NOTICE UNDER THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer at St. Kilda, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Assembly, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper]."

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

The application is to be addressed as follows:—

The Returning Officer for St. Kilda Electorate,
care of The Town Clerk, St. Kilda."

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

Voting by Post Act 1900.

ST. KILDA ELECTORAL DISTRICT.—OFFICERS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

At the Executive Council, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of January, 1901.

WHEREAS by the *Voting by Post Act 1900* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, in such manner as may be prescribed, appoint or remove persons (therein called officers) who, in each Electoral Province or District, shall witness the signatures of persons who vote by post at an election in such Province or District, and that such officers shall post to the Returning Officer all postal ballot-papers received by them, and execute such powers and duties as may be prescribed:

And whereas a Regulation has been made whereby it is prescribed that the Governor in Council may, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, appoint any member of the Police Force stationed within any Electoral Province or District to be such officer:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint the following members of the Police Force stationed in the St. Kilda Electoral District to be officers within the meaning of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* for the said District, viz:—
