ASSISTANT MEDICAL INSPECTOR.—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Saturday, the 2nd February, 1901, from persons who are qualified, for appointment to the position of Assistant Medical Inspector, Department of Public Health.

Yearly salary :—£537 minimum ; £600 maximum.*

The officer appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters and such others as the Board of Public Health or the Minister of Health may from time to time direct :—

- (1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
- (2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the community.
- (3) Perusing, minuting, and advising on the reports of local officers of health and inspectors, and on the reports of the Board's sanitary inspectors.
- (4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed or when special action by the Board is required.
- (5) Investigating the causes of and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.
- (6) Making periodical inspections of and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony.
- (7) Advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any disease introduced into Victoria.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water, and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of any Act relating thereto and administered by the Board.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for noxious trade establishments.

The person appointed must be prepared at any moment to clear incoming and outgoing vessels ; to take the duties of Medical Superintendent of the Quarantine Station, or to take the general medical management of any isolation hospital under the control of the Board.

Applicants should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be in vigorous and sound health, have all the necessary qualifications for registration as a medical practitioner of Victoria, and engage to become at once, on appointment, registered as such, and show that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable disease.

DETERMINATION OF THE STONE CUTTERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter-cutting in marble and stone has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter-cutting in marble and stone shall be:—

Carvers in marble or stone, other than monumental carvers—1s. 10½d. per hour, or £4 4s. 4½d. for a maximum number of 45 hours per week.

Monumental carvers in marble or stone—1s. 4½d. per hour, or £3 1s. 10½d. for a maximum number of 45 hours per week.

Carvers' assistants, meaning persons employed in roughing out marble or stone under the direction of a carver, for other than monumental purposes—1s. 6d. per hour, or £3 7s. 6d. for a maximum number of 45 hours per week.

Letter-cutters in marble or stone, meaning persons employed in marking letters, cutting letters, drilling holes for lead, or leading letters—1s. 4½d. per hour, or £3 1s. 10½d. for a maximum number of 45 hours per week.

Stone-cutters employed in cutting marble for any purpose, or stone for monumental purposes, or plain bluestone steps, window-sills, or street kerbing—1s. 2d. per hour, or £2 12s. 6d. for a maximum number of 45 hours per week.

Other stone-cutters—1s. 3d. per hour, or £2 16s. 3d. for a maximum number of 45 hours per week.

Stone-cutters employed in cutting stone known as granite to be paid 2d. per hour in addition to above rates, unless the following tools are provided by the employer, viz.:—Drills, bull-punches, tongs, striking hammers, and patent axes. If such tools are provided by the employer the extra rate shall be 1d. per hour.

Polishers, employed in sanding, gritting, or finishing marble—10½d. per hour, or £2 2s. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

Polishers, employed in sanding, gritting, or finishing stone known as granite—11d. per hour, or £2 4s. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

Labourers—10d. per hour, or £2 for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

Sand boys, meaning persons under eighteen years of age employed in attending to granite polishing lathes or stone-cutting saws, or feeding such saws with sand or shot—10s. for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

Number.

(2) That the number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be one apprentice or improver to every eight persons or fraction of eight persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter-cutting in marble and stone, and receiving not less than 10½d. per hour.

(5) That 2d. per hour in addition to above rates shall be paid in all cases mentioned in clauses 1, 3, and 4 unless all tools are sharpened by the employer.

OVERTIME.

(6) (a) That, with the exception of apprentices, any male employé over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter-cutting in marble and stone, who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(b) That any male apprentice over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter-cutting in marble and stone who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

DEFINITION.

(7) Wherever occurring in this Determination, the term "Monumental" shall mean pertaining to monuments, such as are erected in cemeteries.

(8) That this Determination shall come into force from the 4th day of March, 1901.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

EXPORT ENTRIES FOR FREE GOODS.

THE special attention of exporters of free goods is drawn to the Regulations at foot respecting the export of goods, and it is notified for general information that such Regulation will in future be strictly enforced.

In order to avoid any hindrance to business, the Collector of Customs will always, when satisfied that occasion so requires, give permission to ship free goods in anticipation of the passing of the entry, but only on guarantee that the entry therefor shall be passed within 48 hours of the departure of the vessel in which the goods have been shipped.

REGULATIONS AS TO EXPORT ENTRIES.

