PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Belfast ;

FRIDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Creswick ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Eaglehawk, the Shires of Huntly, Kerang, Marong, and Strathfieldsaye, and the North Riding of the Shire of Borung ; as a Public Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Yarrowonga* ; and as a Bank Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Heathcote ;

THURSDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Morwell, and as a Bank Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Morwell ;

FRIDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Bank Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Ballarat and Learmonth ;

TUESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Bank Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Gisborne ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Glenlyon ;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Bairnsdale, Maffra, and Tambo ; and as a Bank Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Colac ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Broadford, Kilmore, Minhamite, and Pryalong ; and as a Bank Half-holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kilmore and Nhill ;

THURSDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Berwick and Dandenong.

(Physical and Medical Examination of candidates for Commissions in the Army) of the Regulations, issued by the War Department, under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of the Colonial Local Military Forces and by students from the Colonial Universities.

COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY.

PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES.

The following revised form of Appendix I. (Physical and Medical Examination of Candidates for Commissions in the Army) of the following Regulations :—

- (a) Regulations respecting admission to the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, and for first appointments therefrom to the Royal Artillery and Royal Engineers.
- (b) Regulations respecting admission to the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, and for first appointments therefrom to the Army.
- (c) Regulations under which Commissions in the Army may be obtained by Officers of the Militia.
- (d) Regulations under which Commissions in the Army may be obtained by University Candidates.
- (e) Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of Colonial Local Military Forces, and Students from the Colonial Universities.

has been approved, and will be substituted for Appendix I. in the above-named regulations.

APPENDIX I.

PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY.

I.—A candidate for a Commission in His Majesty's Army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of military duty.

II.—The physical examination will be conducted by a Board of Officers consisting of the Inspector and Assistant Inspector of Gymnasia.

III.—The attention of the Board will be directed to the following points:—

(a) That the correlation of age, height, and chest girth is equal or superior to that which is given in the following table:—

* Candidates accepted under the above scale for admission to the Royal Military Academy or Royal Military College must have reached the standard required according to their age before receiving commissions.

(b) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heel and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect without rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and the shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths.

(c) Measurement of chest.

The candidate will be made to stand erect with his feet together, and to raise his hands above his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to empty his chest of air as much as possible. This is best done by continuous whistling with the lips as long as sound can be produced. The tape is carefully gathered in during the process, and when the minimum is reached it is noted.

He will then be directed to inflate his chest to its utmost capacity. This maximum measurement will likewise be noted. The girth, with the chest fully expanded, and the range of expansion between the minimum and maximum will then be recorded.

(d) Weight.

The candidate will also be weighed, and his weight recorded on the proceedings of the Board.

IV.—Only those candidates who satisfy the above physical requirements will be permitted to proceed to the medical examination.

Both the physical and medical examination will be held on the same day and at the same place.

A certificate, signed by the Inspector of Gymnasia, setting forth the physical equivalents of the candidates will be furnished for the information of the Medical Board.

V.—The medical examination will be conducted by a Board of Medical Officers. The President will be detailed by the Director-General, Army Medical Service; the Assistant Professor of

Clinical and Military Surgery, Army Medical School, Netley, the Surgeon, Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, and the Surgeon, Royal Military College, Sandhurst, will be members of the Board *ex officio*. The other members will be composed of officers of a rank not lower than Major, Royal Army Medical Corps, and in their selection due regard be given to their possession of special qualifications for the duty.

VI.—The attention of the Medical Board will be directed to—

(a) Eyesight.

The Regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as follows:—

1. If a candidate can read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) and D = 0·6, at any distance selected by himself, with each eye, without glasses, he will be considered FIT.

2. If a candidate can only read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, his visual deficiency being due to faulty refraction which can be corrected by glasses which enable him to read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, and D = 12, at the same distance with the other eye, and can also read D = 0·8 with each eye without glasses, at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered FIT.

3. If a candidate cannot read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, notwithstanding he can read D = 0·6, he will be considered UNFIT.

Normal vision of one eye may be sufficient to allow a higher defect in the other, to the extent of one-sixth, if the defect is simple error in refraction remedied by glasses.

The candidate must be able to read the tests without hesitation in ordinary daylight.

(N.B.—Snellen's test types will be used for determining the acuteness of vision.)

Squint, inability to distinguish the principal colours, or any morbid conditions, subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence in either eye, will cause the rejection of a candidate.

The following additional points will then be observed:—

(b) That his hearing is good.

(c) That his speech is without impediment.

(d) That his teeth are in good order. Loss or decay of ten teeth will be considered a disqualification. Decayed teeth, if well filled, will be considered as sound.

(e) That his chest is well formed, and that his lungs and heart are sound.

(f) That he is not ruptured.

(g) That he does not suffer from hydrocele, varicocele, varicose veins in a severe degree, or other disease likely to cause inefficiency. A slight defect, if successfully cured by operation, is not a disqualification.

(h) That his limbs are well formed and developed.

(i) That there is free and perfect motion of all the joints.

(j) That his feet and toes are well formed.

