THE TOWN OF CAULFIELD CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of September, 1901.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to declare any borough, having in the year preceding such declaration a gross revenue of not less than Ten thousand pounds, a town: And whereas by the said Acts it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may exercise any of the powers therein conferred as aforesaid after the presentation of a petition in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts for the exercise thereof, and after the publication of such petition as therein described and the lapse of one month at the least from the day of such publication, and except as in the said Acts provided, not otherwise: but that it shall be in the discretion of the Governor in Council absolutely to refuse the prayer of any such petition, or to grant the whole or any part thereof: And whereas it is further enacted that every petition to declare any borough a city or town must be signed with the common seal of such borough, and that every Order exercising any such powers as aforesaid shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition signed with the common seal of the Borough of Caulfield to declare the said borough a town has been presented to the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been duly published in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas the gross revenue of the said Borough of Caulfield in the year ended on the 30th September, 1900, was not less than Ten thousand pounds: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order declare the said Borough of Caulfield to be a Town under the designation of

THE TOWN OF CAULFIELD.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