5. Any person who shall, without the consent of the Collector of Customs, export or ship, or be concerned in exporting or shipping, any goods for which an export entry shall not have been passed, shall, for each and every such offence, be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten shillings or more than Twenty pounds.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.—REGULATION RELATING TO DRAWBACK OF WHARFAGE RATES.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

Regulation No. 91 of Part I. of the Regulations of the said Commissioners is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is made, and shall be read and construed with and form part of Part I. of the Regulations of the said Commissioners, passed on the 28th day of March, 1900:—

No. 91. Where goods upon which the rates, tolls, and charges imposed by section 110 of the Act have been paid shall be exported to any place outside Victoria, the Commissioners may allow, at refund by way of drawback, to the owner of the goods at the time of exportation an amount equal to the rates, tolls, and charges previously paid on the goods so exported, less the sum of One shilling per ton, provided that the claim for such drawback be made before the 15th day of the month next following that in which such goods shall have been so exported. Such drawback may be claimed in the case of all goods, other than tea and grain, only when such goods are exported in the original packages; but where the goods are imported in bulk and subsequently exported, the Commissioners may in exceptional cases allow drawback, though such goods were not exported in the original packages. The tonnage shall be ascertained in the case of all goods, except tea, either by weight or measurement, at the option of the Commissioners:—

(a) In the case of tea by reckoning eight chests, or sixteen half-chests, or forty quarter-chests, or eighty boxes of the original package, or eight hundred pounds of tea, re-packed, as one ton measurement.

(b) The tonnage on grain shall be ascertained by weight, and drawback allowed only when re-packed under Customs supervision.

The births of 1,006 children, viz., 537 boys and 469 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, higher than in the corresponding month during the three preceding years, although lower than that in any other of the previous years, and was 100 below the average of the month during the period of ten years, or 133 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in December numbered 734, viz., 405 of males and 329 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 272, or 37 per cent., as against 41 per cent. in December, 1899, and 46 according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 58 more than in December, 1899, but the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1893 and 1894; it was also 25 below the average of December during the last ten years, and 48 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24·79, and of deaths registered to 18·09 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 23·96 and 16·94 respectively, and during the last ten years of 23·04 and 19·31 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31·27 and 16·80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 104·8° on the 30th, and the lowest was 45·6° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (63·1°) was 1·2° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (47·0°) took place on the 25th, and the least range (8·8°) on the 27th. The mean daily range was 23·2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·197 inches on the 21th, and the lowest was 29·369 inches on the 3rd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·845 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 7 days, the amount being 1·18 inches, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1896 and 1898.

The mean humidity of the month was 653.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality, as against 36 per cent. in December, 1899; 41 per cent. in December, 1898; 43 per cent. in December, 1897; 43 per cent. in December, 1896; 42 per cent. in December, 1895; and 39 per cent. in December, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 205, as compared with 196 in December, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was 204 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 205 in December, 1899; 304 in December, 1898; 343 in December, 1897; 255 in December, 1896; 256 in December, 1895; 209 in December, 1894; 260 in December, 1893; 246 in December, 1892; 273 in December, 1891; and 189 in December, 1890.

Eighty-four persons—as against 72 in December, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a gentleman and a female, each aged 75, died of apoplexy; a squatter, aged 75, of epilepsy; a female, aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; a miner, aged 75, of aneurism; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a painter, aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a storekeeper and two females, each aged 76, of cancer; a miner, aged 76, of tumour of the brain; a grocer, aged 76, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 76, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of tumour of the abdomen; a gentleman and an ironmonger, each aged 77, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of Bright's disease; a farmer, aged 78, of dysentery; a female, aged 78, of paralysis; two gentlemen, each aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart and heart disease (undefined) respectively; an overseer, aged 78, of stomatitis; a gentleman, aged 78, of cystitis; two females, each aged 79, of diarrhoea and tuberculosis respectively; a male, of no occupation, aged 79, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 79, of hemiplegia and valvular disease of the heart respectively; an engraver and a soap manufacturer, each aged 79, of cystitis; two females, each aged 80, of influenza and cancer respectively; two females, each aged 80, of apoplexy; a female, aged 81, of dysentery; a carpenter, aged 81, of cerebral hemorrhage; a caretaker, aged 81, of heart disease; two females and a gentleman, each aged 81, of oedema of the lungs, disease of liver, and retention of urine respectively; an upholsterer, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a collector, aged 82, of hemiplegia; four females, each aged 83, of cancer, paralysis, pneumonia, and hepatic disease respectively; a labourer, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a male, of no occupation, and a female, each aged 85, of insanity; a gentleman, aged 85, of heart disease and dropsy; two females, each aged 85, of pneumonia and fracture of the thigh respectively; a pensioner, aged 86, of gout; a female, aged 86, of heart disease; an engine-driver, aged 88, of bronchitis; a gamekeeper, aged 89, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 91, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 92, of diarrhoea; a salesman and two females, each aged 75, a pavior and a labourer, each aged 76, an engineer and a carter, each aged 78, two females, each aged 79, a baker, a cooper, and a shipwright, each aged 80, a musician and three females, each aged 81, a labourer and a female, each aged 82, a labourer, aged 83, a gentleman and two females, each aged 85, and a housekeeper, aged 88, of old age.

