CONSERVATOR OF FORESTS.

The births of 1,125 children, viz., 613 boys and 512 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was, it will be observed, 174 more than the exceptionally low number recorded in September 1900, and was but slightly below the average of the years 1894 to 1899—during which period the rate was tolerably uniform—although still much fewer than in the earlier years of the past decade; it was 79 below the average of the month during the whole ten years referred to, or 146 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in September numbered 594, viz., 321 of males and 273 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 531, or by 89 per cent., as against 58 per cent. in September 1900, and 105 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 8 less than in September, 1900, but was higher than that recorded for the month during any other year since 1891 except 1893 (642); it was also 6 above the average of September during the previous decade, but 27 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.70, and of deaths registered to 14.63 per annum; as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 24.22 and 15.33 respectively; and with averages for the month during the last ten years of 31.61 and 15.41 respectively; and averages for the whole year of 29.74 and 16.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 76.1° on the 13th, and the lowest was 40.0° on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (53.8°) was seven tenths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.3°) took place on the 18th, and the least range (1.1°) on the 22nd. The mean daily range was 15.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.325 inches on the 26th, and the lowest was 29.385 inches on the 8th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.877 inches) was somewhat below the average.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 1.47 inches, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years, except 1891 and 1899, and nearly four-fifths of an inch below the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was 735.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 21 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in September, 1900, 18 per cent. in September, 1899, 25 per cent. in September, 1898; 21 per cent. in September, 1897; 20 per cent. in September, 1896; 22 per cent. in September, 1895; and 30 per cent. in September, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 100, as compared with 72 in September, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 89 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 76 in September, 1900; 61 in September, 1899; 81 in September, 1898; 75 in September, 1897; 59 in September, 1896; 48 in September, 1895; 89 in September, 1894; 91 in September, 1893; 72 in September, 1892; and 123 in September, 1891.

In striking contrast to the decline in the percentage of deaths of children under five years, the proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last ten years, proving infallibly that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions. The actual numbers of aged persons cannot be ascertained until the results of the recent census have been fully tabulated.

Of these, a cook and a female, each aged 75, died of cancer; four females, each aged 75, of cerebral hæmorrhage, paralysis, heart disease, and heart disease respectively; a farmer, aged 75, of pneumonia; two engineers, each aged 75, of jaundice and cystitis respectively; a female, aged 76, of phthisis; a butcher, aged 76, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 76, of locomotor ataxy; a gentleman and two females, each aged 76, of syncope; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a stonemason, aged 76, of disease of the prostate; a carrier, aged 76, of gunshot wounds (suicide); a farmer and a female, each aged 77, of pericarditis; a female, aged 77, of aneurism; a male, of no occupation, aged 77, of heart disease; a housekeeper, aged 77, of chronic nephritis; a nurse, aged 77, of uræmia; two females, each aged 78, of hæmiplegia and heart disease respectively; a station manager, aged 78, of disease of the bladder; a blacksmith, aged 79, of phthisis; a sea captain and a female, each aged 79, of syncope; a miner, aged 79, of emphysema; a female, aged 79, and a squatter, aged 80, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 80, of influenza and valvular disease of the heart respectively; a gentleman, aged 81, of pneumonia; a hairdresser, aged 81, of pleuro-pneumonia; two females, each aged 82, of insanity and bronchitis respectively; a female, aged 83, of erysipelas; a gentleman, aged 83, of cancer; a coachman, aged 83, of insanity; a male of no occupation, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; an engineer and a printer, each aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of pneumonia; another, aged 84, of cancer; two labourers, each aged 84, of hæmiplegia and pericarditis respectively; a female, aged 87, of embolism; a cab proprietor, aged 88, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 89, and a female, aged 90, of pneumonia; a female, aged 97, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, a labourer, aged 80, a labourer and a female, each 82, a gentleman, two males of no occupation, and a female, each aged 83, a female, aged 84, a basketmaker, aged 85, two females, aged 90 and 91 respectively, and a gardener, aged 95, of old age.