(k) That he does not suffer from any inveterate skin disease.

(l) That he has no congenital malformation or defect.

(m) That he does not bear traces of previous acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution.

The Board should further state—

(n) Whether he is, in their opinion, of pure European descent.

II. OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR EASTERN CADETSHIPS IN THE COLONIAL SERVICE, AND CLERKSHIPS (CLASS I.) IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

I.—CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1902, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 1st July, 1902, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of His Majesty.
- (ii.) That he had attained the age of 21, and had not attained the age of 23, on the first day of the year in which the examination is held.

[N.B.—In a case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality, issued under notification of the Government of India, No. 2252, dated 21st August, 1888, as amended by notification No. 404, dated 19th May, 1898, and signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]
- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

II.—CADETSHIPS IN THE COLONIAL SERVICE, AND CLERKSHIPS (CLASS I.) IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

If Open Competitive Examinations for the following Services, viz. :—

Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service;
Clerkships (Class I.) in the Home Civil Service;

should be held in 1902 concurrently with the Open Competitive Examination for the Civil Service of India, candidates duly eligible in respect of age will be admitted to compete for any two or all three of these Services, subject to the following conditions :—

(1) That they fill up and return to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, an application on each of the prescribed forms, within the time limited by respective regulations.* (Note.—A separate form of application is required for each of the three services.)

(2) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for either the India or the Colonial Service, as well as for the Home Service, will be called upon to declare, immediately after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the India or Colonial Service, or on the list of candidates for Clerkships in the Home Civil Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Clerkships in the Home Civil Service.

(3) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for both the India and Colonial Services will be called upon to declare, after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Civil Service of India, or on the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships.

(4) That all declarations of choice are irrevocable.

Candidates admitted to compete for all three or any two of these classes of appointments will be required to pay a consolidated fee of £6.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900. ELECTIONS FOR THE NORTH-EASTERN PROVINCE.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may on posting an application to the Returning Officer obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to the application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

SHIRE OF YEA.

BY-LAW No. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890 and every other power enabling in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Yea, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby makes the following by-law, being by-law No. 7 of the said council, that is to say :—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in and within the boundaries of the Township of Yea.

4. Definitions.—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say :—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter, below or above the ground; and “earth closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

“Council” shall mean the council of the municipality of the Shire of Yea.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular number, and the word person shall include a corporation.

Part I.—As to Earth Closets, &c.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to

be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or of other material to be approved by the council, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence and until its abolition to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth closet privy and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

11. No person shall empty any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

12. When any nightman is licensed by the council such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same, and no such occupier or person shall contract for the removal of night-soil therefrom with any nightman or person who is not licensed in that behalf by the council.

13. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the council (of which the proof shall be on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

15. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or sewer.

16. The occupier of every house or tenement in the township of Yea in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the council, or to such person or persons as the council may by resolution appoint to receive the same, the sum of Thirteen shillings per annum, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed

by resolution of the council for emptying and removing the contents of each pan, such sum to be paid by monthly instalments of One shilling and one penny on the first day of each month in each year, or on such other day or days as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council.

Part II.—As to Carriage of Meat.

17. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person shall bring or cause to be brought into the said township of Yea, or carry or cause to be carried through any street in the said township in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcass of meat, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed as that the rays of the sun and the rain and the dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such meat or carcass of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof.

Part III.—Disposal of House Refuse, &c.

18. The occupier of any shop, store, hotel, or factory fronting, adjoining, or abutting on any street shall once at least in every day, before Nine o'clock a.m., sweep and cleanse, or cause to be swept and cleansed, the footways and pavements adjoining such shop, store, hotel, or factory.

19. The occupier of any land upon which is erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

20. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide in connexion with such building or premises, whenever required by the said council or the health officer, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of such animals in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such manner and of such materials and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any effluvia therefrom or any escape of the contents thereof or any soakage therefrom into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and when not required to be open to be kept properly covered.

21. He shall likewise provide in connexion with such building or premises, if required by the said council or officer of health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials and maintained at all times in such a condition as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

Part IV.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.

22. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the said council or by one of its officers.

Part V.—Drainage of Buildings.

25. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

26. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Part VI.—General Cleanliness.

27. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to

health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be once at least in every fourteen days removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

28. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be effectually deodorized, and to be removed therefrom in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

29. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil, or other offensive matter, in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place, so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the said council or officer of health.

30. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

Part VII.—Penalties.

31. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the said council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 7 of the Shire of Yea, was made and adopted by the Council of the Shire of Yea on the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and one, and confirmed under the common seal of the shire on the sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and one.

SHIRE OF OXLEY.

