PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Vic-toria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1899 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1614), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. APPENDIX I.

PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY,

I.—A candidate for a Commission in His Majesty's Army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of military duty.

II.—The physical examination will be conducted by a Board of Officers consisting of the Inspector and Assistant Inspector of Gymnasia.

III.—The attention of the Board will be directed to the following points:

^{*}Candidates accepted under the above scale for admission to the Royal Military Academy or Royal Military College must have reached the standard required according to their age before receiving commissions.

(b) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heel and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect without rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and the shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths.

(c) Measurement of chest.

(c) Measurement of chest.

The candidate will be made to stand erect with his feet together, and to raise his hands above his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to empty his chest of air as much as possible. This is best done by continuous whistling with the lips as long as sound can be produced. The tape is carefully gathered in during the process, and when the minimum is reached it is noted.

He will then be directed to inflate his chest to its utmost capacity. This maximum measurement will likewise be noted. The girth, with the chest fully expanded, and the range of expansion between the minimum and maximum will then be recorded.

(d) Weight.

The candidate will also be weighed, and his weight recorded on the proceedings of the Board.

IV.—Only those candidates who satisfy the above physical requirements will be permitted to proceed to the medical examination

Both the physical and medical examination will be held on the same day and at the same place.

A certificate, signed by the Inspector of Gymnasia, setting forth the physical equivalents of the candidates will be furnished for the information of the Medical Board.

V.—The medical examination will be conducted by a Board of Medical Officers. The President will be detailed by the Director-General, Army Medical Service; the Assistant Professor of

Clinical and Military Surgery, Army Medical School, Netley, the Surgeon, Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, and the Surgeon, Royal Military College, Sandhurst, may be members of the Board cx officio. The other members will be composed of officers of a rank not lower than Major, Royal Army Medical Corps, and in their selection due regard be given to their possession of special qualifications for the duty.

VI.—The attention of the Medical Board will be directed

(a) Eyesight.

The Regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as

follows:—

1. If a candidate can read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) and D = 0.6, at any distance selected by himself, with each eye, without glasses, he will be considered FIT.

2. If a candidate can only read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, his visual deficiency being due to faulty refraction which can be corrected by glasses which enable him to read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, and D = 12, at the same distance with the other eye, and can also read D = 0.8 with each eye without glasses, at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered FIT.

3. If a candidate cannot read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, notwithstanding he can read D = 0.6, he will be considered UNFIT.

Normal vision of one eye may be sufficient to allow a higher defect in the other, to the extent of one-sixth, if the defect is simple error in refraction remedied by glasses.

The candidate must be able to read the tests without hesitation in ordinary daylight.

(N.B.—Snellen's test types will be used for determining the acuteness of vision.)

Squint, inability to distinguish the principal colours, or any morbid conditions, subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence in either eye, will cause the rejection of a candidate.

The following additional points will then be observed:

(d) That his hearing is good.
(c) That his speech is without impediment.
(d) That his teeth are in good order. Loss or decay of ten teeth will be considered a disqualification. Decayed teeth, if well filled, will be considered as

sound.

(c) That his chest is well formed, and that his lungs and heart are sound.

(f) That he is not ruptured.

(g) That he does not suffer from hydrocele, varicocele, varicose veips in a severe degree, or other disease likely to cause inefficiency. A slight defect, if successfully cured by operation, is not a disqualification.

(h) That his limbs are well formed and developed.

(j) That here is free and perfect motion of all the joints.

(j) That his feet and toes are well formed.

(k) That he does not suffer from any inveterate skin disease.

(b) That he has no congenital malformation or defect.

(m) That he does not bear traces of previous acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution.

I.-CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the lat August, 1902, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

- (3) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for both the India and Colonial Services will be called upon to declare, after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Civil Service of India, or on the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships.

SHIRE OF YEA.

BY-LAW NO. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890 and every other power enabling in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Yea, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby makes the following by-law, being by-law No. 7 of the said council, that is to say: council, that is to say :--

council, that is to say:

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereimafts' provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gacette.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in and within the boundaries of the Township of Yea.

4. Definitions.—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:

"House" shall mean and includes dwellings of any kind.

assigned to them, that is to say:—

"House" shall mean and includes dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter, below or above the ground; and "earth closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Council" shall mean the council of the municipality of the Shire of Yea.

Words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular number, and the word person shall include a corporation.

Part I .- As to Earth Closets, &c.