Thirty-four of the deaths recorded during the month, as compared with 26 in September, 1900, were from external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 10 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 2, was passed over by a tram car; a stock inspector, aged 62, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a tram; a groom, aged 35, of a rupture of an intestine, caused by a kick from a horse; a plumber, aged 40, and a pensioner, aged 64, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a cart in the former case, and from a buggy in the latter; a miner, aged 27, and a labourer, aged 30, of fracture of the skull, consequent in each case on a fall; a labourer, aged 38, of rupture of the bowel, no evidence to show how caused; a sawyer, aged 37, of injuries caused by a circular saw; three females, aged 3, 21, and 37 respectively, of burns; a quarryman, aged 68, was drowned in the Saltwater River; 6 persons were "found drowned," viz.:—An engineer, aged 29; a soap maker, aged 38; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 56; a leather merchant, aged 62; and a gentleman, aged 67, in the River Yarra; and an engineer, aged 49, in Hobson's Bay; and a female child, aged 5 weeks, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of a hawker, aged 22, who died of fracture of the skull, a verdict of wilful murder being returned; and two newborn male infants, and a female child, aged 4 weeks, who were suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a warrant officer, aged 38, and a carrier, aged 76, who shot themselves; a warehouseman, aged 32; and a labourer, aged 36, who cut their throats; an accountant, aged 35, and a stoker, aged 36, who poisoned themselves with strychnine; and a female, aged 36, with chloroform; two females, aged 15 and 41 respectively, who drowned themselves; and a waiter, aged 42, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and sixty-three deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne, 23 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 6 in the Homoeopathic, and 10 in the Austin Hospitals; 11 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 14 in the Benevolent and 5 in the Infant Asylums; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Protestant Refuge; and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol. The granting of old-age pensions ought to have the effect of reducing the proportion of deaths in public institutions.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 126, of which 67, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 59, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 100 were under one year of age, 12 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 1 at the age of four.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 463. Of these 254, or 54 per cent., were males, and 214, or 46 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 53 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 16 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 50 were between sixty-five and seventy, 42 were between seventy and seventy-five, 33 were between seventy-five and eighty, 25 were between eighty and eighty-five, 4 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 2 were between ninety-five and one hundred.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 5 deaths under zymotic, 2 under parasitic, 3 under dietic diseases, 8 under the head of violence, and 4 under ill-defined causes; whilst there was a decrease of 4 under constitutional, 10 under developmental, and 16 under local diseases. Under the zymotic class, there was a marked fall in the number of deaths from the epidemics of measles and diphtheria, but a more than counterbalancing rise in those from influenza, whooping-cough, and septic diseases. The current epidemic of influenza is rapidly abating, for its mortality, after having suddenly risen from 7 in June to 43 deaths each in July and August, fell to 14 in the month as against 3 in August and 13 in July, whilst the total since 1st January last has been 48. Under the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis rose from 58 to 77; whilst those from rheumatism fell from 6 to 1, cancer from 33 to 33, tubercular meningitis from 9 to 4, and other forms of tuberculosis, &c., from 16 to 9. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 13 to 17, but those from old age fell from 30 to 15. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 12, those from diseases of the organs of generation and diseases of parturition by 4 each, and those from diseases of the organs of locomotion from nil to 5; whilst those from diseases of the nervous and respiratory systems diminished by 6 each, those from diseases of the digestive system by 9, those from diseases of the urinary system by 16, and those from diseases of the integumentary system by 3.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first nine months of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations, viz.:

REGULATION No. 9.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, or brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or fixed for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the 1st day of January, 1902, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1902.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate and charges.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being thereof, the sum of Two shillings in the £1 of such valuation.

(3) For each vacant allotment or piece of land separately from any building, Two shillings in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation thereof.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 15.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the power conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulations for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply by the Trust within the Urban Division, and further purposes during the calendar year 1902:—

No. 1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situated in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such lands, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1902, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates:—

(a) On every house or tenement of Twenty-two pounds rateable annual value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual rateable value of Twenty-two pounds, a rate of elevenpence for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.

(c) On all vacant allotments of land under the annual rateable value of Twenty-two pounds, a rate of Elevenpence for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.

(d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping, or any other purpose, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(f) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livory and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(g) For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, showyards, cattle-yards, and recreation reserves shall be charged by measurement, at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per annum.

(h) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

(i) For water supplied to gardens, and for other than domestic purposes, will be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence per annum, the quantity of water so used not to exceed 12,000 gallons per annum; a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer, when, in the opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.

(j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of One pound (£1) per cent. on the contract price for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

2. The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation, shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance by equal instalments on the 1st day of January, 1902, and on the 1st day of July, 1902 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time); and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Regulation, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special arrangement.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1902, and shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.—No. 13.

