MUTUAL EXTRADITION OF FUGITIVE CRIMINALS. —TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND SERVIA.

Sir,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of His Majesty the King in Council, dated the 15th of June, 1901, for giving effect to the Treaty between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the King of Servia for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, signed at Belgrade on the 6th December, 1900, the ratifications of which were exchanged at that city on the 13th March, 1901.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

EXTRADITION TREATY—SERVIA.

Saint James's, 15th June, 1901.

At the Court at Saint James's, the 15th day of June, 1901.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it is, amongst other things, enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the sixth day of December, One thousand nine hundred, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the King of Servia for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the

King of Servia, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Sir George Francis Bonham, a Baronet of the United Kingdom, Her Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Servia;

And His Majesty the King of Servia, His Excellency Monsieur Alexa S. Jovanovic, His President of the Council of Ministers, Minister for Foreign Affairs, Member of the Council of State, Grand Officer of the Order of Milosh the Great, Grand Cross of the Order of Takovo, Officer of the Order of the White Eagle, Commander of the Order of St. Sava, Grand Cross of the Order of Osmanieh, &c., &c.;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

ARTICLE II.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
4. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
5. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for counterfeiting coin.
6. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged, or counterfeited, or altered.
7. Embezzlement or larceny.
8. Malicious injury to property, by explosives or otherwise, if the offence be indictable.
9. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
10. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
11. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
12. Fraud by a bailor, banker, agent, factor, trustee or director, or member, or public officer of any Company made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
14. Rape.
15. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under 14 years of age.
16. Indecent assault.
17. Procuring miscarriage, administering drugs, or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.
18. Abduction.
19. Child stealing.
20. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.

21. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
22. Burglary or housebreaking.
23. Arson.
24. Robbery with violence.
25. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.
26. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort.
27. Piracy by law of nations.
28. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.
29. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life, or do grievous bodily harm.
30. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.
31. Dealing in slaves.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial, within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination, or is undergoing sentence under a conviction for any other crime within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of his sentence or otherwise.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution, or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of the accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

If the fugitive has been arrested in the British Dominions he shall forthwith be brought before a competent magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the British Dominions.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations the authorities of the British Dominions shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in Serbia, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of, a conviction, provided the same are authenticated, as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or Judicial Officer of Police of Serbia.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or Judicial Officer of Police of Serbia, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Judicial Officer of Police of Serbia.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or of Foreign Affairs of Serbia; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law in that part of the British dominions where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XI.

On the part of the Servian Government the extradition shall take place as follows in Serbia:—

The Minister, or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in Serbia, shall send to the Minister for Foreign Affairs, in support of each demand for extradition, an authentic and duly legalized copy either of a certificate of condemnation or of a warrant of arrest against an incriminated or accused person, showing clearly the nature of the crime or offence on account of which proceedings are being taken against the fugitive. The judicial document so produced shall be accompanied by a description and other particulars serving to establish the identity of the person whose extradition is claimed.

In case the documents produced by the British Government to establish the identity, and the particulars gathered by the Servian police authorities for the same purpose, should be deemed to be insufficient, notice thereof shall forthwith be given to the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in Serbia, and the individual whose extradition is desired, if he has been arrested, shall remain in detention until the British Government has produced new elements of proof to establish his identity, or to clear up any other difficulties arising in the examination.

ARTICLE XII.

The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to. In Her Britannic Majesty's dominions the fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper Tribunal thereof shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place, and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any such Colonies or foreign possessions may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such Colony or possession as a Consular Officer of Serbia.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Serbia who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Belgrade as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate at Belgrade, the 6 December, 1900.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at Belgrade on the 13th day of March, One thousand nine hundred and one.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and one, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Serbia, and of the said Treaty with Serbia.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Sir,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 15th June, 1900,* enclosing a Memorandum from the Foreign Office in regard to the appointment of British Commercial Agents in various countries abroad, I have the honour to transmit to you, for general information, a copy of a further Memorandum from the Foreign Office respecting the abolition of the fees hitherto charged by British Commercial Agents for supplying information to private firms.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has arranged with the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury that, during the temporary extension of the period of the appointment of British Commercial Agents in various countries abroad, the fees hitherto levied for answering inquiries, &c., shall be remitted, except in so far as the cost of journeys undertaken by them for private firms has to be met. In the case of such journeys the subsistence fee of £1 1s. per night will still be claimed, in addition to the actual expenses of locomotion, but there will be no charge for the Agent's services.

II. OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR EASTERN CADETSHIPS IN THE COLONIAL SERVICE, AND CLERKSHIPS (CLASS I.) IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

I.—CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1902, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 1st July, 1902, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of His Majesty.

(ii.) That he had attained the age of 21, and had not attained the age of 23, on the first day of the year in which the examination is held.

[N.B.—In a case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality, issued under notification of the Government of India, No. 2252, dated 21st August, 1888, as amended by notification No. 404, dated 19th May, 1898, and signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or; should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

II.—CADETSHIPS IN THE COLONIAL SERVICE, AND CLERKSHIPS (CLASS I.) IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

If Open Competitive Examinations for the following Services, viz. :—

Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service;
Clerkships (Class I.) in the Home Civil Service;

should be held in 1902 concurrently with the Open Competitive Examination for the Civil Service of India, candidates duly eligible in respect of age will be admitted to compete for any two or all three of these Services, subject to the following conditions :—

(1) That they fill up and return to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, an application on each of the prescribed forms, within the time limited by respective regulations.* (*Note.—A separate form of application is required for each of the three services.*)

(2) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for either the India or the Colonial Service, as well as for the Home Service, will be called upon to declare, immediately after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the India or Colonial Service, or on the list of candidates for Clerkships in the Home Civil Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Clerkships in the Home Civil Service.

(3) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for both the India and Colonial Services will be called upon to declare, after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Civil Service of India, or on the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships.

(4) That all declarations of choice are irrevocable. Candidates admitted to compete for all three or any two of these classes of appointments will be required to pay a consolidated fee of £6.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 154.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, hereby makes the following By-law:—

No person shall ride any bicycle or other machine upon or along any railway pier, wharf, jetty, or upon or along any railway platform, or upon or along any pathway, subway, or other way used in connexion with any of the railway stations, buildings, piers, wharfs, or jetties vested in the Victorian Railways Commissioner and set apart for the exclusive use of pedestrians, and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Alexandra, made under Part III. of the *Health Act 1890* and under the *Health Act 1900*, and numbered 5, for providing for the registration of persons carrying on the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for inspection of dairies, and for fixing the fee to be paid for each such registration.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Alexandra, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 5 of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of former by-laws.*—All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. *Date of coming into force.*—This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. *Scope.*—This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Alexandra.

4. *Persons who shall register—Fees.*—From and after the coming into force of this by-law, every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall within fifteen days from and after the first day of January in every year, and every person about to carry on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade or business, register himself with the said council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application, if he does not keep any cows, pay a fee of 5s.; but if he does keep any cows, then he shall with such application pay a fee according to the following scale, namely:—

5. *Registration and books.*—Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee, the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for the purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. *Inspection of water supply and paddocks—Prohibition of use of same—Inspection by veterinary surgeon.*—All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used by any person in his trade or business as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk as a grazing ground for dairy cattle, and all sources of water supply used in connexion therewith shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the president or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, enclosures, or sources of water supply, or any of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the shire secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding or watering dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order; and any such order the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may be made. All cattle and other animals used or kept by any person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from the poverty or weakness of their bodily condition are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from the premises of such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

7. *Alteration of premises.*—The council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking-place, cow-shed, milk-store, milk-shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, water supply, or in any other respect whatsoever, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce; may order such person to make alterations in any such buildings or structures and to remedy any such defects within a time to be specified in such order.

