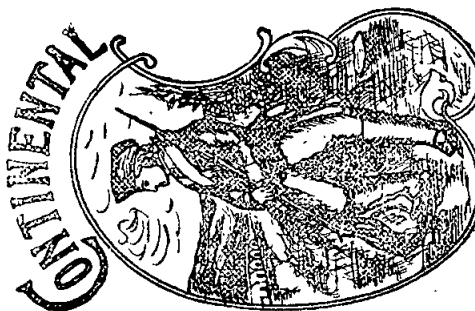

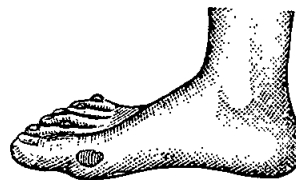

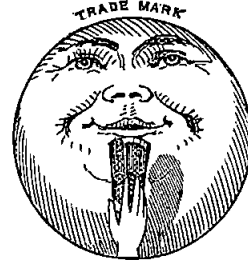

WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following Regulations, viz. :—

Rate for supply for domestic purposes.—The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes is hereby determined as follows (that is to say) :—

Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and a preliminary payment of Ten shillings must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

Meters to be tested and approved.—No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed and approved, lead connexion made above ground in a conveniently-accessible position and properly protected.

Where meter ceases registering, &c., average may be charged.—If any meter in use ceases registering or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and, until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

Services to be separate, except by permission.—Excepting with the permission of the Trust, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may, in special cases, consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-service shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Extensions subject to consent of the Trust.—No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

Service-pipes to be repaired by owner or occupier: Penalty for refusal or neglect to repair service.—The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner shall upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

Waste of water.—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust, and the Trust may stop such waste by cutting service-pipe or otherwise.

Water not to be used or supplied without written authority.—Any person receiving water from the Trust who, without the written permission of the Trust, shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Notice of work proposed, to be given.—Any person who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, or work the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Cisterns and tanks.—No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Trust.

Notice to lay service, &c., to be given: Material to be approved and work inspected.—Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Trust, of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

Lead piping: Specification of material to be used.—Galvanized iron piping. Lead piping shall be of the following weights :—

and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services, except with the written consent of the Trust.

Maximum tappings without clip.—The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows :—

For 3" and 4" pipes, $\frac{3}{4}$ inch tapping
For 5" pipes, 1 inch tapping.

Connexions: brass couplings.—All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

Street watering to be by permission.—No person other than an employé of the municipality shall, without the written authority of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Consent of Trust: Notices to be addressed to Secretary: Conditions as to notice: Consent may be given by the Secretary: Consent to be reported to Committee.—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Trust and delivered at his office within such time as may be mentioned in the Water Acts, or in this Regulation, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done nor work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Secretary, who shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust with a view to report thereof for confirmation.

Penalties.—For every offence against any provision of this Regulation for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed the offender shall upon conviction be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Officers of Trust may enter dwellings, &c.—The officers of the Trust shall have power between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon to enter any house, buildings, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise in order to inspect the meters, pipes, instruments, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinders such officers from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may between the hours of Nine in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon enter any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling, house, or premises for the purpose aforesaid or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the waters supplied by it from such house or other premises. Any person interfering with any supply cut off for this offence, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Allotments now rated at the minimum of Ten shillings shall be supplied with water by meter only. Such quantity which at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of minimum rate shall be allowed. All water in excess of that to be paid for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of The Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the urban district of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eight pence or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount equal to Seven and a half pence per centum per annum, or One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eight pence sterling annual value; according to the municipal valuation; an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1900, from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

For street water-troughs, Twenty shillings per year. All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse power of such steam-boiler.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case which water is supplied by measure shall be:—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

2. If for other than domestic purposes only 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police station, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, slaw-yards, cricket-ground, bowling-green, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year One thousand nine hundred.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on them by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1900, commencing on the 1st day of January and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1900.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover the said rates.

WHEREAS by Part V. of the *Water Act 1890* (51 Vict. No. 1156), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for prescribing rates of charges for the use of the water supplied from any works constructed under the authority of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act, and the manner and conditions in and upon which such water shall be used, and for determining the limits of the district to be rated for any such works, and for making and levying a water rate upon all or some of the lands and tenements within such district (except hospitals, benevolent institutions, buildings used exclusively for public charitable purposes, churches, chapels, and other buildings used exclusively for public worship, the dwellings of ministers of religious denominations, and buildings used as schools and receiving aid from the Government or otherwise of a public character), and for fixing the amount of such water rate; and the mode and conditions of levying and collecting the same, and generally for any or all of the purposes for which the Board of Land and Works is empowered by Division 1 of the said Part of the said Act to make by-laws relating to water supply: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order that the valuation of lands and tenements within the Castlemaine and Bendigo (Sandhurst) District (Item 1 of the Seventh Schedule to the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid), for the purpose of making and levying a water rate during the financial year 1900-1901, shall be the valuation of such lands and tenements during the municipal year 1899-1900 by the corporation or council of any town, borough, or shire in which such lands or tenements are situated.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Glenelg has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate certain roads in the parishes of Wando, Bruk Bruk, and Casterton in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the roads defined in the following description to be public highways (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is also further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All orders for supplies will emanate from the department requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

3. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within the time allowed as per schedule, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivering, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 2, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

5. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Controller of Naval and Military Stores, or such other officer as may be authorized to accept delivery. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such goods may be returned to the contractor.

6. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 3.

7. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the goods are not of proper quality they must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which they, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances, except those mentioned in clause 12, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. Making a Rate for Water Supply purposes.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell doth hereby, in exercise of the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890*, Part VI., make the following rate from the first day of January, 1900, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of the Borough of Stawell, that is to say:—

- Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- Behaving improperly or riotously.
- Remaining on the reserve, or any part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the reserve.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
