### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each such day, at each of the places specified, that is to say:—

FRIDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, at Echuca;  
TUESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, at Minyip;  
WEDNESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, at Pyramid Hill;  
WEDNESDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, at Murchison;

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby appoint Guy Berry to be an officer of the Board for the purpose of enforcing and carrying out the provisions of any Regulation or Regulations that may now be in force or may hereafter be made by the said Board, while these presents shall remain unrevoked, dealing with the management and control of certain works on the Broken River that have been declared to be National Works, to wit, those known as Casey's Weir and the offtake sluice and channel connecting to the Broken Creek and Gowangardie Weir, and offtake sluice and channel from weir to offtake sluice; also for the purpose of controlling and managing the water supplied from the National Works aforesaid in that portion of the Broken River, and in the respective portions of the Broken, Yabba, Yabba, Boosey, and Nine Mile Creeks, particularly described in an Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1900, wherein it is ordered that the said portion of the Broken River, and the said respective portions of the said creeks, shall be under the exclusive control and management of the said Board, and this appointment hereby confers upon the said Guy Berry the right of taking and authority to take proceedings on behalf of the Board against any Waterworks Trust or Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, or any body politic or corporate, or any person or persons who fail to observe or who may be guilty of committing a breach of any of the provisions of the said Acts or of the aforesaid Regulation or Regulations, and also for the purpose of carrying out and giving effect to any directions that may be issued to him by the said Board under and in accordance with the said Acts or Regulation or Regulations, and otherwise for giving effect to any of the powers conferred on the Board under or by virtue of the Water Acts in respect of the control of National Works, and of streams supplying the same, and of streams affected thereby, being rivers, creeks, or watercourses, ordered by the Governor in Council to be under the exclusive or partial control and management of the Board.

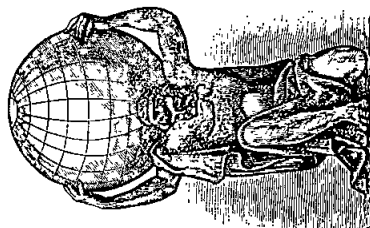

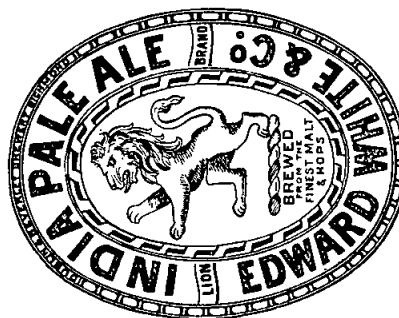

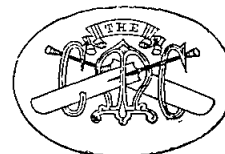

The births of 1,004 children, viz., 512 boys and 492 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. The number was by far the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; and was, moreover, 262 below the average of the month during that period, or 300 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in August numbered 614, viz., 306 of males and 308 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 390, or 64 per cent., as against 88 per cent. in August, 1899, and 101 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 47 more than in August, 1899; but was 17 below the average of August during the last ten years, or 36 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.74, and of deaths registered to 15.13 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 26.71 and 14.21 respectively, and during the last ten years of 32.09 and 16.06 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 61.9° on the 6th, and the lowest was 39.5° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (48.1°) was 2.7 degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.2°) took place on the 6th, and the least range (6.5°) on the 8th. The mean daily range was 14.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.083 inches on the 10th, and the lowest was 29.226 inches on the 16th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.739 inches) was one-fourth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 18 days, the amount being 2.31 inches, which was higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1896 and 1899, and nearly half-an-inch above the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was 766.

Males contributed 50 per cent. and females 50 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 21 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in August, 1899; 27 per cent. in August, 1898; 22 per cent. in August, 1897; 22 per cent. in August, 1896; 23 per cent. in August, 1895; and 30 per cent. in August, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 82, as compared with 82 in August, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was 82 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 77 in August, 1899; 111 in August, 1898; 85 in August, 1897; 88 in August, 1896; 89 in August, 1895; 91 in August, 1894; 103 in August, 1893; 84 in August, 1892; 121 in August, 1891; and 150 in August, 1890.

