ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million and eighty-three thousand eight hundred and one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and one and One thousand nine hundred and two."

"An Act to further amend the *Moorparryal Land Act 1897*."

"An Act to amend the *Municipalities' Advances Act*."

"An Act to further amend the *Malice Tanks Act 1895*."

"An Act to authorize and validate certain Expenditure by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works in connexion with the mourning for the Death of Her late Majesty the Opening of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and the Visit of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York."

"An Act relating to certain Grazing Area Leases."

Neglected Children's Act 1890.—Sections 19, 21, and 61.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Neglected Children's Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1121), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by an Order made on the 26th day of August, 1901, specially authorized

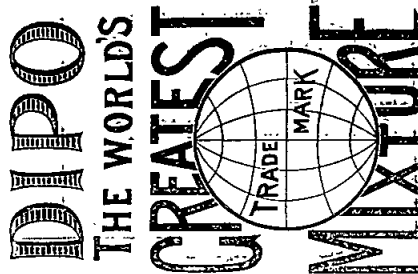

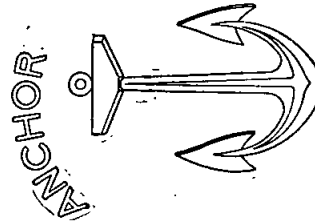

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Euroa has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Wondoomarook in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

EXPLOSIVES MAGAZINE RESERVE AT
TRUGANINA.—BY-LAWS.

WHEREAS by the *Powder Magazines Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1456), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make by-laws for fixing the rents which may be charged for the use of sites of magazines for the storage of explosives (within the meaning of the *Explosives Act 1890*), and any Act amending the same) and for determining the terms and conditions on which such sites will be let or leased for such purpose, and also for all or any of the subjects or matters mentioned in section 105 of the *Railways Act 1890*, for which purpose the word "railway" in such section shall be read as "tramway": Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following By-laws for regulating the use of the jetty and tramway on the

Truganina Explosives Reserve and fixing the amount of tolls to be paid on goods received or delivered upon or from the jetty aforesaid, viz.:—

BY-LAWS

For regulating the use of the jetty and tramway on the Truganina Explosives Reserve and fixing the amount of tolls to be paid on goods received or delivered upon or from the jetty aforesaid.

1. No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall go alongside the jetty belonging to the Truganina Explosives Reserve without the consent of the Superintendent of the reserve.
2. No goods of any description, other than explosives authorized by Order in Council to be manufactured or imported, shall be landed on, or delivered from the aforesaid jetty, or conveyed over the tramway without the consent, in writing, of a Government Inspector of Explosives.
3. The discharge of explosives on or from the aforesaid jetty shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890* and regulations thereunder and the Port and Harbors Regulations.
4. Any powder lighter after completing the discharge or the loading of explosive cargo shall leave the jetty without unnecessary delay.
5. Any powder lighter having explosive on board shall not, without reasonable excuse, approach within 200 yards of the aforesaid jetty, except for the purpose of the immediate discharge of the explosive.
6. No explosive shall be allowed to remain on the aforesaid jetty, but must forthwith be placed in trucks or in the Government receiving magazine on the aforesaid jetty, or loaded into powder lighters.
7. Tolls shall be paid on all explosives (other than those belonging to H.M. Government or entered with the Customs for or received into any magazine on the Truganina Explosives Reserve) at the rate of Ninepence for every 25 lbs. weight of explosives or fractional part of 25 lbs. weight of explosives.
8. Any person committing a breach of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

DIGGING OR REMOVING GRAVEL FROM CERTAIN
CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.—SEBASTOPOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall dig or remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth on or from the portions of Crown lands, in the municipal district of Sebastopol, hereinafter described, except for municipal works authorized by the Council of the Borough of Sebastopol:—

Four acres thirty-two perches: Commencing at a point on the south side of Victoria-street distant easterly four chains fifty links from its intersection with the east side of Grant-street; bounded thence by the first-named street bearing N. 85° 55' E. seven chains; and thence by lines bearing respectively S. 4° 5' E. six chains, S. 85° 55' W. seven chains, and N. 4° 5' W. six chains to the point of commencement.

Ten acres three rods eight perches: Commencing at the intersection of the south side of Alma-street and the south-east side of Crown-street; bounded thence by the last-named street bearing S. 43° 50' W. twelve chains; and thence by lines bearing respectively S. 0° 6' W. nine chains, N. 43° 50' E. twelve chains, and N. 0° 6' E. nine chains to the point of commencement.

NETTING AT PORTLAND PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines at Portland within an area bounded by two imaginary lines extending as hereunder described from the shore seawards to their intersection and by the foreshore between such lines, one of such lines forming the northern boundary of such area extending seawards parallel with and 100 feet off the northern side of the new pier from a post on the shore, and the other line forming the eastern boundary of such area extending seaward from the junction of the eastern side of the breakwater with the shore through a point 100 feet to seaward of the outer extremity of the new pier.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, and 11, respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