8. *Closets, night-soil, &c.*—Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and at such a distance from the dairy, milking-place, milk-store, milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises, and such methods shall be adopted for the disposal of the night-soil as may be directed by the council, and the closets on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

9. *Horses, stabling, &c.*—Where horses are kept on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such a distance from the dairy, milking-place, milk-store, milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises as the council may direct.

10. *Cleanliness to be observed.*—All houses, dairies, milking-places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk, or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings and milking-places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and such means of access shall be provided to the source or sources of water supply as may be directed by the council or duly authorized officer as aforesaid.

11. *Sweeping, Fumigating, &c.*—All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer, or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, lime-washed, or be otherwise dealt with, as may be in any such order so directed.

12. *Scalding and care of vessels.*—All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily, and no cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or person employed in the milking or dairy work, shall use in connexion with milking or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit by order served, as prescribed in clause 7 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

13. *Cow-keeper to notify council of disease of stock.*—If at any time disease exists in or among the cows or other stock of any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

14. *Provision where pigs kept.*—No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

15. *Infected persons.*—No person who is suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or who has been so situated by contact with any person or persons so suffering or otherwise so that he may have contracted or be in danger of contracting any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, shall

milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, shire secretary, or health officer so to do.

16. *Epidemics, &c.—Milk, &c., not to be used.*—If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on, or occupying, or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cow-sheds, or as a milk-shop or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked his wife or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force, and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk and the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

17. *Report of Inspector.*—Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, and the premises of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be inspected once in each half-year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds, and buildings, closet and stable accommodation, disposal of night-soil and manure, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

18. *Interpretation.*—In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular number, and the word person shall include a corporation, and the word "cows" shall mean and include all cows in profit, all cows in calf, heifers, and cows, and dry cows to be subsequently used as milkers.

19. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or to Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 5 of the Shire of Alexandra, was agreed to by the council of the said shire on the fifth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and one, and confirmed on the ninth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and one.

BY-LAW NO. 14 AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Waranga, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Waranga, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Waranga.

4. From and after coming into force of this by-law every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Shire of Waranga shall, within fifteen days from and after the first day of November, 1901, and from and after the first day of September, in subsequent years, and every person about to carry on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade within the said shire, register himself with the said Shire Council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the said shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every person shall with every such application pay a fee of Sixpence for every cow kept. The minimum charge to be Two shillings and sixpence, and the maximum charge to be Two pounds, and when so registering shall verify the particulars contained in the application for registration hereunder written as to the number of cows kept by a statutory declaration.

All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid, the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any manner whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk or any visitor or member of the family or any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health by order served as aforesaid to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor if the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council,

officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

And any such order as aforesaid the said Council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, and other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice to the Council or Officer of Health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Council or Officer of Health by order, served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until the danger, in the opinion of such Council or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any such person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Council or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of the diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

5. That after the words "pay a fee," in clause 30 of By-law No. 25, the words "of Five shillings," shall be struck out and the following substituted:—"in accordance with the following scale:—

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 21.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1902.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.
2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation.
3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per cent. on the valuation.
4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of Thirty pounds and under, a minimum rate of Two pounds per annum.
5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of Thirty pounds, the sum of Six pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Two pounds.
6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of Five pounds per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.
7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.
8. Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum. Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.
9. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
10. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.
11. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
12. For water supplied to steam boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.
13. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.
14. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.
15. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.
16. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 21, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 6th day of September, 1901.

**TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1902, No. 1.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1902 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual (municipal) value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.
3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.
4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses one, two, and three of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling: Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses one, two, and three of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to agree for a special charge, from time to time, with any ratepayer for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of One Shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

**MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1902.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.
6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.
9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulations were passed by the Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust this 12th September, 1901, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

On an average, ten words make a line, but for the description of a brand consisting of more than one letter, &c., placed perpendicularly, thus, B, each additional letter under the first is charged as a line.

Every Signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

Signatures (in particular) and Proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE is published on WEDNESDAY EVENING in each week, and Notices for insertion must be received by the Government Printer on or before Two o'clock of the day preceding the day of publication.
