VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.
Return of the Births and Deaths registered in Bendigo and the Subrough Registration Districts During the Month of Octobers, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of October in all the Bendigo Districts was 107; of these 60 were of males and 47 of females; included were 4 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 127, viz.:—60 of males and 67 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 52, viz.:—34 of males and 18 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 55. All paddocks, grounds, lands, houses, yards, premises, and enclosures used as a grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall whenever necessary, be inspected by any person authorized, in writing, by the president or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, houses, yards, premises, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or the person as inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally, or left at this dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle or other animals in dairies may also be similarly in apacted by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposee, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inapector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

 5. The council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking-place, cow-shed, milk-

The council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking-place, cow-shed, milk-store, milk-shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of dairyman, cow-keeper, or purveyor of milk is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order the dairyman, cow-keeper, or purveyor of milk to make alterations in any such buildings or structures and to remedy any such defects within a time specified in such order.

Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the personal employed on the premises of any dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, and at such distance from the milking-place, milk-store or milk-shop as may be directed by the council, and the closet-pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

- 7. Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such distance from the milking-place, or milk-store, or milk-shop as the council may direct.

 8. All houses, dairies, milking-places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk, or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings or milking-places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman.

 9. All yards or other places used for keeping or helding dairy.

All yards or other places used for keeping or helding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and shall be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer, or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scoured and scalded daily, and no cow keeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work, shall use in connexion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit by order served, as prescribed in clause 4 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow-hall not be used in any way whatsoever.

 12. No dairyman, purveyor of milk, or cow-keeper, shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

 13. No person suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or dangerous infectious disease, or who has been recently in contact with any person so suffering, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, municipal clerk or health officer so to do.

If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying, or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cow-sheds, or as a milk-shop or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked his wife or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force, and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

 15. Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop shall be inspected once in each quarter of the year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds, and buildings, disposal of manure, closet and stable accommodation, storage for milk, means of scalding or cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with this by-law.

Penalties.

If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every such a breach be liable to a penalty not exceed-ing Ten pounds (£10), or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings (5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other completent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.
- 7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and

All cattle in dairies shall also be inspected similarly by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverity and weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the Council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

6. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or

or 'milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

12. In the interpretation of this By-law, words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

13. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