A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under the Water Acts, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Winchelsea in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1902; provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any such lands or tenements.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of Ninepence each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1902, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1902.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the said rate.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS (No. 3) FOR 1902.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

1st. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2nd. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3rd. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

4th. For every water-trough a charge of Ten shillings.

5th. For every steam boiler a charge of Ten shillings for every horse-power of such boiler.

6th. For stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, a charge of One shilling, to be paid on delivery.

7th. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.

8th. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9th. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July, 1902.

10th. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulation:—

No. 6.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1902 on all rateable property within the urban district of the Trust.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust within the said urban district, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual municipal value of such property, provided that no rate be less than One pound.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on a street in which the pipes for a supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1902, commencing on the 1st day of January and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1902, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st of January, and the other on the 1st of July in such year. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 22.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district :—

1. For every house and tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Nine pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Ten pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than One pound sterling.

5. For every water-trough Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands, where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows :—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Fourpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardeners the charge shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 300,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of October, 1901.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by Division 1 of Part I. of the *Water Act 1900* the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Donald Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 12th day of December, 1901, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 12th day of December in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the *Water Act 1900* in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 21st day of November, 1901, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the *Water Act 1900*, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Donald included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.

For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Donald township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by

not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Acts in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule. Notice of Poll. Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Donald township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before polling day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Donald township a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

16. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

17. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

18. Mode of voting where Voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of the Third Schedule thereto, and initialled by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

19. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of

such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

22. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

23. Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately on the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall determine by lot the candidate to hold office.

24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

25. Minister to determine question arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by the Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

27. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners the vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.

30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

31. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

Health Act 1890 and Stock Diseases Act 1890.

REGULATIONS TO FURTHER REGULATE THE IN- TRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA FROM THE STATE OF NEW SOUTH WALES OF STOCK IN CONNECTION WITH THE DISEASE KNOWN AS ANTHRAX.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of October, 1901.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred upon him by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* and section 4 of the

Stock Diseases Act 1890, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, has deemed it necessary and expedient to amend the regulation relating to the introduction into Victoria from the State of New South Wales, where the disease of anthrax (being a disease in sheep, cattle, horses, and other animals) is known to exist, of stock. Now, therefore, it is ordained as follows (that is to say):—

In clause 2 of the regulations made by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, under the *Health Act 1890* and the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, made on the eighth day of October, 1900, the words "Provided further that fat stock under bond intended for export shall not be subjected to vaccination if, in the opinion of an inspector of stock, vaccination is not necessary" are hereby repealed, and the following words shall be read in lieu thereof:—

Provided further that fat stock introduced at the crossing places duly appointed, and travelling to their destination by rail either for immediate export or for slaughter within the metropolitan meat area within eight days of their entering the State of Victoria, shall not be subject to vaccination if in the opinion of an inspector of stock vaccination is not necessary. Provided further that in the case of all such stock the importer or the consignee, or the auctioneer or agent shall execute a bond in the form or to the effect of that contained in the schedules hereto marked (A) and (B), according as the case may require to His Majesty, either generally or applicable to the particular stock, in the sum of £250 conditional on such stock, or of any stock at any time imported by him or consigned to him, or for the sale of which he is or has been appointed auctioneer, or for which he is the agent as the case may be, that such stock will, if for export as live stock, be immediately so exported, and if for slaughter will be slaughtered within the Metropolitan Meat Area, and within eight days of their introduction into the State of Victoria as hereinbefore provided. Provided further that stock awaiting export or slaughter shall be kept in such place or places as the Chief Inspector of Stock may approve.

Whereas by certain regulations made by the Governor in Council on the day of under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, it is among other things provided that fat stock introduced at the crossing places duly appointed and travelling to their destination by rail either for immediate export or for slaughter within the metropolitan meat area within eight days of their entering the State of Victoria shall not be subject to vaccination if in the opinion of an inspector of stock vaccination is not necessary. Provided that in the case of all such stock the importer or consignee, or the auctioneer or agent, shall execute to His Majesty a bond either generally or applicable to the particular stock in the sum of £250, conditional on such stock, or if any stock at any time imported by or consigned to him or for the sale of which he is or has been appointed auctioneer, or for which he is the agent as the case may be that such stock will if for export as live stock be immediately so exported, and if for slaughter will be slaughtered within the Metropolitan Meat Area and within eight days of their introduction into the State of Victoria as hereinbefore provided, and that stock awaiting export or slaughter shall be kept in such place or places as the Chief Inspector of Stock may approve. Now the condition of the above-written bond is such that if all unvaccinated stock at any time imported, under the provisions of the hereinbefore recited regulations, by or consigned to the above bounden

or for the sale of which he is the agent as the case may be is in the case of stock intended for export as live stock immediately so exported or in the case of stock intended for slaughter is so slaughtered within the Metropolitan Meat Area within eight days from the date when such stock entered the State of Victoria, and in either case if the stock during the time awaiting export or slaughter as the case may be is kept within the place or places approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock and not elsewhere then the above-written bond shall be void otherwise the same shall remain in full force.

