PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTIONS FOR THE GIPPSLAND, MELBOURNE, NORTHERN, NORTH-WESTERN, SOUTH YARRA, AND WELLINGTON PROVINCES.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY UNDER ARMS IN HAWTHORN.

THREE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD AND A FREE PARDON TO ANY ACCOMPLICE TURNING KING'S EVIDENCE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Reward of Two hundred pounds will be paid by the Government, in addition to a Reward of One hundred pounds offered by the Melbourne Tramway Company, to any person not being a Member of the Police Force who will give information leading to the arrest and conviction of four young men, who, at about 12.45 o'clock on the morning of Sunday last, the 18th instant, armed with revolvers, stopped the last tram on its way from Richmond to Auburn, near the corner of Power-street and Riversdale-road, Hawthorn, and robbed the driver and passengers: Also that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State will extend His Majesty's Free Pardon to any accomplice who will give the information.

The descriptions of the men wanted are as follow, viz.:—

A young man about 23 or 24 years of age, 5 feet 8 inches in height, slight build, had a short brown moustache, thin nose, sharp voice; wore a dark-brown suit, a black slouch hat, and had a thin black gauze veil over his face.

All the others were young men from 23 to 28 years of age, of medium build; wore dark clothes and black slouch hats, and had large dark masks, like fur, over their faces.

In addition to sums of money stolen from the driver and passengers, certain identifiable articles were stolen, whose descriptions are as follow, viz.:—

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. GEORGE AND GEORGE DRESSMAKERS AND TAILORS, 168 COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE, for a period of six weeks from the 19th August, 1901, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

The births of 981 children, viz., 513 of boys and 468 of girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. The number was, it will be observed, 8 less than in July 1900, and was the lowest recorded for the month during the last seventeen years; it was 166 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 230 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in July numbered 740, viz., 420 of males and 320 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 241, or 33 per cent., as against 85 per cent. in July, 1900, and 90 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 204 more than in July, 1900, and the highest recorded for the month, except in 1889 (824); it was 136 above the average of July during the last ten years, and 102 above it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 23.38, and of deaths registered to 17.63 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 24.37 and 13.21 respectively, and during the last ten years of 28.94 and 15.29 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 29.74 and 16.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 58.7° on the 7th, and the lowest was 30.0° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (45.3°) was 2.9° below the average, and the lowest on record, the next lowest being 46.2° in 1879 and 1885. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.4°) took place on the 7th, and the least range (4.4°) on the 27th. The mean daily range was 12.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.470 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.692 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.105 inches) was about an eighth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 1.26 inches, which was about a fifth of an inch higher than in July, 1900, but 1.12 inches below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on six days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was .867.

Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 22 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in July, 1900; 25 per cent. in July, 1899; 25 per cent. in July, 1898; 20 per cent. in July, 1897; 22 per cent. in July, 1896; 27 per cent. in July, 1895; and 27 per cent. in July, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 120, as compared with 72 in July, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 122 per 1,000 births, registered in the month under review, as compared with 73 in July, 1900; 113 in July, 1899; 100 in July, 1898; 70 in July, 1897; 82 in July, 1896; 117 in July, 1895; 100 in July, 1894; 131 in July, 1893; 88 in July, 1892; and 96 in July, 1891.

One hundred and ten persons—as against 85 in July, 1900—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Twenty-five of the deaths recorded during the month, as compared with 17 in July, 1900, were from external causes, of which 17 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A draftsman, aged 55, was passed over by a railway train; a boy, aged 8, was killed by a piece of iron falling on him; a hawker, aged 46, died of rupture of the intestines, a gentleman, aged 82, of fracture of hip, a clergyman, aged 88, of fracture of the thigh, and a female, aged 79, of injury to leg, the result in each case of a fall; a baker, aged 30, and a photographer, aged 40, of injuries accidentally received; a farmer, aged 37, of septic inflammation caused by a sharp instrument, not sufficient evidence to show how caused; a boy, aged 5, of burns; a plasterer, aged 65, of nitro-benzene poisoning; a labourer, aged 25, was drowned in the River Yarra; a labourer, aged 37, and a cabman, aged 47, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a labourer, aged 46, was suffocated in a sewer; a tailor, aged 89, whilst drunk; and a female infant, aged 3 weeks, by head covering falling over the face in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a fireman, aged 32, who died of gunshot wounds; and a labourer, aged 53, who died of fracture of the skull, a verdict of manslaughter being returned in each case; and a new-born female infant, who was found dead, the cause having been suffocation. The suicidal deaths were those of an accountant, aged 41, who cut his throat; a clerk, aged 51, and a secretary, aged 65, who poisoned themselves with cyanide of potassium; a servant (female), aged 22, who drowned herself; and a farmer, aged 50, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and eighty-six deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—79 in the Melbourne, 16 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 5 in the Homeopathic, and 9 in the Austin Hospitals; 18 in the Metropolitan and 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 12 in the Immigrants' Home; 12 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylums; 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 4 in the Protestant Refuge; and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 165, of which 95, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 70, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 120 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 575. Of these 325, or 57 per cent., were males, and 250, or 43 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 43 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 67 were between sixty-five and seventy, 72 were between seventy and seventy-five, 60 were between seventy-five and eighty, 29 were between eighty and eighty-five, 16 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 5 were between ninety and ninety-five.

