## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

'An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred thousand two hundred and fifteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and One thousand nine hundred and one.'

'An Act to provide for a Victorian Naval Contingent for service with Her Majesty's Royal Navy or Army in China.'

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT, AND THURSDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Rutherglen;

## GOVERNMENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Saturday, the 28th July instant, from Officers of the Public Service who are qualified, for appointment to the position of Government Medical Officer, Chief Secretary's Department.

Salary:—£850 a year.

The duties of the office are—

1. To act as medical officer at the Melbourne Gaol—this includes medical attendance on warders, holding *post-mortem* examinations, certifying in cases where prisoners are insane;
2. To act as medical officer to the Industrial School and Reformatory, Royal Park;
3. To act as medical adviser to all the Government Departments, including the Railways, and to medically examine candidates for employment in the Police Force and Railway Service, and to report as to injuries sustained by railway or other officers while on duty;
4. To examine and report for the Police on cases of alleged criminal or indecent assault;
5. To report as to officers away from duty suspected of intemperance; and
6. To act as medical examiner of patients in the Asylums for the Insane under Division 2 of Part III. of the Lunacy Act.

Generally to advise the Government on medical subjects.

The qualifications necessary are to have a good knowledge of general medical practice, and to have some practical knowledge of lunacy.

The duties necessitate the medical officer residing near the Melbourne Gaol.

## FINAL NOTICE.—LIGHT ON BATHURST POINT, ROTTNESST ISLAND.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that on and after Saturday, 1st September, 1900, a light will be exhibited from the new light-house on Bathurst Point, Rottneest Island.

The light will be white, and, as already advertised, will be visible from seaward between the bearings of S. 82° E. through South and West to N. 59° W., and will be visible to an observer 15 nautical miles in clear weather.

The light is a Fixed Dioptric of the Second Order, and will be exhibited from a stone tower of a natural grey colour, the height of focal plane above high water being 98 feet.

The births of 1,063 children, viz., 540 boys and 523 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. The number was, with one exception, June, 1898, the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years; and was, moreover, 245 below the average of the month during that period, or 284 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in June numbered 508, viz., 280 of males and 228 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 555, or 109 per cent., as against 112 per cent. in June, 1899, and 116 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 40 smaller than in June, 1899, and, with one exception, June, 1894, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; it was also 93 below the average of June during the last ten years, or 116 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.07, and of deaths registered to 12.94 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 30.09 and 14.19 respectively, and during the last ten years of 34.29 and 15.93 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.30.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 67.5° on the 4th, and the lowest was 36.4° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (49.9°) was three-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.4°) took place on the 13th, and the least range (6.8°) on the 2nd. The mean daily range was 13.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.292 inches on the 7th, and the lowest was 29.214 inches on the 23rd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.886 inches) was about one-ninth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 1.76 inches, which was 1.23 inches lower than in June, 1899, and .39 of an inch below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on four days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was .81.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 19 per cent. to that mortality, as against 22 per cent. in June, 1899; 27 per cent. in June, 1898; 25 per cent. in June, 1897; 25 per cent. in June, 1896; 21 per cent. in June, 1895; and 28 per cent. in June, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 75, as compared with 87 in June, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was exceptionally low, being only 71 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 75 in June, 1899; 82 in June, 1898; 93 in June, 1897; 87 in June, 1896; 73 in June, 1895; 85 in June, 1894; 95 in June, 1893; 84 in June, 1892; 91 in June, 1891; and 81 in June, 1890.

Sixty-two persons—as against 63 in June, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a male of no occupation, aged 75, died of gout; a clerk, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 75, of apoplexy; a compositor, aged 75, of syncope; a female aged 75, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 75, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of pericarditis; a gentleman, aged 77, of phthisis; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of insanity; a labourer, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of pleuro-pneumonia; a jeweller, aged 78, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 78, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of kidney disease; a gentleman and a female, each aged 79, of cancer; a squatter and a female, each aged 79, of apoplexy; a female, aged 79, of heart disease; a miner and two females, each aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 80, of cerebral hemorrhage; a seaman, aged 80, of disease of the spine; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 80, of enteritis; two females, each aged 80, of Bright's disease and ulcer of leg respectively; a contractor, aged 80, of suffocation, resulting from the escape of gas; a female, aged 81, of softening of the brain; a labourer, aged 81, of coma; a printer, aged 81, of syncope; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 81, of uræmia; a gentleman, aged 81, of cystitis; a gardener, aged 82, of cancer; two females, each aged 82, of bronchitis and pneumonia respectively; a male of occupation unknown, aged 82, of cirrhosis of liver; a quarryman, aged 84, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of cerebral hemorrhage; a male of occupation unknown, aged 85, of uræmia; a male of no occupation, aged 87, of gastritis; another, aged 88, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 88, of congestion of the lungs; two females, aged 90 and 103 respectively, of cerebral hemorrhage and senile gangrene respectively; a clergyman, aged 77, a miner, aged 78, a gentleman, aged 80, a labourer and a female, each aged 81, a female, aged 82, a carpenter, aged 83, a gardener, aged 84, and four females, aged 85, 87, 90, and 90 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-four of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 22 in June, 1899—were from external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A clerk, aged 34, was killed by being crushed between the platform and a railway train; a cabman, aged 48, was passed over by a tram-car; a carpenter, aged 22, was killed by a fall, whilst alighting from a tram-car; a contractor, aged 36, and a driver, aged 37, died of fracture of the skull, and a cab-driver, aged 74, of injuries, caused in every case by a fall from a cart; a boy, aged 7, of injuries through being passed over by a delivery van; a carpenter, aged 33, of injury to the spine, the result of a fall from a building; a labourer, aged 43, of injuries caused by a fall from a chimney; a labourer, aged 38, of a wound on the thigh, through falling on an axe; a female child, aged 18 months, and a male child, aged 3 years, of lurns; a girl, aged 10, of ptomaine poisoning; a boy, aged 9, was drowned in Merri Creek, and a boy, aged 11, in the Saltwater River; six persons also were found drowned, viz., a musician, aged 33, a farmer, aged 35, a blacksmith, aged 46, and a cook, aged 55, in the River Yarra, a tailor, aged 74, in Albert Park Lake, and a labourer, aged 37, in Hobson's Bay; two new-born female infants were suffocated at birth (known to be accidental in one case); also a female, aged 55, by food getting into air passages; and a contractor, aged 80, by an escape of gas. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant, who was suffocated, and a female infant, aged four weeks, who died of starvation from improper feeding, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the former, and of manslaughter in the latter case; and a new-born male infant, who was found dead, the cause being ascertained to be suffocation (probably murder). The suicidal deaths were those of a tailor, aged 20, who shot himself; a coachman, aged 45, and a female, aged 56, who poisoned themselves with strychnine; a carriage cleaner, aged 32, who drowned himself; a marine store dealer, aged 60, and a stonemason, aged 73, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and forty-six deaths, or 29 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—63 in the Melbourne, 14 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 5 in the Women's, 10 in the Children's, 5 in the Homœopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 7 in the Metropolitan and 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 9 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 1 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 99, of which 54, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 45, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 75 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 4 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 1 at the age of four years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 409. Of these 226, or 55 per cent., were males, and 183, or 45 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 38 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 48 were between seventy and seventy-five, 25 were between seventy-five and eighty, 26 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of 103.

