had been given.
10. Notice of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

10. Titles, Official.—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman, or Commissioner, as the case may require.

11. Who to speak.—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

12. Chairman to rise while addressing meeting.—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

13. Commissioners not to speak twice on same question.—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

14. Points of order.—The Chairman of the meeting, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

15. Commissioners not to digress nor impute improper motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on any Commissioner or Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections as the case may be.

16. A Commissioner, called to order by the Chairman of the meeting, shall immediately sit down unless permitted by the Chairman to explain.

17. Persons not Commissioners to leave when requested.—No person not being a Commissioner, who having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when lawfully requested by the Chairman so to do.

18. Call of the Commissioners.—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

19. Documents to be produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Commissioners applying to the question under discussion.

20. Motions, amendments, and notice thereof.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Secretary at the close of the meeting of Commissioners, or if not given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the day upon which the next meeting of Commissioners is to take place; and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received, and on receipt of same shall forthwith notify in writing to each of the Commissioners that such notice has been given.

21. No motion without notice.—If two Commissioners object, no member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

22. Motions on petitions, &c.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of Commissioners after that at which it has been presented. No circumstances shall be deemed urgent unless the Commissioners present at such meeting shall unanimously determine and declare the same to be so.

23. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

24. Motions not to be proceeded with in absence of mover.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

25. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

26. Mover of motion or amendment not to be interrupted.—Any Commissioner desirous of moving a resolution or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of by the Chairman, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

27. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

28. Leave to be obtained before motion withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

29. Motions to be seconded prior to discussion.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

30. Mover and not the seconder held to have spoken.—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

31. Motions to be in writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. Amendments re motion in cases.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. Amendment to become the question.—If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

34. Second amendment may be moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.

35. Right of mover to reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment; shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same motion or amendment unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. Adjournment, motion for.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting of the Commissioners, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Protest, Commissioners may.—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner; and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

38. Lost questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. Order of the day to be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote and a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

41. Questions to be put.—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

42. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Commissioners shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. Contents of petitions.—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners; and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

44. Name at beginning of petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Petitions to be in writing.—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the Petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. How signed.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, &c., to be attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Presentation of petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of a prayer thereof.

49. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners, in support of any petition or otherwise, must send in an application in writing to the Secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

50. Committees.—There shall be two permanent Committees of the Commissioners, one to be called the Works Committee, to consist of five Commissioners, three to form a quorum; and the other to be called the Finance Committee, to consist of five members including the Chairman, three to form a quorum. The Chairman shall be a member of all Committees.

51. Minutes of Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive

order, shall be entered in the Committees' minute-book, and being signed by the Chairman, shall be presented to the Commissioners; and the Secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the Committees.

52. Committees to be convened.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee at any time by order of the Commissioners, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of a Committee.

53. Cheques to be signed.—That three members of the Finance Committee shall sign the cheques, and the same shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

54. Appointment to permanent office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

55. Salaries to be fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

56. Commissioner, &c., not to be surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

57. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

58. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.

59. Cost of security.—The cost of preparing the security to be given for the faithful performance of any duties by any officer of the Trust, and the premium payable in respect of such security, shall in all cases, unless otherwise ordered by a resolution of the Trust, be borne by the Trust.

60. Common seal.—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each Commissioner shall keep a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman, or in his absence two Commissioners, be present.

61. Addresses to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

62. Suspension of regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and regulations herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice being duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

63. Penalty.—Every person who shall offend against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST— RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District the water rate for the year 1900 shall be Two shillings in the One pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1899-1900, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Ten pounds, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 120 of the *Water Act 1890*. The minimum charge on vacant lands shall be Five shillings.

2. All rates and charges on lands and tenements not having any water meters affixed shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on 1st January and 1st July, 1900; and all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed payments shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1900. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's Offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

THE BUBONIC PLAGUE ON BOARD THE S.S. "SOUTH AUSTRALIAN."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same; and whereas the steamship or vessel *South Australian* arrived in Victorian waters, on 6th April, 1900, having on board a case of the contagious disease bubonic plague; And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steamship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steamship except only that her mails and cargo may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steamship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steamship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers, luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steamship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

This Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 6th April, 1900.

WHEREAS by the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1413) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he may think expedient for securing the safety of the persons and property of the public from injury from fire or otherwise, and may, by any regulation amend or repeal any condition contained in any Order in relation thereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following further Regulations for the safety of the public in cases where the pressure of a supply of electric energy delivered to any consumer exceeds 250 volts at any pair of terminals, that is to say:—

(1) The frame and shaft of every electric motor intended to be worked at the pressure specified in this Order shall be efficiently connected with earth.