The principal feature of the month was the outbreak of an epidemic of influenza, which caused 43 deaths, as against only 7 in the previous month. The epidemic has not heretofore assumed such a fatal character so early in the year—the greatest number of deaths occurring, as a rule, in the months of September, October, and November. The last serious outbreak, in the fourth quarter of 1899, caused 274 deaths, of which 91 took place in October and 152 in November.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 51 deaths under zymotic, 5 under dietetic, 41 under constitutional, 33 under developmental, 76 under local diseases, and 8 under the head of violence, whilst there was a decrease of 10 under ill-defined causes. Under the zymotic class, deaths from influenza rose from 3 to 43, those from whooping-cough from 1 to 13, and those from venereal diseases from 3 to 9, whilst those from diphtheria fell from 10 to 7. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer rose from 27 to 40, those from phthisis from 61 to 68, and those from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., from 5 to 14. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 11 to 26, and those from old age from 17 to 20. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 38; those from diseases of the respiratory system by 42; those from diseases of the urinary system by 6; and those from diseases of parturition by 5; on the other hand, deaths from diseases of the circulatory and digestive systems diminished by 4 and 6 respectively; and those from diseases of the organs of locomotion by 4.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first seven months of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of July in all the Bendigo Districts was 127; of these 63 were of males and 64 of females; included were 8 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 117, viz.:—62 of males, and 55 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 66, viz.:—45 of males and 21 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 61. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 57; in the month of July, 1900, they numbered 59; in the month of July, 1899, they numbered 66; in the month of July, 1898, they numbered 78; in the month of July, 1897, they numbered 53; in the month of July, 1896, they numbered 67; in the month of July, 1895, they numbered 62; in the month of July, 1894, they numbered 53; in the month of July, 1893, they numbered 67; in the month of July, 1892, they numbered 63; and in the month of July, 1891, they numbered 71.

Of the registered births 89 occurred within the city of Bendigo, and 38 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 55 took place within and 11 without the city.

SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

BY-LAW NO. 14.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 14 of the council of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

4. *Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk*.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall on or before the thirty-first day of August, 1901, and on or before the first day of September in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of such cows is—

(1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

(2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Five shillings.

(3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.

(4) More than 20, but not more than 30, a fee of Ten shillings.

(5) More than 30, but not more than 40, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

(6) More than 40, but not more than 50, a fee of Fifteen shillings.

(7) Over 50 cows, a fee of Twenty shillings.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

Application for registration as—

To the Secretary of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

Name in full—

Trade in respect of which registration is desired—

Style or firm under which trade is to be carried on—

Every place, if any, within the jurisdiction of the said council at which such trade or any part of it is to be carried on, including a full description of all paddocks, grass-lands, grounds, and enclosures occupied, or used, or intended to be used by the applicant—

Period of time for which registration is required—

The maximum number of cows to be kept during the ensuing 12 months—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or if he be the person attacked, his wife, or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health by order served

as aforesaid to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Boroondara, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire doth hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 19 of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire.

3. By-law No. 3 made by the Local Board of Health on the 19th day of May, 1886, so far as the same has not already been repealed, and By-law No. 14, made by the Shire of Boroondara on the 10th day of June, 1895, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall register himself by signing and forwarding to the said Council a form of application as set out hereunder:—

Any person who at any time during the currency of his registration shall increase the number of cows kept beyond the number set out in his application for registration shall forthwith pay to the Council such additional sum as may be required to make his registration fee up to the amount provided in the scale of fees for such increased number of cows, and until such further payment is made he shall be deemed to be unregistered.

8. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall cause the same to be properly indexed.

9. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the Council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Council may, by an order, in writing,

signed by the chairman or by the secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling-house, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows, whether owned by a private person or by a registered cow-keeper or dairyman, found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the veterinary surgeon, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy or other premises if ordered by such veterinary surgeon or by the inspector of nuisances.

10. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage thereof shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in or upon or contiguous to the same.

11. All yards, sheds, or other places used for holding dairy cows, or where they may be temporarily kept, shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer, veterinary surgeon, or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, lime washed, or otherwise treated, as may in any such order be directed.

12. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily after use, and also at such other times as may be directed.

13. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife, or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for the said council or officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of the Council or officer of health, no longer exists. And it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows, or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person so suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger of infection has in the opinion of the council or officer of health ceased.

14. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Council, officer of health, or veterinary surgeon, and also to the nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatever.

15. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in or near to the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

17. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings, or, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Railway Lands Acquisition Acts.

THE MOE AND WALHALLA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 1st day of July, 1901, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of July, 1901, and in the *Narracan Shire Advocate*, a newspaper circulating in the municipalities of the shires of Narracan and Walhalla, through the municipal districts of which the Moe and Walhalla line of railway is to be constructed, His Excellency Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, upon the petition of the Councils of the Shires of Narracan and Walhalla, announced his intention to constitute the Council of the Shire of Walhalla the Railway Construction Trust for the Moe and Walhalla Railway Construction District: And whereas no petition has been received by him praying that such Trust be not so constituted: Now therefore His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, under and by virtue of the powers conferred by the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this present Order constitute the Council of the Shire of Walhalla (the council named in an agreement between it and the Shire Council of Narracan as being the Council which I have been petitioned to constitute a Railway Construction Trust) to be the Railway Construction Trust under the name of "The Moe and Walhalla Railway Construction Trust," to act under the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, and the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1899*, for the said Railway Construction District with respect to the said Moe and Walhalla line of railway, authorized to be constructed by the *Moe and Walhalla Railway Construction Act 1900*: And to do all things necessary to fulfil and carry out such provisions, and also to proceed to carry out the terms of such agreement.

And the Honorable William Arthur Trenwith, His Majesty's Minister of Railways for the State of Victoria aforesaid, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MILDURA AND YELTA RAILWAY LINE.

Notice of intention by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to constitute the Council of the Shire of Mildura the Railway Construction Trust for the proposed Mildura and Yelta Railway Construction District.

WHEREAS I, The Honorable Sir John Madden, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, did by Order under my hand announce my intention to constitute the lands referred to or described in such Order the Mildura and Yelta Railway Construction District, with respect to the Mildura and Yelta Railway, authorized to be constructed by the *Mildura and Yelta Railway Construction Act 1900*: And whereas the Councils of the Municipal Districts of the Shires of Mildura, Dimboola, Karkaroc, Castle Donington, and Wycheproof (in the Municipal Districts of which Councils the whole of such Railway Construction District is contained), under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, have agreed in writing that the Council of the Shire of Mildura, a council named in such agreement, should be constituted the Railway Construction Trust for the said Mildura and Yelta Railway Construction District, and such councils have by petition applied to me and the Executive Council of the said State that the said Council of the Shire of Mildura should be constituted the Trust for such District aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my present Order announce my intention to constitute the said Council of the Shire of Mildura, the council agreed upon in writing as aforesaid, the Railway Construction Trust for such Railway Construction District as aforesaid, with respect to the said line of railway under the style or name of "The Mildura and Yelta Railway Construction Trust."

MOE AND WALHALLA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST.

REGULATION No. 1.

FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of August, 1901.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Wynne

Mr. Duggan.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

- "(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;
- "(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and
- "(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act."

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the *Railway Lands Acquisition Acts*, and known as the Moe and Walhalla Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz.:—

1. First meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least four members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of three members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.
6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.
7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
9. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
11. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.
12. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (v.) Payments.

- (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

22. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

26. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

27. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

28. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

29. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

30. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

31. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

32. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts

collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

50. Appointment, &c., of Officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

51. Salaries of Officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in the said Acts, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations previously made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

PART I.—GENERAL.

CHAPTER II.—CROWN GRANTS AND TREASURER'S RECEIPTS.

Section 41 of the *Land Act 1900* (No. 2).

prescribed in Schedule C¹ hereto, and shall be subject to such other exceptions, reservations, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct.

6. 7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within 24 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6 or from the contractor's security. TENDERS, indorsed "Tender for wattle bark, lot _____," and addressed to the Secretary for Lands, will be received at the Department of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, up to Twelve noon on Monday, 9th September, 1901, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. General Conditions.

1. No tender will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender, and the additional amount fixed must be paid by the successful tenderer on signing the contract.

3. Tenders must be at a universal price per ton, irrespective of the species of wattle, and the bark must be weighed at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the weighing must be done in the presence of the officer in charge.

4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 1st December, 1901; and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1902; by which latter date all work must cease; and all bark stripped or otherwise remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.

5. No tree shall be stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter, at a height of 2 feet from the ground, shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other—in his opinion—valid reason.

8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.

9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied; and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, immediately dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking or ordinary cooking operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above conditions, or of any special condition, will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister shall have power to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance.
