VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1900.

THE births of 61 boys and 67 girls, or in all of 128 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of August. Of these 55 occurred in Ballarat East, 62 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 9 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 133, viz., 75 of boys and 58 of girls.

The deaths registered in August, numbered 73, viz., 43 of males and 30 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 55. In July the recorded deaths numbered 54; in August, 1899, they numbered 66; in August, 1898, they numbered 87; in August, 1897, they numbered 59; in August, 1896, they numbered 71; in August, 1895, they numbered 77; in August, 1894, they numbered 75; in August, 1893, they numbered 88; in August, 1892, they numbered 77; in August, 1891, they numbered 72; and in August, 1890, they numbered 62.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 – 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A.B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____ viz., from _____ to _____, and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

REGULATION FOR THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN WORKS ON THE BROKEN RIVER, ETC., ETC., WHICH HAVE BEEN DECLARED TO BE NATIONAL WORKS.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—REGULATION.

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby makes the following Regulation for the management and control of certain works on the Broken River, which have been declared to be National Works, to wit, certain storage and regulating works, known as Casey's Weir and the offtake sluice and channel connecting to the Broken Creek, and Gowangardie Weir and offtake sluice and channel from weir to offtake sluice, also for the management and control of that portion of the Broken River and the respective portions of the Broken, Yabba Yabba, Boosey, and Nine Mile Creeks, particularly described in an Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1900, wherein it is ordered that the said portion of the Broken River, and the said respective portions of the aforesaid creeks, shall be under the exclusive control and management of the said Board.

This Regulation is also made for preventing and remedying the waste and undue consumption of water supplied from the aforesaid National Works, to the aforesaid portion of the Broken River, and likewise to the said respective portions of the Broken, Yabba Yabba, Boosey, and Nine Mile Creeks, and for preventing and remedying the waste and undue consumption of any water whatsoever in the said portion of the Broken River, and in the said portions of the aforesaid creeks.

1. The word "officer" used herein shall be taken to mean the officer appointed by the Board of Land and Works to carry out the provisions of this or any other regulation or regulations that may be passed by the Board, dealing with the aforesaid National Works, or with the aforesaid portion of the Broken River, or the aforesaid portions of the said creeks.

2. No water from the aforesaid National Works, and no water whatsoever, whether supplied from such works or from any other source in the said portion of the Broken River, and in the said portions of the Broken, Yabba Yabba, Boosey, and Nine Mile Creeks, shall be taken by any irrigation and water supply trust, or by any waterworks trust, or by any person or persons, other than riparian owners and occupiers, in the exercise of their riparian rights entitled to take water from such works or from such portion of the Broken River, or such portions of the aforesaid creeks, until the manner in which it is proposed to take such water shall have been submitted to and approved by the officer.

3. No sluices, offtakes, outlets, or other works or machinery shall be constructed or erected for taking water from the aforesaid National Works, or which may either directly or indirectly draw off or diminish the quantity of water conserved by the said works, or any water supplied therefrom, in the aforesaid portion of the Broken River, and also in any of the respective portions of the creeks hereinbefore named, or that may either directly or indirectly draw off or diminish any water whatsoever that may be in the said portion of the Broken River, or that may be in any of the aforesaid portions of the said creeks, except with

the approval and under the supervision of the officer; and no alteration to such sluices, offtakes, outlets, or other works or machinery shall be made except with his approval.

4. No person shall trespass upon or in any way injure or interfere with any of the aforesaid National Works.

5. No person shall in any way foul or contaminate the water conserved by the said National Works, or foul or contaminate water within the aforesaid portion of the Broken River, or within the aforesaid portions of the creeks herein named.

6. No irrigation and water supply trust, or waterworks trust, or person or persons entitled to take water from the said National Works, or the said portion of the Broken River, or the aforesaid portions of the said creeks, shall take a larger quantity therefrom than that to which such irrigation and water supply trust or waterworks trust, or person or persons, is or are legally entitled.

7. All sluices, offtakes, outlets, or other works or machinery constructed or erected for the purpose of taking water conserved by the said National Works or supplied therefrom in the aforesaid portion of the Broken River, or in any of the aforesaid portions of the said creeks, or for taking any water whatsoever from the said portion of the Broken River or from any of the said portions of the aforesaid creeks, shall be under the control of the Board, and the officer shall at all times on behalf of the Board regulate the same and effect such alterations or additions to such said sluices, offtakes, outlets, or other works or machinery as may be necessary for the proper control and distribution of water from the said National Works, or water supplied therefrom in the aforesaid portion of the Broken River, or in the respective portions of the said creeks, or for the proper control and distribution of any water whatsoever in the said portion of the Broken River, or in any of the said portions of the said creeks.

8. Any irrigation and water supply trust, or waterworks trust, or any person or persons committing a breach of this Regulation, or who shall in any way interfere with the officer or with any workman employed for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to any direction of the officer or the Board for the purposes mentioned in the last preceding clause, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds sterling.

9. The period for which this Regulation is made and shall remain in force (unless repealed meanwhile by the Governor in Council), shall be three years, commencing from 28th September, 1900.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st September, 1900.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is among other things provided that in order to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in any process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, from time to time appoint a Special Board consisting of not less than four or more than ten members and a Chairman, provided that no such Special Board shall be appointed except for the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat or maker or seller of small goods, and except in the case of any trade or business which at the commencement of the *Factories and Shops Act 1896* is included under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts* as regards Special Boards unless a resolution has been passed by either House of Parliament declaring it is expedient to appoint such Board: And whereas the Legislative Assembly on the 4th day of September, 1900, passed a resolution declaring that it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a cooper (being a process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby Order that a Special Board be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a cooper, such Special Board to consist of ten members and a Chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of the employers and five as representatives of the employes: And His Excellency doth further direct that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order or instrument of legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Coopers Board.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, and 6 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the Council of the Town of Brighton, made under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and numbered 52, for the closing of shops of a particular class on Wednesday afternoons.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—

That every shopkeeper carrying on a business of draper or tailor shall cause his shop to be closed from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon on each Wednesday in each and every week, but nothing in this by-law shall apply to any week in which a public or bank holiday or half-holiday on which such shop is closed.

Any person offending against this by-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty of the sum of One shilling for the first offence, and the sum of Five shillings for any subsequent offence.