Comparing the month of June, 1900, with the corresponding month of last year, it will be found that deaths from zymotic diseases diminished from 39 to 16, those from developmental diseases from 43 to 32, from local diseases from 315 to 300, and those from ill-defined and not specified causes from 20 to 14; but, on the other hand, that deaths from violence increased from 22 to 34, whilst those caused by parasitic, dietic, and constitutional diseases were about equal at both periods. In the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 5 to 1, those from diphtheria from 6 to 2, from typhoid (enteric) fever from 9 to 2, from diarrhæal diseases from 4 to 1, and from septic diseases from 5 to 1. In the constitutional class deaths from cancer rose from 29 to 34, and from phthisis from 38 to 48; but there was a decrease from 12 to 6 in the case of scrofula, and from 5 to 2 in that of rheumatism. In the developmental class there was a decrease from 15 to 13 in the deaths from premature birth, and from 20 to 14 in those from old age. Under local diseases the chief decreases were from 81 to 60 in the deaths from diseases of the circulatory system, from 7 to 2 in those of the generative system, and from 5 to 1 in those from the integumentary system, which were partly counterbalanced by small increases under the other sub-classes. It will be specially noticed that one death was set down to the dreaded epidemic disease known as the "Bubonic Plague," being the first case ever registered in Melbourne and Suburbs, and the second in the colony.\*

\* In Sydney and Suburbs there were 16 deaths from the plague in June, making a total of 34 deaths since January last.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first six months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was much below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1900.

THE births of 68 boys and 47 girls, or in all of 105 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June. Of these 35 occurred in Ballarat East, 60 in Ballarat West, 7 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 13 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 155, viz., 81 of boys and 74 of girls.

The deaths registered in June numbered 75, viz., 37 of males and 38 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 30. In May the recorded deaths numbered 60; in June, 1899, they numbered 68; in June, 1898, they numbered 73; in June, 1897, they numbered 55; in June, 1896, they numbered 70; in June, 1895, they numbered 73; in June, 1894, they numbered 67; in June, 1893, they numbered 67; in June, 1892, they numbered 72; in June, 1891, they numbered 57; and in June, 1890, they numbered 65.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 49 per cent.; females, 51 per cent.; under five years, 24 per cent.; over five years, 76 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 53 and 47 per cent.; under and over five years, 27 and 73 per cent. respectively.

Seventeen deaths, or 23 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 1; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Lunatic Asylum, 3.

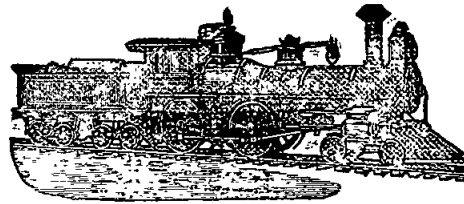

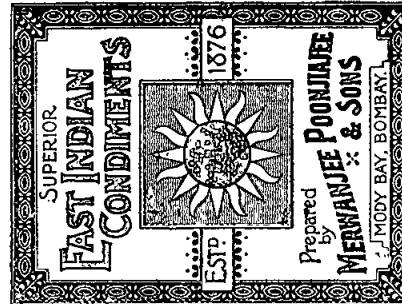

All hay, grain, chaff, corn, and produce shops within the municipal district of the Town of Essendon shall be closed on Saturday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

No. 1099) it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and that all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of Part I. of the said Act: And whereas it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*; and that if no counter petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and that they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as The Wycheproof Cottage Hospital, in the colony of Victoria, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary

within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare the contributors for the time being to the institution aforesaid to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of

THE WYCHEPROOF HOSPITAL INCORPORATED.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

On a conditional purchase lease application a deposit equal to the two (2) first instalments of purchase money, together with fees (including survey charge) must be paid within fourteen days after an allotment has been recommended.