(2) The electric lines forming the connexions to motors or otherwise in connexion with this supply, and placed upon the aforesaid premises of the consumer, shall be, as far as practicable, completely enclosed in strong metal casing efficiently connected with earth.

(3) The supply to every motor shall be controlled by means of an efficient cut-off switch, placed in such a position as to be easily handled by the person in charge of the motor, and connected so that by its means all pressure can be cut off from the motor itself, and from any regulating switch resistance or other device in connexion therewith.

Efficient fuses, or other automatic cut-outs, shall also be provided, so as to protect the branch circuit on each side of every motor from excess of current.

The above-mentioned switches and cut-outs shall be so enclosed and protected that there shall be no danger of any shock being obtained in the ordinary handling thereof, or of any fire being caused by their normal or abnormal action.

(4) A notice shall be fixed in a conspicuous position at every motor and switchboard in connexion with this supply forbidding unauthorized persons to touch the motors or apparatus.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Orders and Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to re-cind same: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 11th day of November, 1890, Regulations were made for the introduction of stock into Victoria and for other purposes: And whereas it is desirable to amend such Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows, that is to say:—

The word "six" in the tenth and twelfth lines of clause 15, and whenever it occurs in clauses 17 and 23 of the Order in Council of the 11th November, 1890, herein referred to, is hereby repealed, and the word "three" is substituted in lieu thereof.

The words "or to moor or keep moored the said vessel at a distance of more than 100 yards from the shore, and from any pier or wharf," occurring in section 23 of the said Order, are hereby repealed, and the following words are added to the last paragraph of the said section, viz:—"Any intercolonial trading vessel which has received on board stock from any place outside the Australian Colonies and New Zealand shall be deemed to be an 'unclean' vessel for a period of thirty days after the landing of such stock in any port in the colonies of Australia and New Zealand, and stock shipped on board such vessel for introduction into Victoria within that period shall be subject to the like quarantine in the manner and subject to the same conditions as is for the time being provided for the case of foreign stock of the same kind."

After the word "sheep," in the seventh line of the Seventh Schedule to the aforesaid Order, the following is hereby added:—"And to £2 10s. for every pig." And it is hereby ordered that the other provisions of the said Schedule shall apply to pigs as well as to cattle and sheep.

The whole of the words and figures after the word "stock:" in the Twelfth Schedule of the aforesaid Order are hereby repealed, and the following words and figures are substituted in place thereof:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, KNOWN AS THE "CENTRAL PARK," IN THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation, known as the "Central Park," in section 24, Borough of Stawell, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty (50) in any one year, as the reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or shows, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the reserve without the written consent of the committee of management.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the reserve, or leave or roll stones therein, or pollute any water in the reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

4. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the reserve, or throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

5. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the reserve, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without having first obtained the written permission of the committee of management, and no person shall light any fires in the reserve without the special permission, in writing, of the committee of management.

6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog for coursing or other purposes, or on days on which fêtes, sports, or shows are held; and all dogs so brought in and all goats and poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE YAMBUK TOWN COMMON, IN THE SHIRE OF BELFAST.

IN pursuance of the Regulations Relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 4th day of July, 1899, the Council of the Shire of Belfast, having drafted the following Regulations for Management of the Yambuk Town Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers and holders of miners' rights, business licences or carriers' licences may respectively depasture on the common four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.
 2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable monthly in advance:—
For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per month.
For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer, One shilling (1s.) per month.
For every sheep or goat, Fourpence (4d.) per month.
Foals at foot and calves (under six months old) with mothers, Free.
 4. Sheep or goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.
 5. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.
 6. Persons wishing to depasture stock on the common shall supply the brands of such stock to the herdsman.
 7. All stock placed on the common shall be branded by the owners with a legible brand.
 8. All stock which may at any time die upon the common shall be buried by the owners within 24 hours after notice thereof from the herdsman.
 9. All unregistered stock depasturing on the common shall be liable to be impounded.
 10. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common.
 11. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the sanction, in writing, of the managers.
- Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH, CARLTON.—POWER TO DISPOSE OF SITE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Roman Catholic Church in Victoria, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Lieutenant-Governor, the same was allowed by him on the sixteenth day of July, 1900, and the following is the form in which such Statement of Trusts has been allowed:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:—