Part I.—As to Earth Closets, dc.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for nightsoil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy statched to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, liaving a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every carth closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to No. 139.—November 6, 1901.—2.

be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other recep-

of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or of other material to be approved by the council, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence and until its abolition to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, or some other efficient deodrizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth closet privy and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or bolonging to such premises.

11. No person shall empty any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises for the removal of night-soil on or belonging to such premises or the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other premise of the semes of the same, and no such occupier or person shall remov

15. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or sewer.

16. The occupier of every house or tenement in the township 16. The occupier of every house or tenement in the township of Yea in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the council, or to such person or persons as the council nay by reso-lution appoint to receive the same, the sum of Thirteen shillings per annum, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed

by resolution of the council for emptying and removing the contents of each part, such sum to be paid by monthly instalments of One shilling and one penny on the first day of each month in each year, or on such other day or days as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council.

Part II .- As to Carriage of Meat.

17. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person shall bring or cause to be brought into the said township of Yea, or carry or cause to be carried through any street in the said township in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcass of meat, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed as that the rays of the sun and the rain and the dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such meat or carcass of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof.

Part III.—Disposal of House Refuse, &c.

13. The occupier of any shop, store, botel, or factory fronting, adjoining, or abutting on any street shall once at least in every day, before Nine o'clock a.m., sweep and cleanse, or cause to be sweept and cleansed, the footways and pavenents adjoining such shop, store, hotel, or factory.

19. The occupier of any land upon which is erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

20. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide in connexion with such building or premises, whenever required by the said council or the health officer, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of such animals in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such manner and of such materials and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and when not required to be open to be kept properly covered.

21. He shall likewise provide in connexion with such bui

Part IV .- Prevention of Pollution of Water.

22. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the depositor offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the said council or by one of its officers.

Part V.-Drainage of Buildings.

25. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge

and well drained, so that no water, sounder, or tamp such loops there.

26. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Part VI .- General Cleanliness.

27. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to

health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be once at least in every fourteen days removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

28. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, seil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be effectually decdorized, and to be removed therefron in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance to any person er injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

29. No person shall place or denosit any dust, mud, ashes.

29. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil, or other offensive matter, in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place, so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the said council or officer of health.

30. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

Part VII .- Penalties.

31. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the said council has or has not taken advantage of such powers. such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 7 of the Shire of Yea, was made and adopted by the Council of the Shire of Yea on the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and one, and confirmed under the common seal of the shire on the sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and one.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Oxley, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Act 1890 and the Health Act 1890, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 4 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This by law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Oxley.

4. Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairyman, and Purveyors of Milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, for the year 1901, within fourteen days after the publication of this by-law in the Government Gazette, and thereafter on or before the first day of October in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is—

- (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings.
- (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Four shillings.
- (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Six shillings; and for every additional 10, or fractional part of 10, up to 190, the sum of Two shillings.
- (4) More than 190, a fee of Two pounds.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similiarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain of lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of acow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, shed

from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or member of the family of any porson registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be or (if he be the person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order sorved as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handlo vessels used for containing milk for sale or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor if the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business the himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased. tion has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the intrepretation of this by-law, words imputing the maculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

No. 1106, Part I.) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything in the said Act contained, every traveller may, while he is travelling, depasture his cattle and sheep, unless the same be affected with any contagious or infectious disease, upon any unsold Crown lands within one-quarter of a mile on either side of any read or track commonly used as a thoroughfare, whether such lands be or be not comprised in any common: Provided that such cattle and sheep shall be driven every day towards the place of their destination the distance as in the said Act provided; but that the provisions of the said section as herein recited shall not apply to the counties enumerated in the Eighth Schedule to the said Act or to any counties

er districts added thereto as thereinafter provided; but that such travellers may, within such counties and districts, depasture their cattle upon any unsold Crown lands within one quarter of a mile of any surveyed road: And whereas it is by the same section further enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, add any counties or districts in such Proclamation named and described to the list of counties in the said Schedule, and may at any time annul any such Proclamation, notice whereof shall be published as aforesaid, but that no Proclamation made under the provisions of the said section shall be of any force or effect until one month after such proclamation thereof: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice annul the Proclamation bearing date the 13th August, 1894, by which the counties of Karkarooc and Weeah were added to the list of counties in the Eighth Schedule to the Land Act 1890 aforesaid so far only as it relates to the county of Karkarooc.—(01.8.7,849.)

4. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
