### PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Kyneton and Lancefield, the United Shires of Metcalfe and Newham; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Pitfield;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Ballan; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Ballan;

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Alberton, Creswick, and Lawloit; as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo\*; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Creswick, Kingston, Smeaton, and Yarrain Yarrain;

THURSDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Koroit, the Shires of Cranbourne, Fern Tree Gully, and Mansfield; as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo\*; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Koroit and Mansfield;

WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, throughout the Shire of Preston;

FRIDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, throughout the West Riding of the Shire of Portland;

TUESDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Lancefield;

THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Cranbourne.

ALBERTON LICENSING DISTRICT.—POLL OF ELECTORS REGARDING GROCERS' LICENCES.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of November, 1901.*

WHEREAS the number of Grocers' Licences in the Alberton Licensing District is below the statutory number: And whereas a petition has been received by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of section 38 of the *Licensing Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1111), from one-fifth of the number of persons whose names for the time being are on the Rolls of Electors for the Electoral Division forming the said Licensing District in force on the day after the publication in the *Government Gazette* of the number of inhabitants therein, praying that a Poll of the Electors may be ordered to be taken to determine whether or not the number of Grocers' Licences in such Licensing District shall be increased: And whereas by section 39 of the said Act it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, upon the receipt of any such petition, by an Order in Council, direct the Returning Officer for the Electoral Division forming such Licensing District to take a Poll of the Electors upon a day to be fixed in the said Order in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby direct Donald Thompson McKenzie, Esq., J.P., being the Returning Officer for the Electoral Division forming the

aforesaid, to take a Poll of the Electors in the said Licensing District on Friday, the 20th day of December, 1901, to determine whether or not the number of Grocers' Licences in the said Licensing District shall be increased.

And the Honorable William Arthur Trenwith, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
