REGULATION UNDER THE OLD-AGE PENSIONS ACT 1901.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of December, 1901.

WHEREAS by section 37 of the *Old-Age Pensions Act 1901* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations as to the form of pension claims, the form of pension certificates and pass certificates, the mode of transmitting pension claims, the form of receipt, and generally for the purposes of carrying into effect the provisions of the Act, and that such Regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulation under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

The forms hereunder set forth are prescribed as forms to be used in certain proceedings under the provisions of the *Old-Age Pensions Act 1901* viz.:—

Old-age Pensions Act 1901, No. 1751, Section 14.

PENSION CLAIM.

I, _____ of _____ in the State of Victoria do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare—

- (a) that I am now residing in Victoria;
- (b) that I have so resided, whether continuously or not, for at least twenty years;
- (c) that I have not been absent from Victoria whether continuously or not for more than five years during the time from which the said twenty years commenced to run;
- (d) that I have resided in Victoria continuously for not less than five years immediately preceding the date of making of this declaration;
- (e) that during the period of two years immediately preceding such date I have not been convicted three times or upwards in respect of drunkenness.
- (f) that during the period of five years immediately preceding such date I have not been imprisoned for any period or periods amounting in the whole to six months or upwards in respect of any offence or offences;
- (g) that during the period of twenty years immediately preceding such date I have not for any offence or offences been imprisoned for any period or periods amounting in the whole to three years or upwards with or without hard labour;
- (h) that (if a husband) during the period of five years immediately preceding such date I have not for twelve months or upwards without just cause deserted my wife, or without just cause failed to provide her with adequate means of maintenance, or neglected to maintain such of my children as were under the age of fourteen years, or (if a wife) that during the period of five years immediately preceding such date I have not for twelve months without just cause deserted my husband or deserted such of my children as were under the said age;
- (i) that my average weekly income during six months immediately preceding such date did not amount to Eight shillings or upwards;
- (j) that the net capital value of my accumulated property, whether in or out of Victoria, does not amount to One hundred and sixty pounds or upwards;
- (k) that I have not directly or indirectly deprived myself of property or income in order to qualify for or obtain a pension;
- (l) that I have made reasonable efforts to provide for myself and have brought up a family in decency and comfort;
- (m) that my husband wife father mother or children is or are unable to provide for or maintain me;
- (n) that I am unable to maintain myself;
- (o) that I have not at any time within twelve months been refused by a Commissioner a pension certificate except for the reason that I was disqualified on account of age or for reasons which are now non-existent;
- (p) that I have attained the age of sixty-five years or (as the case may be) I am permanently disabled or in permanent ill-health caused by having been engaged in mining or any unhealthy or hazardous occupation;
- (q) for the last twelve months I have resided at _____

- (s) my husband resides at _____
- (t) my father resides at _____
- (u) my mother resides at _____
- (v) my children over 21 years of age reside at _____
