PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

TUESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Dimboola and Numurkah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Maryborough and the Shire of Strathfeldsaye; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Brighton;

WEDNESDAY, THE 9TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 10TH DAYS OF OCTOBER, 1901, as Public Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, throughout the City of Bendigo;

THURSDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Tunganah;

TUESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Birchip and Wycheproof;

WEDNESDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Chiltern and Waranga, the West Riding of the Shire of Dimboola, and the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Yarrawonga, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Nhill and Rutherglen;

WEDNESDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Cari-brook and Talbot, the Shires of Numurkah and Yea, and the North and Central Ridings of the Shire of Euroa, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Dunolly, Horsham and Maryborough;

WEDNESDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Maldon.

MORRISON BAY.—PILOTAGE CRUISING GROUND.

MASTERS of vessels departing by way of the North-west Channel, Moreton Bay, are reminded that pilots should be discharged at or within the prescribed Pilot Cruising Ground off the entrance to the North Channel. This is necessary to prevent delay to vessels arriving from the South requiring pilots.

MORRISON BAY, NORTH CHANNEL.—NEW ENTRANCE LEADING LIGHT.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after 14th October a light will be exhibited from the western slope of Howard Range, Moreton Island, in the following position:—

Comboyuro Point Light bearing N. 29° W., distant 2½ miles. The light will be white, placed in a square white light room, at an elevation of about 200 feet above sea-level, and will be visible over an arc of about 15 degrees from S. 22° E. to S. 37° E. It is a 4th order heliophote, and with Comboyuro Point Light in line forms a lead past the East Banks.

Directions.

Vessels entering from seaward will proceed as hitherto, crossing the line of Cowan Cowan and Tangaluma Lights and continuing until the new high light comes in line with Comboyuro Point Light bearing S. 29° E. Keep this line until the Yellow Patch Light shuts out, when haul quickly to the eastward and make the Tangaluma-Cowan lead. Keep this line and continue as before.

Vessels outward bound will keep the Tangaluma lead until the Yellow Patch Light opens, when they must haul quickly to the westward and gain the new lead on a S. 29° E. bearing. Keep this line until Yellow Patch and Cape Moreton are in line, or nearly so, when haul out and proceed as hitherto.
