WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.—CESSATION AND DETERMINATION OF THE HIGH COMMISSIONER'S JURISDICTION OVER CERTAIN ISLANDS AND PLACES.

THE following despatch from His Excellency the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.

By His Excellency the Honorable William Lamond Allardye,
His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.

WHEREAS by virtue and in exercise of the powers in His Majesty vested by the *Colonial Boundaries Act 1896*, His Most Gracious Majesty the King has been pleased at a Council held at the Court of St. James's on the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and one, to order as follows:—

"From and after a date to be appointed by the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand by proclamation under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, the boundaries of the Colony of New Zealand as defined in the Act of the Twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to alter the Boundaries of New Zealand" shall be extended so as to include all the islands and territories which now or may hereafter form part of His Majesty's Dominions situate within the following boundary line, viz:—

"A line commencing at a point at the intersection of the 23rd degree of south latitude, and the 156th degree of longitude west of Greenwich, and proceeding due north to the point of intersection of the 8th degree of south latitude and the 156th degree of longitude west of Greenwich, thence due west to the point of intersection of the 8th degree of south latitude and the 167th degree of longitude west of Greenwich, thence due south to the point of intersection of the 17th degree of south latitude and the 167th degree of longitude west of Greenwich, thence due west to the point of intersection of the 17th degree of south latitude and the 170th degree of longitude west of Greenwich, thence due south to the point of intersection of the 23rd degree of south latitude and the 170th degree of longitude west of Greenwich, and then due east to the starting-point at the intersection of the 23rd degree of south latitude and the 156th degree of longitude west of Greenwich."

And whereas by a proclamation dated at Auckland the tenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, the Governor of New Zealand as aforesaid did proclaim the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, to be the date on and after which the boundaries of the Colony of New Zealand shall be and shall be deemed to be extended as specified in His Majesty's Order in Council above.

Now, therefore, I, William Lamond Allardye, His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, do hereby notify, for the information of all whom it may concern, that on and after the date specified in the above proclamation,

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that is to say the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, the jurisdiction exercised by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, over the islands and places situate within the boundary line specified in His Majesty's Order in Council of the thirteenth of May, one thousand nine hundred and one, above, has ceased and determined.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS ABOLISHED.

IN pursuance of the provisions of clause 64 in Part II. of the Regulations made under Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and bearing date the 11th November, 1890, the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by Orders made on the 17th day of December, 1901, abolished the Quarantine Districts declared by Order in Council of the 21st October, 1901, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th October, 1901, and hereunder described, viz.:-

PORT PHILLIP HEADS.—ALTERATIONS TO POINT LONSDALE AND QUEENSCLIFF LIGHTS.

REFERRING to Notices to Mariners, Nos. 31 and 85, dated 1st February, 1900, and 21st May, 1901, respectively, it is hereby notified that a new light-house, 70 feet high, built of concrete and painted white, has been erected near the extremity of Point Lonsdale, at a distance of 530 feet from the old light-house, and in line with it and the signal flagstaff, and that on and after the 20th day of March, 1902, an occulting light of the third order, dioptric, having periods of twelve seconds light and three seconds eclipse, will be shown from the tower at an elevation of 120 feet above sea-level, and visible in clear weather from a ship's bridge at a distance of 17 nautical miles.

From seaward such light will show as follows:—

Red between the bearings of S. 78° E. and N. 61° E.
White between the bearings of N. 61° E. and N. 43° W.
Red between the bearings of N. 43° W. and S. 78° W.

The intensity of the white light will be 22, and the red light 13 light-house units.

Simultaneously with the exhibition of such occulting light the green and red light, at present shown from the old light-house, will be discontinued, also the western rays of white light from the Queenscliff Low and High lights showing to seaward over, and to the north-westward of Point Lonsdale will be so obscured that these lights will be only visible from seaward when bearing northward of N. 51° E. *Caution.*—The white light, illuminating an arc of 104° to seaward, will mark the safe navigable waters clear of Port Phillip Heads and enable mariners to pick up the entrance to Port Phillip. The red sectors of light, between the limits of the white light and the coast to eastward and westward of Port Phillip Heads, are intended to warn mariners of their proximity to the shore, and should such red lights be seen when navigating outside the Heads the vessel's course should be altered to seaward to get within the white arc of light.

DIRECTIONS FOR ENTERING PORT PHILLIP.

