THE ROYAL ASSENT TO THE "GOVERNOR'S SALARY FURTHER REDUCTION ACT 1900."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Statute* it was amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of His Majesty's assent to Bills and the reservation of Bills for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to Governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by His Majesty should apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now reciting Statute and by any other Legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill the title whereof is herein set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to reduce the sum appropriated for the payment of the Governor's Salary,"

which was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon, has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that by an Order in Council made at the Court at St. James's, and bearing date the thirteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and one, a copy whereof is hereto appended, His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land," it is, amongst other things, enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New South Wales until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify, either by speech or message to the Legislative Council of the said

Colony, or by Proclamation as therein aforesaid, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas by another Act passed in the 13th and 14th years of Her late Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act for the better government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies," it was provided, among other things, that the provisions of the said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony by a subsequent Act passed in the 18th and 19th years of the reign of Her late Majesty, entitled "An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria, to establish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria:"

And whereas, on the 27th December, 1900, the Officer administering the Government of the said Colony of Victoria reserved a certain Bill, passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony, entitled "An Act to reduce the sum appropriated for the payment of the Governor's Salary" for the signification of Her late Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by His Majesty:

Now therefore His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to His Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, declare His assent to the said Bill.

SENIOR TEACHER OF COOKERY, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

Applicants should not be over 35 years of age, must be healthy and active, and should be in possession of certificates of competency to teach primary, plain, and advanced cookery, and household science. They should have also had experience in conducting cookery centres attached to primary schools, and with large adult classes, in each branch of practical cookery.

The duties of the position are—

1. To conduct a model cookery centre as a practising class for teachers in training for the work.
2. To train teachers in—(a) Practice and theory of cookery. (b) Scullery work. (c) Cookery school accounts and records. (d) Housekeeping. (e) Carving and serving. (f) General management of centres.
3. To teach the higher branches of cookery to teachers already on the staff.
4. To give short courses of instruction to school girls and adults in country districts where it is not practicable to establish ordinary centres.
5. To conduct adult classes in Melbourne, or provincial towns, if required.
6. To undertake the duties of head teacher in the Cookery College, should one be established.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE JEWELLERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a jeweller, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the Determination made by the Board, and dated 1st June, 1901, be cancelled and annulled from the date on which this Determination comes into force.

(2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a jeweller, shall be—

Jewellers, meaning persons employed as mounters, setters, chainmakers, jobbers, ringmakers, polishers, lappers, melters and refiners, stampers, silversmiths, or gilders ...				50s. per week of 48 hours.
Persons chasing and engraving ...				60s. " "
Persons chasing only ...				50s. " "
Persons over 21 years of age, not specified above, engaged in the manufacture of jewellery ...				36s. " "

MALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

Number.

(3) That the number of male apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory, or work-room, or shop, or place, shall be one apprentice or improver to every two persons or fraction of two persons, and thence one apprentice or improver to every two persons employed in the process, trade, or business of jewellery, and receiving not less than 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Wages.

(4) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to male apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a jeweller, shall be the following:—

1st years's experience ...	5s. per week of 48 hours.
2nd " " ...	7s. 6d. " "
3rd " " ...	10s. " "
4th " " ...	15s. " "
5th " " ...	20s. " "
6th " " ...	30s. " "
7th " " ...	40s. " "

And thereafter the minimum wage determined by the Board.

FEMALES.

(5) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to females employed in the process, trade, or business of a jeweller shall be 30s. per week of 48 hours.

FEMALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

(6) That the number of female apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory, or work-room, or shop, or place, shall be one apprentice or improver to three females or fraction of three females, and thence one apprentice or improver to every three females employed in the process, trade, or business of jewellery, and receiving not less than 30s. per week of 48 hours.

Wages.

(7) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to female apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a jeweller, shall be the following :—

1st year's experience	5s. per week of 48 hours.
2nd " "	7s. 6d. " "
3rd " "	10s. " "
4th " "	12s. 6d. " "
5th " "	15s. " "
6th " "	17s. 6d. " "
7th " "	20s. " "

And thereafter the minimum wage determined by the Board.

OVERTIME.

(8) That any male employé over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a jeweller who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(9) That the above Determination shall come into force from and after the 1st day of August, 1901.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1901.

THE births of 55 boys and 57 girls, or in all of 112 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June. Of these 40 occurred in Ballarat East, 62 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 13 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 127, viz., 71 of boys, and 56 of girls.

The deaths registered in June numbered 74, viz., 41 of males and 33 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 38. In May the recorded deaths numbered 70; in June, 1900, they numbered 75; in June, 1899, they numbered 68; in June, 1898, they numbered 73; in June, 1897, they numbered 53; in June, 1896, they numbered 70; in June, 1895, they numbered 73; in June, 1894, they numbered 67; in June, 1893, they numbered 67; in June, 1892, they numbered 72; and in June, 1891, they numbered 57.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age :—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions :—Males, 57 per cent.; females, 43 per cent.; under five years, 23 per cent.; over five years, 77 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were :—Males and females, 54 and 46 per cent.; under and over five years, 19 and 81 per cent. respectively.

Eighteen deaths, or 25 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz. :—Ballarat Hospital, 8; Benevolent Asylum, 4; Lunatic Asylum, 6.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease :—

On the other hand, deaths from cancer fell from 6 to 2; those from phthisis from 11 to 4; those from diseases of the respiratory system from 15 to 8; and those from diseases of the urinary system from 7 to 1.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of June in all the Bendigo Districts was 117; of these 62 were of males and 55 of females; included were 4 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 158, viz.:—81 of males, and 77 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 57, viz.:—40 of males and 17 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 60. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 70; in the month of June, 1900, they numbered 62; in the month of June, 1899, they numbered 74; in the month of June, 1898, they numbered 72; in the month of June, 1897, they numbered 77; in the month of June, 1896, they numbered 82; in the month of June, 1895, they numbered 55; in the month of June, 1894, they numbered 48; in the month of June, 1893, they numbered 65; in the month of June, 1892, they numbered 65; and in the month of June, 1891, they numbered 57.

Of the registered births 90 occurred within the city of Bendigo, and 27 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 45 took place within and 12 without the city.

Of the 57 deaths registered during the month 13, or 23 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 44, or 77 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 33 and 67 per cent.

Twelve deaths, or 21 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 9; Benevolent Asylum, 3.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1893*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1893*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1893* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1893* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor of Victoria and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, made in pursuance of the provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, intitled *An Act for regulating the sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, certain Crown lands therein described were declared and ordered to be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, annul and rescind any Proclamation made under the said *Land Act 1890* or any Act of Parliament thereby or theretofore repealed, of any portion or portions of Crown lands as towns or townships: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby rescind the Proclamation aforesaid bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, so far only as it relates to the portion of the Town of Strathfieldsaye, situate north of the road forming the north boundaries of allotments 12A, 6A, 6, 7, 8, and 9, and west of allotment 11A.