BY-LAW NO. 4.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Oxley, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 4 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Oxley.
4. *Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, for the year 1901, within fourteen days after the publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter on or before the first day of October in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is—
 - (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings.
 - (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Four shillings.
 - (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Six shillings; and for every additional 10, or fractional part of 10, up to 100, the sum of Two shillings.
 - (4) More than 100, a fee of Two pounds.
 If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Traralgon, made under the Health Acts by the Council of the Shire of Traralgon for determining the manner of registering and the registration fee to be paid by cow-keepers or dairymen or purveyors of milk within the Shire of Traralgon.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Traralgon make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. From and after the coming into force of this by-law every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, or dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall on or before the first day of December, 1901, and shall within fifteen days from and after the first day of October in every subsequent year, and every person about to carry on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, or dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade or business, register himself with the said council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the said council an application in the form hereunder given, and every person shall, with every such application, pay a fee according to the following scale, namely:—

No. 1197), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and upon the recommendation of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, doth hereby order that the area described hereunder, and forming part of the shire of Moorabbin, upon and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, shall be included in the area of the metropolis within the meaning of section 4 of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890* aforesaid, and doth declare such land to be an area to which the said Act shall apply (that is to say):—

Commencing at the junction of Wickham-road and Bluff-road at the boundary of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works; thence easterly along Wickham-road about eighty-nine chains to Point Nepean-road; thence across Point Nepean-road to Cheltenham-road; thence easterly along Cheltenham-road about sixty-nine chains to Chesterville-road; thence northerly along Chesterville-road about fifty-nine chains to South-road; thence westerly along South-road about twenty-three chains to East Boundary-road; thence northerly along East Boundary-road about one hundred and sixty-one chains to North-road, which is the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works boundary; thence westerly along North-road about one hundred and fifty-eight chains to Thomas-street; thence southerly along Thomas-street about forty-two chains to Mackinnon-road; thence westerly along Mackinnon-road about one chain; thence southerly along Thomas-street about sixty chains to Point Nepean-road; thence south-easterly along Point Nepean-road about eighty-five chains to South-road; thence westerly along South-road about forty-two chains to Bluff-road; thence southerly along Bluff-road about sixty chains to Wickham-road and the starting point.

DEPASTURE OF TRAVELLING CATTLE.

PROCLAMATION PARTLY ANNULLED

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 131 of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I.) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything in the said Act contained, every traveller may, while he is travelling, depasture his cattle and sheep, unless the same be affected with any contagious or infectious disease, upon any unsold Crown lands within one-quarter of a mile on either side of any road or track commonly used as a thoroughfare, whether such lands be or be not comprised in any common: Provided that such cattle and sheep shall be driven every day towards the place of their destination the distance as in the said Act provided; but that the provisions of the said section as herein recited shall not apply to the counties enumerated in the Eighth Schedule to the said Act or to any counties

or districts added thereto as hereinafter provided; but that such travellers may, within such counties and districts, depasture their cattle upon any unsold Crown lands within one quarter of a mile of any surveyed road. And whereas it is by the same section further enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, add any counties or districts in such Proclamation named and described to the list of counties in the said Schedule, and may at any time annul any such Proclamation, notice whereof shall be published as aforesaid, but that no Proclamation made under the provisions of the said section shall be of any force or effect until one month after such proclamation thereof: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice annul the Proclamation bearing date the 13th August, 1894, by which the counties of Karkaroc and Weeah were added to the list of counties in the Eighth Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid so far only as it relates to the county of Karkaroc.—(01.S.7,849.)

Security will be required in cash, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank deposit receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or Government debentures.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit above mentioned in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for Victorian House and Smiths' Coal, Victorian Coke, or Steam Coal at _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of coal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The coal supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be the best of its kind. The house coal must be free from shale, small coal, dust, ashes, or other impurities, and the smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. No other coal will be received. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the coal so rejected or returned.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the coal.

4. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. At the time of delivering the coal the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the coal accepted and shall return the order to the contractor.

6. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned to the contractor.

7. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.

8. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

9. The contractor will be bound to deliver coal for vessels, except in the case of dredges, into the vessels' bunkers.

10. When baskets are used in the delivery of coal they are all to be of one size, and the contractor will be bound to fasten the baskets when so required by the officer taking delivery. In other cases the contractor will be bound to satisfy the officer receiving that the weight or quantity is correct.

11. Coal must be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.

12. In the event of the officer ordering the coal not requiring the same to be put into the vessel's bunkers, as required by condition No. 9, a rebate of 1s. per ton to be made by the contractor.

13. Should an order not be complied with within 48 hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price may be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money, but coal for steam vessels must be supplied on demand. No more delay will be allowed than is sufficient to give the necessary orders and get the hulk or vessel alongside. Bad weather to be the only excuse.

14. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

15. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the coal as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

16. If the board shall decide that the coal or coke is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 13.

17. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such

coal or coke as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected coal or coke and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition No. 13.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the coal, &c., or delay in delivering or replacing the coal when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 13. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney; coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

20. In the event of a general strike occurring at the colliery or collieries, any contract entered into under these conditions after the expiry of fourteen days' notice being given may be suspended, such contract to come into full force and effect again ten (10) days after such cause of suspension shall be discontinued.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts, must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality; and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark; or pieces of wood with bark adhering will be received. 3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high; and of the width specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz.: cross-ways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition No. 3.

9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor

must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3.
