## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to authorize and validate certain Expenditure by the Councils of various Municipalities in connexion with the Mourning for the Death of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria or in Commemoration of Her Reign and in the Opening of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and the Visit of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York and towards the Cost of Celebrating and Commemorating the Services rendered by Imperial and Colonial Soldiers in South Africa and China."

"An Act to amend the *Dookie and Kalamatite Tramway Act 1897*."

"An Act to sanction the acquisition by the State of certain land in the County of Grenville known as the Eurack Estate."

"An Act to further amend the *Marriage Act 1890*."

"An Act for the purpose of altering the reservation of the Wangaratta Town Hall Site so far as that reservation relates to Athenæum purposes."

"An Act to authorize the Sale of the Mooropna Race-course Reserve and for other purposes."

### GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1901-2.

*Marine Act 1890.*AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS  
AND MATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

**W**HEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the conduct of examinations of persons desiring to obtain certificates of competency as masters and mates, as to the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, and for the issue of certificates of competency thereto: And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 20th day of September, 1895, make such regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulations Nos. 37 to 49, both inclusive, of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of October, 1895, and to make amended regulations in lieu thereof.

Now, therefore, the said Board, with the consent of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal the regulations numbered as aforesaid from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended regulations in lieu, and to be read in substitution thereof, that is to say:—

## SIGHT TESTS.

37. The sight tests are open to all persons serving or intending to serve in the Mercantile Marine, and all such persons are recommended to take the earliest opportunity of ascertaining by means of these tests whether their vision is such as to qualify them for service in that profession.

38. Any person serving or intending to serve in the Mercantile Marine, if desirous of undergoing the form vision, colour vision, and colour ignorance tests *only*, must make application to the Secretary to the Marine Board on form to be obtained therefrom, and must pay a fee of One shilling. This fee will be payable on each occasion upon which a candidate is examined in form vision and colour tests *only*.

39. Every candidate for a certificate of competency of any grade must pass the three tests before he can proceed to the examination in navigation and seamanship.

40. The three tests are—

- (a) Form vision test.
- (b) Colour vision test.
- (c) Colour ignorance test.

41. No candidate will be examined in the colour vision test until he has passed the form vision test, or in the colour ignorance test until he has passed the colour vision test.

42. The foregoing rule must be observed, whether the candidate has or has not on any previous occasion passed the sight tests.

43. Candidates who fail to pass the form vision test or colour ignorance test can be re-examined at intervals of three months.

44. Candidates who fail to pass the colour vision test cannot be re-examined. It is open, however, to any candidate who has failed to pass the colour vision test to appeal to the Board, who may, if they think fit, remit the case to a special examiner or body of examiners for final decision.

45. The expenses of candidates who are examined by such special examiner or body of examiners, and are reported by him or them to have passed, will, under certain circumstances, be paid by the Board, at a rate which will be notified to the candidate.

46. No payment whatever will be made towards the expenses of candidates who, upon their own application, are examined by the special examiner or examiners, and are reported by him or them to have failed, unless the Board consider that the particular circumstances of the case justify such payment. The special examinations will be held in Melbourne only.

47. When a candidate fails to pass the colour vision test, the examiner will point out to him the conditions under which he can appeal. Appeals are to be made through the examiner, and forwarded to the Board with the examiner's remarks.

48. The fee paid for examination for a certificate of competency includes the fee of One shilling for examination in form vision, colour vision, and colour ignorance, and if the candidate fails to pass those tests this fee will, with the exception of One shilling, be returned to him.

49. Only examiners who have themselves passed the colour vision test are to undertake these examinations.

These regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1901, on which date Regulations Nos. 37 to 49 inclusive as hereinbefore referred to shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this 27th day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1901.

THE births of 59 boys and 52 girls, or in all of 111 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September. Of these, 50 occurred in Ballarat East, 54 in Ballarat West, 4 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 134, viz., 74 of boys and 60 of girls.

