PRESENT :

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order :

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Government of the Republic of Honduras gives and will give due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country :

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in him by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare that the said section 238 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* shall apply in the case of the Republic of Honduras :

And the Right Honorable Charles Thomson Ritchie, the Right Honorable Joseph Chamberlain, and the Right Honorable Lord George Hamilton, three of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHIRES OF BIRCHIP AND BORUNG.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Birchip described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Birchip, and annexed to the Shire of Borung.

Area described in the petition is as follows:—Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 123F; thence north-east by the three-chain road to the south-east corner of allotment 123K; thence north to the north-east corner of allotment 117F; thence west to the north-west corner of allotment 117A; thence south to the south-west corner of allotment 123B; thence east to the south-east corner of allotment 123B; thence south to the starting point.

The petitioners state that they do nearly the whole of their business at the Town of Warracknabeal, in the Shire of Borung, and that mostly all their travelling is over the roads in that shire.

The petitioners further state that the Shire of Borung supplies them with water, and that the Shire of Birchip refuses to give them an adequate supply.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Birchip above described, and annex same to the East Riding of the Shire of Borung.

CLOSE SEASON, DAYLESFORD WATER SUPPLY STORAGE RESERVOIR, ETC.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to issue a proclamation revoking the proclamation dated the 3rd February, 1885, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th February, 1885, page 605, prohibiting fishing in the Daylesford Water Supply Storage Reservoir, situate on the Kangaroo Creek, parish of Bullarto, county of Talbot, and in the Kangaroo Creek from the northern boundary of the Reservoir Reserve to the point where the said creek is crossed by the Carlsruhe to Daylesford railway bridge, and in lieu thereof directing that the taking of all fish in the Kangaroo Creek from the northern boundary of the Reservoir Reserve to the point where the said creek is crossed by the Carlsruhe to Daylesford railway bridge shall commence on the 1st day of July and cease on the 7th day of July in each year.

MANUKAU HARBOR LEADING-LIGHTS FOR MAIN CHANNEL.

NOTICE is hereby given that a light-house has been erected on a bluff on the north side of the harbor-entrance 120 yards S. 41° E. of the front South Channel leading-beacon, from which, at an elevation of 70 feet above high water, will be exhibited, on and after Monday, the 9th December, 1901, a white light from N. 30° E. to N. 23° E., and a green light from N. 23° E. to N., which should be seen in clear weather a distance of 10 miles. The light is cut off to the westward by Paratutai. The white light bearing N. 27° E. leads up the centre of the channel, with a least depth of 24 feet at L.V. springs.

The house, which is 8 feet by 8 feet, and 11 feet in height to roof, is painted white on the front side facing the channel, and brown on the other side.

Vessels entering the channel from the southward should open the white light till it bears N. 23° E., just open of Paratutai, and steer in on that course, passing Paratutai from half-a-cable to a cable distant, then steer straight up the harbor for Puponga. Vessels from the northward should haul up for the light as soon as it opens out on that bearing.

In the daytime vessels will be guided in by the semaphore as usual. As tides in this channel are very strong, care should be taken in keeping the light on its bearing, the ebb-tide setting to the northward through the Swathway round the Ninepin, and the flood-tide setting through to the southward.

BY-LAW No. 6.—UNDER THE HEALTH ACTS.

A By-law made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and numbered Six (6), for the registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, purveyors of milk, and persons who occupy any house or land in or upon which butter or cheese or dairy produce is manufactured for sale or barter, and for the repeal of clause 31 of By-law No. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Acts, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Benalla, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. Clause 31 of By-law No. 3 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person being the occupier of any house or land in or upon which butter or cheese or dairy produce is manufactured for sale or barter shall, on or before the 1st day of January, 1902, and on or before the 1st day of October in the same and every succeeding year, register himself with the council, and shall thereupon pay to the said council the fees hereinafter appointed, that is to say:—

Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Malmesbury Borough Council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee for any number of cows kept, not exceeding five, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence, and for any number above five a fee of Five shillings.

2. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Town Clerk shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

Milk Stores and Shops to be kept Clean.

3. Every person following the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean.

Dairymen, &c., to Report Diseases to the Health Officer.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

5. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Malmesbury.

Penalties.

6. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Malmesbury Borough Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of North Melbourne order as follows:—

Repeal part of Clause 4, By-law 28.

That part of Clause 4 of By-law No. 28 of the said council which relates to the fee to be paid with an application to be registered, and the date upon which said registration fee is to be paid, is hereby repealed.

Fees for Registration.

1. The fee for registration to be paid with an application to be registered as a person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be as follows, namely:—

- (a) If the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of cows so kept be—
(1) Not more than five, a fee of 20s.
(2) More than five, but not more than twenty, a fee of 30s.
(3) More than twenty, a fee of 40s.

(b) If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of 20s.

2. The word "January" in lieu of "September" to be inserted wherever it occurs in By-law No. 28.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of November in all the Bendigo Districts was 87; of these 51 were of males and 36 of females; included were 3 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 107, viz.:—60 of males and 47 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 60, viz.:—36 of males and 24 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 27. 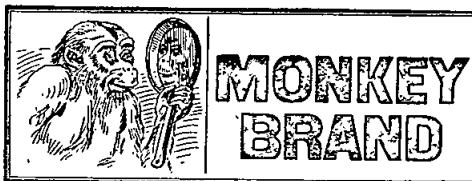

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist) and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints, or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act, and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of saddles, bridles, or other horse-trappings into Victoria by any vessels calling at any port in South Africa.