Provided that in the case of all such stock the importer or consignee or the auctioneer or agent shall execute to His Majesty a bond either generally or applicable to the particular stock in the sum of £250 conditional on such stock or if any stock at any time imported by or consigned to him or for the sale of which he is or has been appointed auctioneer, or for which he is the agent, as the case may be, that such stock will if for export as live stock be immediately so exported, and if for slaughter will be slaughtered within the Metropolitan Meat Area and within eight days of their introduction into the State of Victoria as hereinbefore provided, and that stock awaiting export or slaughter shall be kept in such place or places as the Chief Inspector of Stock may approve. Now the condition of the above-written bond is such that if the unvaccinated stock now being or depasturing at in the State of consisting of head of branded is permitted to be introduced into the State of Victoria under the provisions of the hereinbefore recited regulations for (1)

(1) "Immediate export as live stock" or "slaughter."

(2) "Exported or slaughtered within the Metropolitan Meat Area within eight days from the date when such stock entered the State of Victoria."

(3) "Export" or "slaughter" and if the stock during the time awaiting (3) is kept within the

place or places approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock and not elsewhere then the above written bond shall be void, otherwise the same shall remain in full force.

CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING CERTAIN TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make Orders as follow, that is to say:—

PARISHES OF GUNYAH GUNYAH AND WOORARRA.—*Land Act 1890*, Section 127.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall exercise on the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Gunyah Gunyah and Woorarra, county of Buln Buln, the powers to cut, split, and take away timber conferred by any licence issued under the authority of section 99, *Land Act 1890*.—(01.P.10881.)

HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber which, at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground, is of a less diameter than eighteen inches, on or from the Crown lands comprised in the Horsham Town Common.—(01.F.27790.)

PARISHES OF GRACE DALE AND YUONGA.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber on or from the Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:—County of Evelyn, parishes of Gracedale and Yuonga: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 70 of section C, parish of Gracedale; bounded thence southerly by that allotment and easterly and southerly by allotment 7 to the road from Hedgesville; thence south-easterly by that road to the north boundary of allotment 6A; thence easterly and southerly by that allotment to the before mentioned road; thence easterly by that road to the west boundary of allotment 1A, parish of Yuonga; thence northerly and easterly by that allotment and easterly and northerly by allotment 52 to the crest of the range forming the watershed between the Don River and Coranderrk Creek; and thence westerly by the crest of that range to the point of commencement.—(01.C.16734.)

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Land Acts* it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of

Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of coal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The coal supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be the best of its kind. The house coal must be free from shale, small coal, dust, ashes, or other impurities, and the smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. No other coal will be received. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the coal so rejected or returned.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the coal.

4. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. At the time of delivering the coal the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the coal accepted and shall return the order to the contractor.

6. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned to the contractor.

7. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.

8. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

9. The contractor will be bound to deliver coal for vessels, except in the case of dredges, into the vessels' bunkers.

10. When baskets are used in the delivery of coal they are all to be of one size, and the contractor will be bound to tare the baskets when so required by the officer taking delivery. In other cases the contractor will be bound to satisfy the officer receiving that the weight or quantity is correct.

11. Coal must be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.

12. In the event of the officer ordering the coal not requiring the same to be put into the vessel's bunkers, as required by condition No. 9, a rebate of 1s. per ton to be made by the contractor.

13. Should an order not be complied with within 48 hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price may be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money, but coal for steam vessels must be supplied on demand. No more delay will be allowed than is sufficient to give the necessary orders and get the hulk or vessel alongside. Bad weather to be the only excuse.

14. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

15. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the coal as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

16. If the board shall decide that the coal or coke is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 13.

17. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such

coal or coke as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected coal or coke and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition No. 13.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the coal, &c., or delay in delivering or replacing the coal when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 13. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., cross-ways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. 7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition No. 3.

9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State, for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3.