The deaths registered in September numbered 53, viz., 27 of males and 26 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 58. In August the recorded deaths numbered 81; in September, 1900, they numbered 71; in September, 1899, they numbered 67; in September, 1898, they numbered 60; in September, 1897, they numbered 57; in September, 1896, they numbered 52; in September, 1895, they numbered 57; in September, 1894, they numbered 77; in September, 1893, they numbered 69; in September, 1892, they numbered 43; and in September, 1891, they numbered 63.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

## VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of September in all the Bendigo Districts was 127; of these 60 were of males and 67 of females; included were 5 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 142, viz.:—69 of males and 73 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 49, viz.:—30 of males and 19 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 78. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 77; in the month of September, 1900, they numbered 54; in the month of September, 1899, they numbered 54; in the month of September, 1898, they numbered 72; in the month of September, 1897, they numbered 62; in the month of September, 1896, they numbered 66; in the month of September, 1895, they numbered 70; in the month of September, 1894, they numbered 49; in the month of September, 1893, they numbered 58; in the month of September, 1892, they numbered 47; and in the month of September, 1891, they numbered 57.

Of the registered births 91 occurred within the city of Bendigo, and 36 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 37 took place within and 12 without the city.

The following table shows the number of deaths registered in each district, distinguishing those of males and females and those of persons under and over five years of age:—

Of the 49 deaths registered during the month 13, or 27 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 36, or 73 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 18 and 82 per cent.

Eleven deaths, or 22 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 9; Benevolent Asylum, 2.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in all the Bendigo Districts during the month of September, separating those of persons under from those over five years of age, and also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from phthisis rose from 4 to 6; and those from diseases of the digestive system from 2 to 10. On the other hand, deaths from cancer fell from 5 to 2; those from diseases of the nervous system from 10 to 4; those from diseases of the circulatory system from 12 to 9; and those under the head of violence from 4 to nil. On the whole, there was an absence of epidemics, and the mortality generally was low.

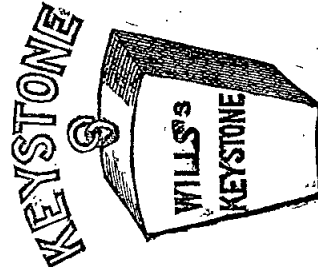

## EXEMPTIONS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF PART I. OF THE CHINESE ACT 1890.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**WHEREAS** by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, from the date hereof, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor of Victoria and the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of the *Land Act 1884*, and bearing date the 27th day of August, 1888, certain Crown land in the parish of Turrumberry North was proclaimed as a township: And whereas by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, annul and rescind any Proclamation made under the said Act or any Act of Parliament thereby or theretofore repealed of any portion or portions of Crown lands as towns or townships: And whereas it is expedient now to partly rescind the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby rescind the said Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of August, 1888, so far only as it relates to the portion of land hereunder described, viz:—

County of Gunbower, parish of Turrumberry North: Commencing at a point bearing N. 0° 4' E. one chain from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 9; bounded thence by a road easterly to the east boundary of the township; and thence by the township boundary northerly, westerly, and southerly to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

SHIRE OF BALLAN.—DEVIATION OF A ROAD  
IN THE PARISH OF GORONG.

At an Executive Council, held at the Law Courts, Melbourne,  
the eighth day of October, 1901.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in the said Acts, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

Additions to and alterations in the Regulations made on the 4th day of July, 1899.

PART II.—CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLER LANDS.

CHAPTER VI.—AURIFEROUS LANDS.

Lands alienated under Section 41, Land Act 1900 (No. 2).

In all cases where land granted in fee simple pursuant to the provisions of section 41 of the Land Act 1900 (No. 2) is fenced, wholly or partly, the owner shall post and keep posted at conspicuous places notices to the effect that the land has been alienated pursuant to section 41 of the Land Act 1900 (No. 2), and may be entered upon at any time for mining purposes; and shall also paint in red colour the corner posts and gate posts in connexion with such fencing from one (1) foot from the ground to the top of the posts as a further indication that the land is available to the miner.

PART IV.—SAWMILL AND TIMBER LICENCES, STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

CHAPTER XIII.—FELLING AND REMOVAL OF REDGUM TIMBER AND PAYMENT FOR SAME BY MEASUREMENT.
