Section 125 of Act 1098.

EXHIBITION OF LIGHT ON EAST ISLAND, NEAR EAST CAPE, NORTH ISLAND, N.Z.

With reference to preliminary notices No. 32 of 1898 and No. 41 of 1899, issued by this Department, it is hereby notified that on and after Thursday, the 9th August, 1900, a light will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise from the light-house which has been erected on East Island, near East Cape, on the east coast of the North Island of New Zealand. The position and characteristics are as follows:—

The site of the light is in latitude 37° 4' south, and longitude 178° 36' east, as measured from the Admiralty chart.

The tower is constructed of cast iron. The total height from the bottom of the base to the top of the lantern is 69 feet, and it is painted white.

The light will be 362 feet above the level of the sea at high water. It is a dioptric revolving white light of the second order, showing a white flash at intervals of ten seconds. It will be visible seaward over an arc of 280 degrees of the horizon, or as far round as the land will allow, and in ordinary clear weather it will be seen 22 nautical miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above sea-level.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

THE Furniture Board has fixed the 20th August, 1900, as the date from which the following Determination of the Board shall come into force:—

That all previous determinations relating to the furniture trade shall be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this present determination comes into force and is operative.

ADULT MALES.—WAGES.

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture usually made or partly prepared by cabinetmakers, chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, french polishers, and wood turners shall be One shilling per hour, or Two pounds eight shillings for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

MALE APPRENTICES.—NUMBER.

That the number or proportionate number of male apprentices who may be employed in the furniture trade within any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be one such apprentice to every four persons or fraction of four persons employed in the furniture trade within any such factory or work-room or shop or place receiving not less than the minimum wage of One shilling per hour, or Two pounds eight shillings for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

MALE APPRENTICES.—WAGES.

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to male apprentices employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any articles of furniture shall be as follows:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.
- (b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.
2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—
- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.
- (b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.
3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.
 5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.
 6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
 - (2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
 - (3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A.B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

NOTE.—As only a part of the potato crop, viz., 7,875 acres, had been dug when the statistics were collected, an estimate has been made of the remainder of the yield, based on averages deduced from actual information received, in response to circulars, from the principal growers in each shire. The average of the 7,875 acres dug prior to the general collection of the statistics was 3.66 tons per acre; and that of 8,252 acres, returned by principal growers after such collection, was 2.69 tons per acre, giving a general average for the whole season of 3.13 tons per acre. Hence the estimate of the total produce is based on the average yield of 16,127 acres—or, nearly three-tenths of the whole area.

2. BY-LAWS.

By-laws of the Omeo Hospital made by the Committee thereof, and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors specially convened for that purpose on 21st July, 1900.

THE By-laws till now existing shall be and are hereby repealed.

OBJECT.

1. The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical relief to poor persons requiring it, and to casualties.

CONSTITUTION.

2. The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, subscribers, and contributors.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

3. Life governors, life subscribers, governors for one year, and contributors shall be eligible to sit on committee, with the privileges of voting at all general, special, and adjourned meetings of governors and contributors, and with power to recommend patients according to the undermentioned scale:-

Life governors—Three in-patients or six out-patients annually.

Life subscribers—Two in-patients or four out-patients annually.

Governors for one year—Ten in-patients or twenty out-patients annually.

Contributors—One in-patient and two out-patients annually.

£25 personal contribution in one year shall constitute a life governor.

£20 personal contribution in one year, life subscriber.

£40 donation by society, association, or company shall entitle same to nominate life governor.

£15 donation by society, association, or company to nominate governor for one year.

£30 first-named executor under will—Life subscriber.

£1 yearly subscription—Contributor.

Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital irrespective of subscriptions may be elected honorary life governors at any general meeting of subscribers, on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to all the privileges appertaining to the position of life governor.

4. Ministers of religion, employers, or any person collecting and persons forwarding donations from public bodies or proceeds of public gatherings or entertainments, shall receive one member's ticket for every Five pounds collected, provided they have not availed themselves of the position of governors, and shall, if desired, further receive one printed admission ticket for each pound so collected.

5. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription be paid, and no governor or contributor will be entitled to any privilege until his or her subscription be paid.

6. Life and annual governors, life and annual subscribers, all honorary officers, and other contributors of £1 and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of governors and contributors to the hospital. No person shall vote as a governor or contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

7. At all meetings of contributors the president, one of the vice-presidents or treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

8. The annual meeting of the contributors to the hospital shall be held on the third Saturday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes, subject to the rules hereinafter set forth:—

- (a) The election of responsible medical officer of the institution for the year.
- (b) The election of honorary and honorary consulting medical and surgical officers and auditors for the year.
- (c) The election of members of the committee of management.
- (d) The transaction of any other business of which due notice shall have been given or that may arise at such meeting.

9. At all general meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within one hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

10. It shall be competent for the committee of management or any five or more contributors, by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summons a special meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every meeting shall be called by the secretary or three members of committee.

11. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot, subject to the following provisions:—

- (a) For all contested elections for members of the committee of management and for the office of responsible medical officer to the institution, a ballot-paper shall be forwarded by post to each governor, subscriber, or contributor whose subscription shall be in force at the date of such annual meeting, such ballot-paper to bear the seal of the hospital, and to be returned duly marked to the secretary within twenty-one days from the date of such annual meeting.
- (b) In the event of there being more than five vacancies for members of committee at such annual meeting, then the five candidates who shall be highest on the poll shall hold office for the full term of three years; the other successful candidates shall hold office only for one or two years according as the extra vacancies may have occurred, the committee to determine as to these extra vacancies prior to such annual meeting.
- (c) A sub-committee not exceeding three members of committee shall be appointed at the annual meeting to conduct such ballot, and the chairman thereof shall act as returning officer.
- (d) If there should only be sufficient nominations at such annual meeting for the vacancies in the committee then existing, then should there be no election necessary for the office of responsible medical officer, the annual meeting shall by ballot forthwith determine which members shall hold office for the full term of three years as aforesaid, and which shall only hold office for one or two years as aforesaid.
- (e) All disputes regarding elections shall be decided by the committee, but at such meeting no member whose election is in dispute shall vote or take any part in the proceedings.

12. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a box at the hospital, with two keys, one of which shall be kept by the president, and the other by the secretary.

13. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the committee of management at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

14. On the third Saturday in the month of July in every year the one-third part of the elected members of committee shall go out of office, but may be, nevertheless, re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall be in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

15. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the secretary, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason,

felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent from four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the Act, are required to go out of office.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

16. The institution shall be managed by fifteen (15) members of committee, who shall be elected from the governors, subscribers, and contributors, at the annual meeting as aforesaid, and the committee at its first sitting shall elect from amongst its members a president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer for the ensuing twelve months.

17. The committee of management may suspend the responsible medical officer, or any honorary medical or surgical officer, or other officer or servant of the institution, or one or more of its own members on any well founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting to be convened for the consideration of such charge, to be confirmed at a special meeting of governors and contributors to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the committee.

18. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulations, appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.

19. They shall meet on the third Saturday in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint, five to form a quorum; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time appointed, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereinafter authorized, shall stand adjourned till such day and hour as the members present may determine. The chairman of committee shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

20. The house committee shall have full power to consider any application and discharge any patient who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for so refusing any application or ordering any discharge.

21. No person holding any office or place of profit in the gift of the committee, or concerned or participating in the profit in or of any contract with the committee, shall be capable of holding a seat thereon. Provided that nothing in the preceding part of this rule shall extend or apply to any contract entered into by any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons, or any incorporated company where such contract is entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, or to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

22. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet, at the annual meeting of governors and contributors, in July of each year; such balance-sheet to be published in one or more of the local papers at least within fourteen days after such meeting.

23. The president and vice-presidents shall be members *ex officio* of all committees, and the treasurer *ex officio* of the committee of management.

24. The committee of management shall at each monthly meeting elect a house committee consisting of two or more members, who shall also act as a financial committee unless the general committee otherwise direct or appoint.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

25. The committee shall commence business at each meeting as soon as the legal quorum is present.

26. That the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the committee, except at special meetings of the committee, unless the confirmation of such minutes be as part of the business of the special meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of such proceedings.

27. At all meetings of the committee the reading of the correspondence, the presentation of petitions by members of the committee, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of regular business.

28. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

29. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the committee and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the committee, however, may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given, in writing, to the secretary ten clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration. All such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which they were given.

30. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

31. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be a member of such committee.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

32. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or an amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the president or the presiding chairman, and no member, when speaking, shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

33. Any member making a motion or an amendment shall, when required put in form, sign, and deliver it to the secretary,

who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the committee.

34. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the committee by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

35. The members, when speaking, shall use respectful language to each other. No member of the committee shall speak more than once to any motion, except in explanation or by permission of the president. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the president, or the then presiding chairman, shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

36. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member or person shall, if required by the committee, withdraw such expression, and make satisfactory apology to the committee.

37. The president, or the then presiding chairman, shall be entitled to a deliberative and casting vote on each occasion, and shall, in taking the votes on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

38. The committee shall vote by a show of hands except in cases of election, when the vote shall be by open ballot. Any member of the committee may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting for the affirmative shall first stand up, and afterwards those in the negative, until their votes are recorded.

39. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the committee, shall be entered during the same current quarter unless a call of the committee has been duly made for the purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the committee which shall have been negatived by the committee shall be again entertained during the same current quarter.

40. Any one or more standing orders of the committee may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the board shall deem such suspension necessary.

ELECTIONS.

41. No election to any office at the disposal of the committee shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more local papers inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the current year before proceeding to the election.

42. No member of the committee or officer belonging to the committee shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the committee, or for any work to be done for the committee.

TREASURER.

43. The treasurer shall receive all moneys and pay same into the bank of the institution to the credit of the hospital within 24 hours of receipt of same, and shall also check the collector's receipt-book, and compare same with the revenue-book. He shall also give a written statement to the secretary at least once a week of all moneys received by him direct for entry in the proper books of the institution.

44. He, together with the secretary, shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting as approved by the committee, by draft on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by him, the president, and secretary. He shall also keep an account of all moneys received by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the committee.

AUDITORS.

45. The accounts of the charity shall be verified yearly, in the month of July, by two auditors appointed for the purpose by the governors and contributors.