From westward by night.—Mariners making Port Phillip Heads from the westward should not lose sight of the fixed red light on Split Point, until they see the white occulting light on Point Lonsdale, which should in clear weather be picked up after proceeding 10 miles from Split Point light abeam. Soon after picking up Point Lonsdale white light, the white lights from the Queenscliff High and Low light-houses will respectively come into view, then steer to get into the red sector shown from the low light, which will be first seen on a bearing N. 39° E., then bring the low light (red) in line with the high light (white) bearing N. 34° E., keeping such leading lights on until the red sector of occulting light showing inside the Heads eastward from Point Lonsdale light-house has been passed. A course may then be shaped for the South or West Channel as desired. *From eastward by night.*—Vessels having passed Cape Schanck light about 3 miles off should pick up the white occulting light on Point Lonsdale which should be kept in sight until the leading lights at Queenscliff are brought in line, then steer through the entrance fairway as directed for vessels from westward.

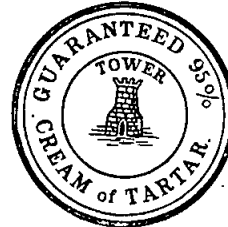

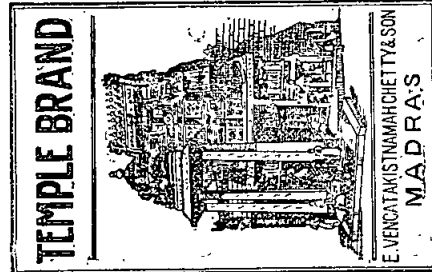

BY-LAW No. 8.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Towong, by virtue of the provision of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900* and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 8 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Towong.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the thirty first day of December, 1901, and on or before the first day of December in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely:—

A. If the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of cows so kept be—

1. Not more than five a fee of One shilling;
2. More than five a fee at the rate of Threepence for each cow, but the fee for any number shall not exceed Forty shillings;

B. If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

THE BET BET SHIRE COUNCIL AND THE BET BET SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1902. No. 12.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1892, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for 1902 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments, if not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Ten shillings for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

5. For all vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street wherein a main pipe of the Trust is laid, and of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be charged.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1902.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose-box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1902.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following regulations for the year 1902:—

The following are the charges which the owners and occupier of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the waterworks district, that is to say:—

1. In all cases where a meter has to be used the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons, except where otherwise provided.

2. For buildings in course of erection to which water is supplied the charge shall be One pound per centum on the amount of the contract for such building, excepting the iron and wood work.

3. That all stand-pipes used for the purpose of watering gardens and other purposes other than purely household purposes by ratepayers, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum per pipe. Provided that water for any garden exceeding the limits of 66 feet by 50 feet, or 3,300 square feet, must be supplied by meter, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and St. Augustine's Convent School, Wodonga.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway department, and supplied with water by the Trust, shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds ten shillings each per annum.

6. Rateable consumers may at their option be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through his meter, and each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, for all water used over and above that sum. Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at one shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

That the foregoing charges be due and payable half-yearly on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1902.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 10.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid, according to the municipal valuation of the property rated. Provided that in no case shall a rate of less than One pound be payable.

2. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate, within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

3. A minimum rate of Ten shillings, and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

4. On every horse trough a charge of One pound per annum.

5. Water supplied to the Government Departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

6. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity allowed by rate payable in respect of the property to which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.

7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on 1st day of January, 1902, and 1st day of July, 1902.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust this 18th day of November, 1901.

No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of the Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber, which at a height of three feet from the surface of the ground is of less diameter than fifteen inches, on or from the portion of Crown lands in the parish of Bullarto, lying between Leitches Creek and the Daylesford Railway and the road from Bullarto to Daylesford, on the west side of the said creek, and extending from the north-west boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 5 of section 8 to the south-east boundaries of allotment 9 of section 3 and allotment 33x.—(O.L.F. 29610.)

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

BOROUGH OF MARYBOROUGH.

BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the Borough of Maryborough, made under section 480 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 42 for the Regulation and Management of the Corporation Baths.

5. No person shall use obscene or profane language within the bath premises.

6. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the baths.

7. No person shall deface by writing or otherwise the walls or any portion of the baths.

8. No smoking shall be permitted on the platforms or in the sheds or dressing boxes.

9. No dogs shall be permitted on the premises.

10. All towels hired to be returned to the ticket taker.

11. No person allowed to remain in the water for a longer period than half-an-hour.

12. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding five pounds or less than five shillings.

All cattle driven from the city of Melbourne or the city of Collingwood, and which it is desired to drive through the city of Richmond into the city of Hawthorn, shall, in the case of sheep or swine, be driven after sunrise and before sunset, and all other cattle after Eleven p.m. and before sunrise, along the following route:—Hoddle, Elizabeth, Highett, Church, Burnley, and Swan streets.

5. Nothing herein contained shall be held to extend or apply to milch cows milked in the district or to oxen in yoke.
