ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred thousand two hundred and fifteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and One thousand nine hundred and one."

"An Act to provide for a Victorian Naval Contingent for service with Her Majesty's Royal Navy or Army in China."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The births of 1,063 children, viz., 540 boys and 523 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. Comparing the month of June, 1900, with the corresponding month of last year, it will be found that deaths from zymotic diseases diminished from 39 to 16, those from developmental diseases from 43 to 32, from local diseases from 315 to 300, and those from ill-defined and not specified causes from 20 to 14; but, on the other hand, that deaths from violence increased from 22 to 34, whilst those caused by para-itic, dictic, and constitutional diseases were about equal at both periods. In the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 5 to 1, those from diphtheria from 6 to 2, from typhoid (enterio) fever from 9 to 2, from diarrhead diseases from 4 to 1, and from septic diseases from 5 to 1. In the constitutional class deaths from cancer rose from 20 to 34, and from phthisis from 38 to 48; but there was a decrease from 12 to 6 in the case of scrofula, and from 5 to 2 in that of rheumatism. In the developmental class there was a decrease from 15 to 13 in the deaths from premature birth, and from 20 to 14 in those from old age. Under local diseases the chief decreases were from 81 to 60 in the deaths from diseases of the circulatory system, from 7 to 2 in those of the generative system, and from 5 to 1 in those from the integumentary system, which were party counterbalanced by small increases under the other sub-classes. It will be specially noticed that one death was set down to the dreaded epidemic disease known as the "Bubonic Plague," being the first case over registered in Melbourne and Suburbs, and the second in the colony.*

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first six months of 1800, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.







Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

Waterproefing.—The waterproofing must consist of a layer of best quality fully vulcanized para rubber, white or of light colour, containing not more than 10 per cent. of foreign matter and no free sulphur; must be of uniform thickness, free from thin spots, rendering the cloth so watertight that water to the depth of 6 inches standing in it for 24 hours will not percolate through; and must weigh not less than 6 cances per square yard.

Inner living.—The inner lining must be all wool and of the same texture and weight as the outer fabric.

The trade system of measurement will be adopted, viz., 36 inches to the yard, with the thumb measurement given in.

The Chief Commissioner of Police is authorized to inflict a fine of £5 per day if supplies are not delivered within four months of the date of the first order, and within two months for subsequent orders; such fine to be deducted from any money due, or that may be falling due, to the contractor, or from the security money.

The colour of the cloth is to be true to sample, and is to be fast in shade, even if in this respect the sample may be faulty.

All cloth may be submitted to such tests as may be deemed proper for the purpose of ascertaining that it is in accordance with pattern and specification, and a portion not exceeding 9 inches in length may be cut off from any supply, as often as may be considered necessary, for such testing purposes.