Eighty-four persons—as against 76 in August, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a cook, aged 75, died of cancer; a starchmaker, aged 75, of cerebral hemorrhage; two females, each aged 75, of heart disease and bronchitis respectively; a labourer, aged 75, of pneumonia; a grazier, aged 75, of disease of the prostate; a photographer, aged 76, of gout; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a farmer, aged 76, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a bricklayer, aged 76, of paraplegia; a gentleman and a female, each aged 76, of heart disease; two females, each aged 76, of pneumonia and gallstones respectively; a coachbuilder, aged 77, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 77, of

hemiplegia and dilatation of the heart respectively; a bootmaker and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 78, of cerebral hemorrhage; an engine-driver, aged 78, of syncope; a female, aged 78, of asthma; a gardener and a female, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of pleurisy; another, aged 79, of cancer; a clergyman, aged 79, of phthisis; a farmer and a female, each aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; an engineer and a saddler, each aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 79, of pneumonia; a clergyman, aged 79, of disease of the kidneys; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of insanity; a female, aged 80, of disease of the spine; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; a grazier and a female, each aged 81, of valvular disease of the heart; a nurse and a female, each aged 81, of bronchitis; five females, each aged 82, of rheumatism, apoplexy, degeneration of heart, heart disease, and kidney disease respectively; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 84, of dilatation of the heart and heart disease respectively; a shellwork maker, aged 84, of asthma; a female, aged 84, of gastric catarrh; a contractor, aged 85, of diarrhoea; two females, each aged 85, of softening of the brain and syncope respectively; a compositor, aged 85, of disease of the liver; a female, aged 86, of heart disease; a miner, aged 86, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 87, of rheumatism and heart disease respectively; a carpenter, aged 88, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 91, of dilatation of the heart; a contractor, aged 76, four females, each aged 77, a brassfinisher and a female, each aged 78, a compositor and a contractor, each aged 79, a gentleman, a miner, and two females, each aged 81, a gentleman, aged 82, a female, aged 84, a gentleman, a carpenter, and a mason, each aged 85, a bootmaker and a female, each aged 86, and a female, aged 90, of old age.

Twenty-seven of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 19 in August, 1899—were from external causes, of which 19 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway porter, aged 33, and a female, aged 21, were passed over by railway trains; a grocer, aged 62, was killed by a fall from a cart; a labourer, aged 35, and a seaman, aged 40, died of fracture of the skull, caused by falls, through a skylight in the former, and down the hold of a ship in the latter case; an oven-maker, aged 35, of fracture of the skull, and a railway employé, aged 40, of fracture of the spine, the result in each case of a fall; a bootmaker, aged 31, of fracture of the skull, not sufficient evidence to show how caused; three male children, aged 1, 3, and 10 years respectively, and a female, aged 17, of burns; a cook, aged 35, was drowned by falling into Hobson's Bay; a clerk, aged 42, a milk vendor, aged 50, an engine-driver, aged 71, and a female, aged 50, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a male child, aged 6 weeks, was suffocated in bed, and a woodman, aged 52, by vomited matter getting into the air passages. The homicidal death was that of a new-born male infant, who was found dead, the cause being ascertained to be suffocation (probably murder). The suicidal deaths were those of two females, aged 27 and 44 respectively, who cut their throats; an indentor, aged 48, who poisoned himself with carbolic acid; a farmer, aged 34, a caretaker, aged 59, and a grocer, aged 70, who hanged themselves; and a bootmaker, aged 52, who placed himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and fifty-four deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne, 13 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 15 in the Children's, 4 in the Homeopathic, and 4 in the Austin Hospitals; 14 in the Metropolitan and 12 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 8 in the Immigrants' Home; 9 in the Benevolent Asylum; 7 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 130, of which 78, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 52, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 82 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 484. Of these 228, or 47 per cent., were males, and 256, or 53 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 33 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 47 were between thirty-five and forty, 42 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 49 were between sixty-five and seventy, 37 were between seventy and seventy-five, 45 were between seventy-five and eighty, 23 were between eighty and eighty-five, 14 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

