Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ENGRAVERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker, has made the following Determination, namely:—

That the Determination made by the Board, and dated the 30th April, 1901, be cancelled and annulled from the 18th November, 1901.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

Number.

That the number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed'within any factory or workroom, or shop or place, shall be-

One apprentice of improver to every four persons, or fraction thereof, engaged in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker, and receiving not less than the minimum wage of 50s. per week.

WAGES.

That the lowest price or rates of payment payable to apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker shall be as follows:-

OVERTIME.

That, with the exception of apprentices, any person over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

That any apprentice over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid at the rate of Threepence per hour in addition to the rates fixed for apprentices' wages.

NUMBER.

That the number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory or workroom, or shop or place, shall be-

One apprentice or improver to every four persons, or fraction thereof, engaged in the process, trade, or business of a process engraver, and receiving not less than the minimum wage of 50s. per week.

WAGES.

That the lowest price or rates of payment payable to apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a process engraver shall be as follows:—

And thereafter the minimum wage fixed by the Board.

OVERTIME.

That, with the exception of apprentices, any person over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a process engraver who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

That any apprentice over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a process engraver who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid at the rate of Threepence per hour in addition to the rates fixed for apprentices' wages.

That this Determination shall come into force on and after the 18th November, 1901.