WHEREAS by Subdivision 8 of Part I. of the *Mines Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1514) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, pursuant to the provisions of sections 77 and 78 of the *Mines Act 1890*, make regulations generally for carrying out all or any of the provisions of the said Subdivision: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE MINES ACT 1897 RELATING TO LICENCES TO WORK TAILINGS.*Interpretation.*

"Regulations" shall mean the Regulations now made.
"Tailings" shall mean any sand, slimes, slum, or refuse, which has been produced by mining operations, or by the crushing or treating of mining material.

"Application" shall mean the application for a licence.
"Licence" shall mean the licence granted in pursuance of these Regulations.

"Governor" shall mean the Governor of the State of Victoria for the time being, or other person for the time being administering the Government of the State.

"Minister" shall mean the Minister of Mines for the time being for the said State.

The singular number shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

Limit.

(1) These Regulations shall apply only to tailings which shall become the property of the Crown in the manner hereinafter provided.

(a) The tailings shall be situate on Crown land formerly the subject of a mining lease.

(b) The mining lease shall have been declared void, surrendered (except such surrender was made for the purpose of renewing the lease), or have expired on or after the first day of November, 1897.

(c) The lessee of such lease shall have left the tailings upon the land comprised in the lease, not having within twelve months from such voidance surrendered or expiry, or such longer period as the Minister may, under special circumstances have allowed, bona fide treated and afterwards continued to treat such tailings.

Application.

(2) Any person desirous of obtaining a licence to work or treat tailings for the purpose of extracting therefrom any gold or other metals or minerals shall make application for such licence in writing addressed to the Secretary for Mines.

(3) Every application must be accompanied by a registration fee of Ten shillings, which shall be retained whether a licence be granted or not; and such application shall state the full name and address of applicant, the term for which licence is desired, the length, width, and average depth in yards of the tailings on which it is proposed to operate, the number of men to be employed, and the correct number of the void, surrendered, or expired lease block upon which the tailings are situate.

(4) Every application shall be registered in the books of the Office of Mines in the order of, and shall have indorsed thereon the day and hour of, its receipt.

(5) Priority shall be determined according to the date and hour indorsed on the application.

(6) In case the application be made by post, and more than one application be received by the same postal delivery of letters at the Office of Mines, the application shall be treated as having been made simultaneously.

(7) In every instance the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, shall decide whether a licence shall be issued, and, in the event of two or more applications being received for the same tailings, to whom a licence shall be granted.

The Licence.

(8) The licence may be for any term not exceeding five years, and the annual rent shall be such sum as the Minister may direct for every one hundred or part of one hundred cubic yards of tailings.

(9) The licence shall be in the form set out hereunder, or as near thereto as the circumstances of the case will permit.

Form of Licence

I (name and title of Governor or Officer administering the Government), of the State of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty King Edward the VII., hereby grant to _____ of _____ in the said State, full licence and authority to remove from off the land or to treat thereon all the tailings now lying on the surface of a portion of the land formerly held under Lease No. _____ And this licence shall be in force for a term of _____ years, unless the same be forfeited or rendered void, and shall be subject to the restrictions, limitations, and conditions expressed in the Mines Act, and any regulations for the time being in force and in the memorandum indorsed hereon or written or printed at the back hereof.

In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this _____ day of _____, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred _____

Memorandum (to be printed at back).

(1) This licence only gives to the licensee the right to use the surface of the land, and then only for the purpose for which the licence has been granted, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

(2) The licensee will not be permitted to assign or to grant a sub-licence in respect of this licence or to part with his interest herein, without the consent in writing of the Minister for the time being having charge of the Mines Department.

(3) Not fewer than _____ men shall be continuously employed during the usual hours of labour.

(4) The yearly rent shall be the sum of _____ and before the licence is delivered to the licensee he shall pay to a Receiver of Revenue the first year's rent, and afterwards the succeeding payments to that officer on the _____ day of _____ in each succeeding year during the currency of this licence.

(5) The licence will be forfeited for any breach or neglect of the above conditions.

(6) The Governor may grant gold mining or mineral leases of the land, the subject of this licence, and in that event the licensee shall carry on the work of treating or removing the tailings in such a manner so as not to unreasonably interfere with the working by the lessee under any such lease.

(10) These Regulations shall come into force at the end of twenty-one days after the same shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*.

And the Honorable John Balfour Burton, His Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS, EITHER UNDER LICENCE OR PERPETUAL LEASE.

THE situation of the land is on the Murray River, about twenty-five (25) miles north-west from Swan Hill, in the parish of Piangil, and is known as the "Murray river frontage reservation."

The land may be reached either by coach or steamer from Swan Hill.

If 2nd class land, the total amount payable in order to obtain a Crown grant is 15s. per acre; if 3rd class land, 10s. per acre; and if 4th class land, 5s. per acre.

Rent payable under perpetual lease will be 1d. per acre per annum until 1903, after which, and at every successive period of ten years, the rent is calculated at 25s. per cent. on the unimproved value of the land.

Perpetual lessees must either reside on or within 5 miles of their land or else cultivate up to one-half of the area of allotment before the end of the sixth year, or else effect improvements to the value of 10s. per acre during the first six years of lease.

The survey fees must be paid within 21 days after an allotment has been granted.

As soon as survey fees are paid, permits to occupy land will be issued the successful applicants.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia; by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notices will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