N.B.—The figures in parentheses represent the numbers in the corresponding month of the preceding year.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one of the previous year, deaths from constitutional diseases increased by 14, those from developmental diseases by 16, those from local diseases by 24, and those due to violence by 8, but those from zymotic diseases decreased by 4, and those from ill-defined and not specified causes by 12. Under the class zymotic diseases, deaths from measles rose from nil to 20; but, on the other hand, those from influenza fell from 11 to 2, and those from whooping-cough from 11 to nil. Under the constitutional class, there was an increase of 7 each from cancer and phthisis respectively. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 6 to 22. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 12, and those from diseases of the respiratory system by 11; whilst those from diseases of the digestive system diminished by 9. It appears as if the district is on the eve of another serious epidemic of measles, 20 deaths from this cause having occurred during the month, and 24 since the beginning of the year. As a rule, there are less than 10 deaths from this disease annually. The last epidemic, in 1898, caused 403 deaths, and the preceding one, in 1893, 386 deaths.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first eight months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

NOTE.—The above estimate is simply brought on from the estimate arrived at by the Statistical Conference in Sydney by adding the excess of births over deaths, and of recorded arrivals over departures which have since occurred. If no allowance were made for unrecorded departures since the Census of 1891, the apparent population on 30th June last would have been 1,250,558, or 82,422 more than that shown in the table. It is estimated by this office, however, that 68,920 would be an ample allowance for unrecorded departures, and that the population shown in the table is understated by 13,500.

During the half-year, the births numbered 15,594, and the deaths 7,479; the former being 712 more, but the latter 480 less, than in the corresponding period of the previous year. The natural increase, viz., 8,115, was 1,192 more than in the first half of 1899, and also larger than in any previous half-year since the first half of 1897.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 42,867, and the recorded departures 46,946, resulting in a loss by emigration of 3,379 persons, as against a loss of 1,204 in the corresponding period of 1899, of 7,059 in that of 1898, and of 8,072 in 1897.

The net recorded increase of population, viz., 4,736, was 981 lower than in the corresponding period of 1899, but 6,660 higher than in that of 1898 (when there was a decrease of 1,924), and 4,534 higher than in that of 1897.

The returns of the immigration agent—taking them for what they are worth—show a balance in favour of immigration (by sea) of 4,608 from New South Wales, of 1,681 from Tasmania, of 259 from South Australia, and of 363 from "other British Possessions"; but a balance in favour of emigration of 3,585 to

Western Australia, of 425 to Queensland, of 106 to New Zealand, 307 to South Seas, of 3,641 to the United Kingdom, of 2,201 to South Africa, and of 25 to foreign ports.

The net emigration to the United Kingdom, Western Australia, and South Africa was very large during the half-year, as compared with the corresponding period of 1899, when there was a net emigration of 2,191 to the United Kingdom, but a net immigration of 531 from Western Australia, and of 61 from South Africa. It should be borne in mind, however, that in the returns for the half-year under notice, there were included as emigrants to South Africa the whole of the Victorian members of the Australian Military Contingents bound for the war in the Transvaal, viz., 1,176; and a large proportion of the 2,434, sent from New South Wales, and of the 178 from Tasmania.

shall be and is hereby repealed, and in lieu and substitution thereof it is directed as follows:—

No. 4. That the hours of bathing shall be—for females, from six o'clock in the evening until ten o'clock in the morning on Tuesdays and Fridays; for males—on all other days of the week from six o'clock in the evening until nine o'clock in the morning. The wearing of screens compulsory.

And, in addition, the two following clauses be added:—

No. 9. No person shall carry or discharge in the reserve, or snare or destroy game therein, and no person shall be allowed to shoot or destroy game from outside the boundary fence.

No. 10. Fishing is strictly prohibited in the reservoir from the 1st May to the 31st October in each year, both days inclusive.

SHIRE OF PRESTON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE SHIRE OF GORDON KNOWN AS THE BOORT RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

The said trustees or any person or persons by them so authorized to do may charge by way of toll or entrance fee or fees such a sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole five shillings from every person claiming purchase of a ticket of admission to or admission to such part of the said reserve known as the Grandstand Enclosure or such part of the said reserve as may from time to time be specified as a Grandstand Enclosure, or set apart from time to time to be charged admission thereto.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