Thirty of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 27 in December, 1899—were from external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 12, was killed by a kick from a horse; an apprentice-mariner, aged 17, died of injuries, the result of a fall down the hold of a ship; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, of fracture of the skull, consequent on a fall from Prince's bridge; a boy, aged 6, of injuries, caused by a post falling on him; a boy, aged 8, of injuries to the skull; a female, aged 20, of cerebral compression; a carpenter, aged 70, and a female, aged 85, of fracture of the thigh, the results of falls; a cook (male), aged 35, of rupture of the liver, no evidence to show how caused; a female child, aged 18 months, of traumatic tetanus; two females, aged 6 and 11 respectively, and a labourer, aged 37, of burns; a legal manager, aged 53, of heat apoplexy; a painter, aged 51, of lead poisoning; a gardener, aged 32, was poisoned by arsenic; a female, aged 74, by ammonia; a seaman, aged 35, was drowned in the River Yarra, by falling off a steamer; five persons were "found drowned," viz., a kitchenmaid, aged 49, and a commercial traveller, aged 58, in the River Yarra, a miner, aged 53, in the Saltwater River, a boy, aged 8, and a seaman, aged 38, in Hobson's Bay; a female child, aged 4 months, was suffocated by drawing vomited matter into the lungs; and a male child, aged 1 month, by the inhalation of blood into the windpipe. The homicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 65, who died of injuries to the head, a verdict of wilful murder being returned, and a new-born male infant, who was found dead in a water-hole (probably murder). The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 28, who drowned himself; a secretary, aged 45, who hanged himself; and a restaurant-keeper, aged 58, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and seventy-eight deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—71 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 10 in the Women's, 12 in the Children's, 8 in the Homoeopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 8 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 18 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 8 in the Protestant Refuge; and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 251, of which 148, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 103, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 205 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 1 was between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 483. Of these 257, or 53 per cent., were males, and 226, or 47 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 41 were between sixty and sixty-five, 46 were between sixty-five and seventy, 53 were between seventy and seventy-five, 42 were between seventy-five and eighty, 27 were between eighty and eighty-five, 13 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 13 deaths (equally distributed between infants and old people) under developmental, 61 under local diseases, and 3 under the head of violence, whilst there was a decrease of 15 under zymotic diseases. Under the zymotic class, deaths from measles rose from nil to 9, those from diphtheria from 4 to 7, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 21 to 27, whilst those from influenza fell from 31 to 3. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system and those from diseases of the circulatory system each increased by 18, and those from diseases of the digestive system (chiefly enteritis) by 37; whilst those from diseases of the respiratory system diminished by 18, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 4.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. The mortality from typhoid fever in 1900 was—both absolutely and relatively—the lowest recorded during the last 40 years.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the first and second divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for racing shall be as follows:—For admission of every adult to the first division, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence; for admission of every adult to the second division, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

10. No person shall, after the 17th day of January, 1901, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portion of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

TEMPORARY MANAGEMENT OF WATER RESERVES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation, place under the temporary management and control of, or may absolutely vest in, any Waterworks Trust any public water reserve or any waterworks, stream, or reservoir, either on any Crown lands, or begun, constructed, or provided for by any moneys provided by Parliament before or after the passing of the said Act: Provided, however, that notice of intention to make such Proclamation shall be advertised, for a period of at least one month previously to the making thereof, in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood of the property to be vested by such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act (notice of intention having been duly advertised), do hereby place under the temporary management and control of the Elmore Waterworks Trust the Water Reserves herein described, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1893*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1893*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1893* aforesaid the Governor

in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1893* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
